

Pastor's Corner

Pr. J. David Bryant

Friends,

The Lord be with you.

A faithful question for us to ask these days is, "Where is God in all this?" It truly is a faithful and fair question.

A faithful Lutheran answer might sound something like, "God's there in creation suffering with God's creatures." Indeed, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, In *Letters and Papers from Prison*, says,

"Man's religiosity makes him look in his distress to the power of God in the world; he uses God as a 'deus ex machina.' The Bible, however, directs us to the powerlessness and suffering of God; only a suffering God can help."

For those whose Latin is rusty, the Oxford Dictionary defines 'Deus Ex Machina' as, "an unexpected power or event saving a seemingly hopeless situation, especially as a contrived plot device in a play or novel."

For many, COVID-19 seems like a hopeless situation. Imagine what it looks like for a child to be back in an abusive home instead of a safe school. Imagine what it looks like for a person experiencing elder abuse because they are socially distanced from a more loving care provider. In both cases, the word 'hopeless' comes to mind.

Again, a faithful Lutheran response to seeming hopelessness is that, "God's there in creation suffering with God's creatures."

As we have been social distanced from one another, we have suffered. We miss one another. We miss our routines. We fret about whether we will see Winter Friends before they return home. We worry about who we may (or may not see) when this all ends. In short, we suffer. And, this is faithful. And, we do not suffer alone. God is with us. As we suffer, God suffers with us to make masks for seminarians, members, nonmembers and the Holmes Hospital staff.

As we suffer, God suffers with us to give online giving a go, not for ourselves alone but for others.

As we suffer, God suffers with us so that we stay at home so that others (and we ourselves) might be healthy and safe.

As we suffer, God suffers with us to host a blood drive so that others might have a chance at life, abundant life.

As we suffer, God empowers us to suffer with the world God deeply loves by suffering ourselves to step out of comfort zones by providing ways to worship and remain connected.

Suffering is not pleasant, nor is it something we choose. Suffering sometimes seems to choose us. Still, Martin Luther says, "Christian suffering is nobler and precious above all other human suffering because, since Christ himself suffered, he also hallowed the suffering of all his Christians." *

Have you ever considered that your suffering has been made noble, precious, and holy by Jesus? And, it is through your holy suffering that God's grace is revealed to others?

So, where is God amidst our coronavirus suffering? "God's there in creation suffering with God's creatures." God is with us.

NEEDED FACE MASKS FOR HOLMES REGIONAL HOSPITAL




