

Pastor's Corner

Friends in Christ---

I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you...for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline. (2 Tim. 1:6-7)

Although still very tentative, we have a rather firm date for us to return to in-person gathering--September 13th. Our target date was September 6th, it has shifted to September 13th to allow for a deep cleaning of the building.

Keep in mind, that our bishop strongly advises that we not resume in-person gathering for worship, etc., until Florida enters Phase 3 of reopening. We are still in Phase 2. Our reopening for in-person worship might feel as a blessing to some, yet not for others. Our members have strong feelings and opinions regarding our resumption of in-person gatherings. We are not of one mind on the matter; not in the same emotional or ideological space. To this end---as we resume in-person gathering, let our rubric be, "All are invited, none are compelled." Let us also adopt this rubric, "Just because I am doing this thing, others are not required to do this thing."

Our Reopening JOY Task Force has been working to resolve several challenges that come our way for inperson gathering. For example, "how to welcome visitors?" For another example, "Should masks be mandatory?" And, as a last example, "To what degree is JOY liable if people ignore wisdom and start hugging, touching, etc.?" These questions are key. And, these questions, among so very many others, have taken the Task Force tremendous time and care to manage.

As we resume in-person gathering, and as groups and organizations of the congregation begin to gather inperson again, these must be responsible to sanitize and clean their areas before and after use. We must exercise self-discipline. We must endure the suffering of social distancing, of not touching, hugging, etc. We must endure the suffering of doing extra prep beforehand and taking extra care to clean and sanitize afterwards. This reality applies to 100% of us. As we discipline ourselves to do these things, barring a coronavirus outbreak in the congregation, we will continue in-person gathering. If we fail to do such things, again we will have to suspend in-person gathering until such at time as we discipline ourselves to sanitize and clean before and after our particular functions.

In 2nd Timothy chapter 4, we are strongly advised, "...always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully." That Greek word for *sober* is about being clear-headed. We are in a time when being "clear-headed" is a must.

Empowered by a spirit of love, let's be clear-headed, work as a team, follow guidelines, and observe sound advisory opinions. This is how we will resume in-person gathering to "carry out our ministry fully." Or, as a popular saying now has it, "This is how we have nice things."



JOY Reopening Task Force Report August 20th, 2020 Meeting

The task Force held a meeting on Thursday August 20th, to review the plans to open JOY for in-person services and to start the process of allowing committees, programs and events to resume meeting in JOY facility.

It was decided that a survey with a poll be taken of the members to gauge the willingness of members to start in-person activities. A number of groups and committees had expressed interest in seeing if this could be accomplished around the time of the latest proposed opening.

The survey was conducted through the One Call System used to deliver JOY Church related news items and announcements. The survey asked if members were willing to attend and support in-person services and meetings in the facility. The survey was conducted on Friday with phone message sent out starting at 3:00 PM. The message included a yes/no polling question to be answered by the phone touch pad.

The following results were obtained from the survey:

Total calls delivered 96
Total households responding 40
Total households not responding 52
Total households responding Very 28

Total households responding **Yes** 28 representing 70% Total households responding **No** 11 representing 27.5% Total incorrect responses 1 representing 2.5%

*The total not responding represents households who did not vote yes or no and households who did not answer the call and the call went to voice mail (there was an 800 number in the message for additional opportunity to respond to the poll)
