Pr. Bryant will be hosting a Cottage Talk, on **Wednesday June 19th at 6pm** (at Joy) about "2020 Germany Trip". This is a (10-12 day) trip to visit historic Lutheran reformation sites, Veste Coburg, Dachau concentration camp, Neuschwanstein and Hohenschwangau castles, and the Oberamergau Passion Play. Reformation Sites include, Luther House (the Black Cloister), Wartburg Castle, Luther's Birth and Death homes, Worms, Augsburg and more.

Next year, we have a chance to make a pilgrimage together, traveling with members of another congregation to Germany. Pr. Jared Carson, one of my seminary mentors, a dear friend, invites us to join the good people of Peace Lutheran, Las Cruces, NM on a 10-day pilgrimage to visit important Reformation sites.

Pr. Jared says, "This study tour to Germany in June 2020...will include the Oberammergau Passion Play, which occurs every 10 years. Because of the popularity of the Oberammergau Passion Play, we are asking people to reserve their spot for the study tour now. The bulk of the tour will highlight Lutheran Reformation sites. 
What is our Fellowship Committee up to?

CAN YOU HEAR ME NOW?



Many components of our sound equipment are 25-30 years old. A couple of our members (on their own) have donated their time and monies to begin upgrading our outdated sound system. These members have purchased a new wireless microphone system and a new mixer. The wireless mic system now conforms to current FCC requirements. And, the new mixer has built-in capability to record the sermons, which in turn are put on our website. We believe these upgrades have made a positive difference in our audio. But more is required.

You have probably noticed that it depends upon where you sit in the sanctuary, as to how well you can hear the pastor and/or lector. Additional upgrades are definitely needed to gain better sound quality, better coverage and intelligibility in our santuary.

We have had a couple of sound experts take a look at our system, with proposals (paid for with donated monies). One individual we talked to, is an Audio-Visual Field Service Engineer at Universal Orlando Resort. He is involved with servicing audio/ visual equipment for the rides, and all of the audio/visual equipment in the resort. He also works as a contractor for Walt Disney World, and runs the sound for the Festival of the Lion King show at Animal Kingdom. Because of his expertise, we feel that his recommendations, to include new overhead speakers (*JBL CBT 70J-1 Line Array Column*) and a matching amplifier (*Crown XTi 2002 power amplifier*), will greatly improve our much-needed audio system upgrade.

Hymn Recommendations for an Evangelical Lutheran Worship Supplement

Welcome!

Thank you for your interest in submitting a Hymn Recommendation for a future Evangelical Lutheran Worship supplement.

In 2006, *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* was released for use in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada. Congregations are still mining the depths of its resources or perhaps discovering it for the first time. However, as church and society continue to encounter change, new needs and new opportunities arise. Renewal is ongoing for the life of the church and its worship.

New hymns and songs are one facet of such ongoing worship renewal. By using this online form to make a recommendation, you help the ELCA and Augsburg Fortress staff in their task of discovering hymns and songs published since 2005 (the year the ELCA hymn corpus was set) that would serve the wider church. Know that the staff has access to a long history of hymnals and resources published prior to 2005; we are not looking for recommendations from previous publications. We are seeking recommendations of hymns/songs written or composed since 2005 that not only have served a particular setting, but that would also be valuable to the wider church. These hymns/songs might be found in more recently published hymnals or collections, in online resources, or could be newly composed texts and tunes.

The scope of this project is limited; unlike developing a core resource, we will not be reviewing many thousands of hymns. Yet our hope is that through the wisdom shared here and in other ways, we will identify songs and hymns that will serve the church well in the coming years.
