

Pastor's Corner

Pr. J. David Bryant

Friends,

The Lord be with you.

For months now, we've been processing a collective trauma: coronavirus and the changes it has created. This means that we grieve. And, when we grieve, we discover how part of our grief is anger. Anger is neither good nor bad. It is just an emotion. And, like every emotion, if properly managed, it comes to good ends. Yet, if improperly managed, it goes to bad ends.

The Epistle of James tell us:

"You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger; for your anger does not produce God's righteousness." (James 1:19-20)

Note the emphasis in the verses that suggests how anger and speech are to be managed by taking it "slow." Also, note how taking it "slow" comes with an encouragement to "be quick to listen." Maybe taking the time to do faithful listening is the path that makes us "slow to anger" and "slow to speak."

A few days ago, I found myself feeling edgy and angry. Grief had tried its best to seize me through anger associated with the loss of time spent time with friends. Many months ago, childhood friends had planned for our families to meet in Atlanta/Orlando to attend a Def Leppard concert. I was so excited to reconnect, to meet spouses, and to headbang to heavy metal tunes in a civic center. Of course, that was all before coronavirus became the supreme killjoy.

Can't you relate to what I am sharing here? Haven't we missed time spent with friends? Haven't we missed "Young at Heart?" What about missing our WELCA "Pancake Breakfasts?" And, then there is the obvious one, together we miss "Sunday Worship" and "Rockin' Praise."

We feel a range of emotions surrounding such loss. Sometimes I have felt sad, at other times, "blah," and, on occasion, angry. How about you? What emotions are you feeling? Know that whatever you feel is neither good nor bad yet realize that how your emotions are managed is an altogether different matter.

In these grieving days, let's "be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger; for your anger does not produce God's righteousness." This listening-and-taking-it-slow way is our way. We know this to be true. Now, that we are reminded of it, let's redouble our efforts to live it.

Even in the face of loss, we are to live it, for it is who we are called to be. And, even if we fail to live into it perfectly, we still aspire to mature into its fullness. I say this with a heart that is now both sad and glad from the reality that again we are postponing the resumption of in-person gathering for worship. I am glad that this increases our chance of not becoming a vector for COVID-19, yet sad that our time spent with one another is the price we are required to pay.

Until further notice, church council has voted that the in-person gathering suspension of services is extended until September 6th, and this is subject to change if conditions become favorable for us to gather earlier. Please receive this with an attitude of loving patience. Be a listener, rather than a hothead. Yet, if you do become a hothead, manage it well by taking it slow. I realize that this news is a killjoy.

We will get together again, just not yet. Until that time, know that God loves you. You are not alone. And, if you should find yourself feeling isolated, reach out. JOY is a loving family and we will find a way to be physically distanced yet socially close.

Joy Reopening Task Force

During this pandemic, love of neighbor requires careful planning. Because we love God, we want to offer worship that brings our very best. Because we love our neighbors, we want to do everything we can to make sure we bring no harm to anyone when we gather.

During pandemic, gathering requires a delicate balance as we Christians weigh our need for being together as people of all ages, infant through older adult. Alongside our commitments not to harm our neighbors through accidental spread of disease. We affirm that Christians may find different faithful solutions to this dilemma so long as we do not endanger ourselves or others. (Resuming Care-Filled Worship and Sacramental Life During A Pandemic, The ecumenical Consultation for Protocols for Worship, Fellowship, and Sacraments)

The Task Force has researched and reviewed best practices, guidelines from the CDC, State of Florida Department of Health, ELCA, Florida-Bahamas Synod, local Brevard County officials, local and regional church leaders. We have also had the opportunity to hear from local chaplains working in the area hospitals who are administering to those who are hospitalized and currently struggling with Covid-19.

The parting comment from a local chaplain to our committee was; "I would hope not to see a member of JOY congregation in the hospital they are serving with Covid-19".

At this point in time, all indications are that we have not reached a point for safe return to in person services and the Task Force has recommended to the Church Council that the tentative opening date of August 2nd. be moved to a **tentative date of September 6th**. All activities on JOY property to remain closed until the opening date.

The task Force has set the next meeting date as August 20th, but the Committee will continue to monitor the situation and as new information and guidelines become available, the Committee will adjust the date as situation warrants.

Suggested Face Mask Usage

Soon we will begin to worship in person and using face masks. Here is some information on the proper use and reuse of face masks. The following is from an Infection Control RN from Sarasota Florida, and the Infection control RN for RAMC. Both following CDC guidelines.

Face masks are only effective for protection if they are handled, worn, stored and disposed of properly. Used improperly, and the masks actually become vehicles for spreading germs.

Face Mask Do's & Don'ts

- Before and after handling the mask (to put it on, adjust or take it off), do practice proper hand hygiene.
 Either wash your hands or use hand sanitizer before and after you touch the mask EVERY TIME
 to reduce cross-contamination risk. The outside of the mask is considered dirty.
- Do mark the outside of the mask in some way so you can easily identify which side is the outside of the mask, and handle it accordingly. You can use permanent ink
- Do keep a paper bag handy for storing the mask every time you take it off; a plastic Ziploc-style baggie is an alternative if a paper bag is not available. Always store a mask in a clean place. Never store it in a purse or pocket.
- Do not touch the outside of your mask while it is on your face. Do not pull your mask below your chin while you're wearing it. Leaving the mask dangling or improperly fitted to your face creates opportunities for cross-contamination.

Mask Use & Re-use How-to

- Clean your hands using proper hand hygiene.
- Loop elastic over your ears. Pull it down so that it's covering under your chin; secure it to your face by pinching over your nose. Be sure it's on nice and secure. It must cover your nose and mouth.
- Before removing the mask, clean your hands.
- Remove the mask using the ear loops.
- Inspect it to be sure it can be reused. Has it been compromised? Is it wet? Visibly soiled? If it is, go ahead and throw it away, then perform hand hygiene. If the mask is OK to reuse, prepare it for storage. (Next step.)
- Fold the mask in half (lengthwise or widthwise), so the outside surfaces are touching each other. Place it carefully into your clean storage area/bag. Seal the bag, if you're using a paper one; if using a plastic baggie, leave it open.

Face Mask Rotation and Storage for (surgical masks and N-95)

- Get 5 masks and 5 paper bags
- Label each bag with consecutive numbers 1,2,3,4 and 5.
- Label the mask(s) and paper bags with the user's name.
- Depending on the type of surgical mask, the front side can be folded together before storing.
- Store the mask(s) in a breathable container, such as a paper bag, in a dry location.
- The surgical masks (N-95) should be rotated daily, for example using mask 1 on Monday, 2 on Tuesday and so on, returning to mask #1 on day 6. This can be done for one month, 4 rotations, and then discard masks and bags.
- If the mask is wet or soiled, then throw it away. If you are using cloth masks, follow the same steps for putting on and taking off but wash them at the end of the day.

The Parish Nurses

The Gather Bible Study for July was the second in a series of "Just Love" as in love with justice. The text is Luke 19:1-10 about Zacchaeus. First Zacchaeus is trying to see who Jesus is; and then Jesus invites himself to this tax collector's house. We too are trying to see Jesus and He does invite himself to our house and hearts. Others say Zacchaeus is a sinner and so are we. Zacchaeus then moves to restorative justice; giving to the poor, paying back anyone he defrauded four times as much. We too are called to restorative justice even if it is not personal injustice but societal injustice. With the call to "Black Lives Matter" what can we do. Do not feel justified because we are an integrated congregation. Where are the poor and black, brown, immigrants, the unemployed in our community? They are our neighbors. They are across the street with children in Turner Elementary. We can give to the Joy School Supplies. We can give to the Joy Back Pack program. Other activities may be supporting Daily Bread, the Sharing Center.

Property Committee

The Property Committee is in the process of completing the clearing of the brush. As the brush has been cleared, the mowing crew has been able to mow the grass around the palms and pines at the West and North end of the property.

New spotlight has been installed at the base of the flag pole replacing the original light at the top of the flag pole which was destroyed by high winds.

The aging locks and door knobs around the building are starting wear out and it is time to start replacing the exterior door locks as well as rekeying the locks. This will be completed in the next several weeks.

The IT Committee has suggested that a whole building surge protector be considered to safeguard against damage to electrical and electronic equipment from voltage spikes. The Property Committee is exploring the cost and feasibility of installing a unit in the building. The Property Committee is in the process of exploring suitable solutions.
