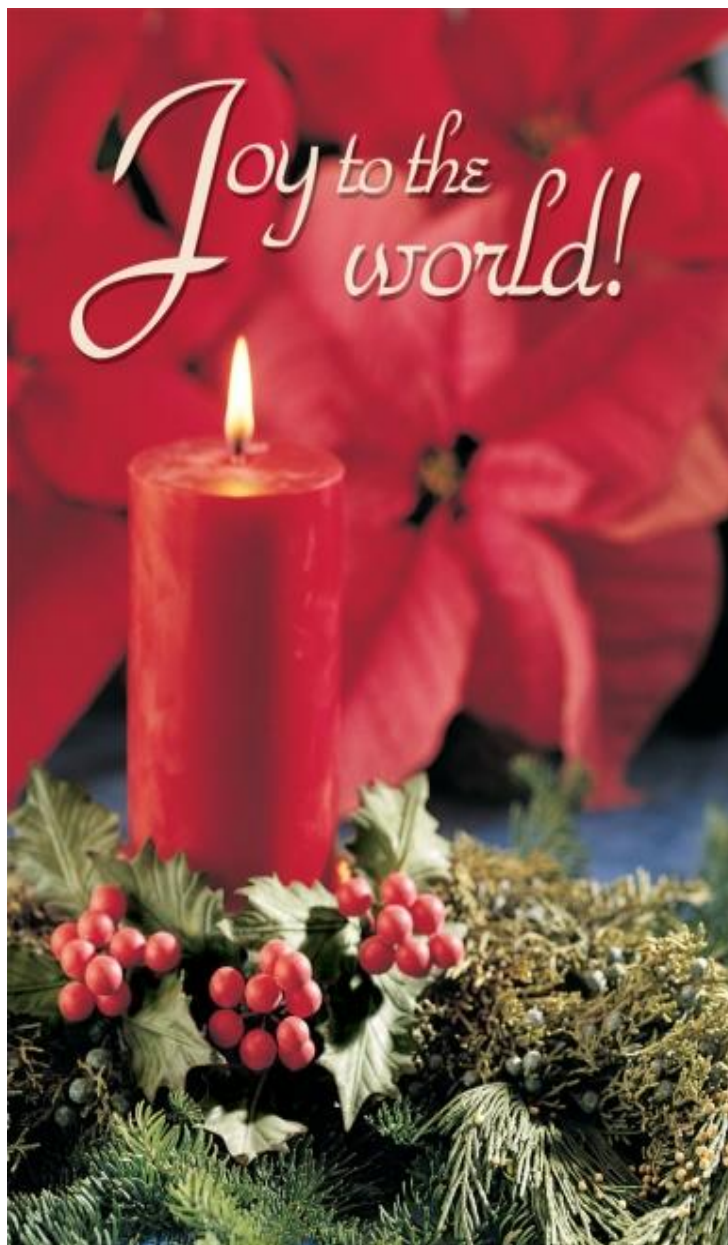

Dear Friends,

'Tis the season to be mindful. Holidays are something else. For some, it's like a Publix commercial with a perfectly cooked feast spreading in all directions. For some, it's like a piddling Charlie Brown Christmas tree. Occasionally, some are over-the-moon with joy. Occasionally, some are down-in-the dumps. Sometimes, we might prove to be a combination of all these scenarios and maybe even a few more.

My gift to you this Christmas is a recipe for meaningful holidays. It does not require you to stock a single grocery item. It does, however, require that you take stock of yourself.

Pr. Bryant's recipe for meaningful holidays is this:

1. Stay centered. Jesus is "the reason for the season." It's all about Jesus. You are not the hub around which everything revolves, not organizing, not gift wrapping, not tree trimming. Sure, those things are great, but are they central? Since everything centers on Jesus, make space for conversation, community, and memory-making. These will mean more in future days than the perfect picture of the tree taken before the cats discover it.
2. Set boundaries. It's wise to know when enough is enough. It's wise to know when to take a step back, to unplug, to unwind, to say "No." Studies show that it's even wise to unplug the bright lights 30 minutes before bedtime so that our minds settle.
3. Watch out for expectations. Often expectations, and particularly those around holidays, can prove themselves to be premeditated resentments. Each holiday is unique. No two are exactly alike. If we measure one holiday by another, our expectations can rob us of discovering new joys and encountering new blessings. We can unintentionally sabotage holidays for self and others by having expectations, especially if those expectations are not communicated, or if others are given no voice in their creation. Others are not responsible for our holiday happiness. We are responsible for making the most of our situation.
4. Limit social media consumption. Social Media is a good thing that can have a bad effect. It can inadvertently cause us to measure our life, our holiday, and our experience against that of others. It can make us focus on others in such a way that can result in us thinking poorly of ourselves. You have a life unique and specific to you. You also have holidays unique and specific to you. Just because Instagram shows some else having a holiday that seems good to them, it doesn't mean that your good holiday is the poorer for it.
5. Gift yourself. You are worth a gift fit for a king or queen. Give yourself the chocolate doughnut, the pedicure, the hockey tickets, the Disney+ channel, or whatever your heart desires that you can reasonably afford. Self-care is important. Celebrate the gift that is you. (my 2019 Christmas gift to self will be "cheese stars" ---holiday favorites of my childhood)

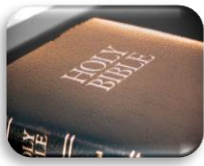
6. Decorate to suit yourself. Not up for a tree. Why not hang an ornament from the ceiling fan pull gussied up with some garland? Up for a tree? Go ahead and indulge yourself. Only want a poinsettia? Go for it. What brings us joy is not always what brings another joy.

7. Know your needs. If cooking is your thing, but you find yourself trapped in the kitchen with "that person," why not have your favorite holiday music playing in the background? Wouldn't it be better to focus on Bing Crosby's voice rather than the voice who keeps reminding you that you don't do like they do it over in Pensacola? And, never underestimate the power of aromas. Step into a room away from the bedlam, perhaps where a lavender candle is lit. Breathe. Rest. Enjoy a glass of sauvignon blanc or hot cuppa. As said to me by a friend, I say to you, "You do you, Boo." Get what you need in healthy ways and you lessen the likelihood of getting what you need in unhealthy ways.

8. And, if all else fails, refer back to number one. The point of Christmas, and holiday hullabaloo, isn't about pumpkin rolls, perfected sauces, or Gevalia Royal Vinter. It's about Jesus, without whom, the rest would prove meaningless.
