Friends.

While away, I reconnected with an old friend. I shared how I had lived in the "828," yet for almost two years, have lived in the "321." She piped up by telling me how the "321" area code came into being, how back in the late 1990s the "407" area code was running out of numbers, how "321" was not in use anywhere else in the U.S., and how a man named Robert Osband suggested that it be used for Brevard County to honor the space program.

Osband's suggestion ultimately bore fruit, when Florida Governor Jeb Bush, on November 1, 1999, placed the first official call in the "321." He called from Florida Public Service Commission to Kennedy Space Center where Osband received the call. And, when new area code numbers were assigned, Osband's cell number 407-543-8633 became 321-435-8633, which spells 321-LIFTOFF!

I mention this story because this year marks the 50th anniversary of when astronauts lifted off to grant us Neil Armstrong's "small step" on the moon. But, even more, this marks the 50th anniversary of something faithfully amazing and equally amazingly faithful. The first meal to be eaten on the moon occurred on July 20,1969; that Meal was the Body and Blood of Jesus the Christ. Astronaut Buzz Aldrin broke bread and ate, poured wine into a small chalice and drank. The first meal on the moon, by a human, was the Meal of grace, mercy, love, and forgiveness. Buzz Aldrin celebrated Eucharist.

While coasting through space, it seems as though Buzz had his priorities straight. And, as we "Space Coasters" travel to far off places, albeit not so far as the moon, are our priorities with regard to the Lord's Supper at least as straight those of Buzz Aldrin? Do we make receiving the Meal a priority when we are away from the Table at JOY? And, if not, what's that about?

Martin Luther says, "It is our duty to let the benefit and fruit of the Lord's Supper become manifest, and we ought to show that we have received it with profit." Luther goes on to ask, "...where do you see fruit following from it?" Luther answers his own question, saying, "Now this is the fruit...to offer yourself with all your life, even as Christ did with all that he had...toward our neighbor." [paraphrased from Luther's sermon, Concerning Confession and the Lord's Supper

As you "LIFTOFF," from the Space Coast for Summer travels, make it your priority to be properly fueled to love your God by loving your neighbor. How? By eating the Lord's Supper while you are away. Eat the Meal to be forgiven. Eat the Meal to become the love that you yourself have received for the sake of your neighbor. Buzz Aldrin got this understanding right 50 years ago. While traveling about the cosmos this Summer, let's get our understanding right, too.

October 19th - October Fest


