

Friends---

Fall is upon us, bringing holidays that highlight thanksgiving and generosity. Is there ever a better time to ponder our *Stewardship*? Is there ever a better time to take stock of the treasure that God entrusts to us?

"Guard, through the Holy Spirit who dwells in us, the treasure which has been entrusted to you." 2 Timothy 1:14

While Halloween invites us to freely give treats to others, Thanksgiving invites us to freely give thanks for our God, our neighbors, our families, and ourselves. We give thanks for these blessings. And, we give thanks for how God allows us to use all that is entrusted to us for God's purpose.

Truly, we are blessed both to give and receive. JOY's faithfully tithing members enable us to feed the hungry, assist the grieving, and assist others in times of critical need.

Years ago, CBS Commentator, Charles Osgood, reported how, Mrs. Bertha Adams, 71 years old, died alone in West Palm Beach on Easter Sunday. The coroner's report read: "Cause of death... malnutrition." She had wasted away to fifty pounds.

When authorities made their preliminary investigation of Mrs. Adams' home, they found a "pigpen... the biggest mess you can imagine." The woman had begged neighbors for food and had gotten clothing she had from the Salvation Army. She appeared penniless. But this wasn't so.

In the "pigpen," officials found two safety deposit box keys. In the first box was over 700 AT&T stock certificates, plus other valuable certificates, and cash amounting nearly \$200,000. In the second was \$600,000. Bertha's net worth was over a million dollars.

Osgood reported how the estate would pass to a distant niece and nephew, neither of whom knew their aunt had one red cent.

Astonishing? Absolutely. Why would anyone deprive themselves of food or the chance to help others? Only God knows for certain, but I suspect that Bertha was worshipping stuff rather than saving stuff. Sure, it is wise to save, but being God's Stewards means that we'll never be called to take what is entrusted to us and to use it to become God's Misers. We are not to live as Bertha lived.

And, thankfully enough, it doesn't appear that we are doing so. Thank you so much for faithfully tithing during fiscal year 2020, especially given this terribly rough year. Thank you for having grateful hearts; generous, visionary, faithful hearts.

Through your tremendous faithfulness, God is "Transforming Lives."
