

Because it stays green all through the year, the evergreen tree is symbolic of the eternal life offered to Christians through faith in Christ.


The treetop points up to heaven.

#### Pastor's Corner

Pr. J. David Bryant

A bishop visited a church in his synod. Only three people turned up to hear him preach. Concerned and surprised, maybe even a little hurt, the bishop asked the pastor "Did you give notice of my visit?" "No," replied the pastor, "but word seems to have got round anyway."

This joke is my playful way of letting you know that I am taking vacation 12/26 - 1/9. Emergency on-call coverage is provided by the Reverend's Turner of Blessed Redeemer Episcopal. Pastor Jennifer Shimota will be providing sermons for you that will be played on Sundays. Everything will be fine. As you suspect, I am heading home to Georgia to see Mom. It's been seven months since we've seen each other face-to-face, so now's the time to remedy that situation.

As you know, nights are longer and a crushing, pervasive loneliness inhabits our space. It is the result of our long season of social distancing and sheltering in place. One friend recently shared how once we have a Covid-19 vaccine in place, and once he has taken it, he may just wake up one morning and drive West from North Carolina until he hits the Pacific Ocean. Can't we relate to how he feels?

The loneliness that pervades cannot be fixed, only managed. We manage it much like one manages a sailboat: one cannot control winds, but one can certainly trim sails. Soon holidays will be upon us, holidays never experienced under a pandemic. The pandemic conditions are our winds, making our question a matter of how we trim our sails to keep moving forward.

One effective way to trim our sails is to be socially close to others while being physically distanced for them: phone calls, video calls, watch parties, etc.

Another effective way to trim our sails is to be intentional about where we let our minds focus. Dwelling on the negative can cause us to dwell negatively. Dwelling on the positive can cause us to dwell positively. When we dwell on the negative and cannot get our minds to focus on anything positive, this is a faithful warning sign that our mental health is in jeopardy. It's a faithful warning sign that it's time to reach out to a Stephen Minister, to Lutheran Counseling Services, or to a local mental health provider. Let these resources help us to discover ways to trim our sails.

A final way to trim our sails is to be intentional about reserving judgment. How others manage holidays is up to them. How you manage holidays is up to you. Your good thing may not look like another's good thing, and this is totally fine. Remember, you are to be your own source of happiness, not any other. There is something to be said for being the faithful author of our own program of self-care. Care for yourselves well, for you are precious. Make your space a judgment-free zone.

After Christmas Eve worship, I'll not likely see you until January 10<sup>th</sup> when I am again with you on Sunday. Take care of yourselves. Keep avoiding crowds. Keep using lots of soap. And, don't let loneliness and isolation cause you to forget how Jesus is with you night and day. Together, "you and Jesus are an overwhelming majority." We will make it through these pandemic days because Jesus is with us every step of the way.

# **Property Committee**

The past seven months have seen the Property Committee work on cleaning the West End of the property of brush and some dead pine and palm trees. The dedicated crew who made all this work possible are to be commended and recognized for their outstanding work and effort. The work resulted in trailer loads of yard waste to be removed and hauled away. Considerable amount of the work involved heavy lifting, raking and cutting trees and tree branches with chain saws.

Now that the work is finished, the area can be kept under control and the lawn can be maintained and the mowers will be able take care of the grass cutting. This excellent work was completed by a dedicated crew of the Property Committee consisting of Ken Laumer, Harold Lengel, Gary Sherman and Gary Krause.

The next major undertaking by the property Committee will involve the repair of the numerous broken areas in the parking lot. Starting by repairing the broken areas around the edges of the parking lot and continuing to tackle the larger broken areas in the center of the parking lot. This will make the parking area safer for our members to navigate and walk and prevent members and visitors from falling and injuring themselves.

The New Year starting in 2021 will bring additional projects to the property committee plate;

- The committee is exploring the feasibility of replacing the current wooden front doors with an aluminum and glass doors.
- The current key entry system to be replaced with a keyless card system. This will allow us to reduce the cost of controlling keys as members and the church needs for permitted access evolves over time.
- Repainting of the Sanctuary is also on the schedule for the coming year.

#### **Audit Committee**

The Charter of the Audit Committee as stated in Constitutional Provisions of the Constitution; C13.03. An Committee of three voting members shall be elected by the Congregation Council. Audit Committee members not be members of the Congregation Council. The Bylaws 13.03.01 further state duties of the Audit Comm The Audit Committee shall audit the books of the treasurer of this congregation and its organizations maintafinancial accounts, the financial records of the Financial Secretary and submit reports for inclusion in the a report.

#### 2019 Audit Committee report,

In our opinion, the financial statements and reports provided by the Church Council and all appropriate Committees present fairly and, in all material, respects the financial position of JOY Lutheran Church of Palm Bay Florida at December 31, 2019.

There were no errors or issues in any of the accounts as presented to the Audit Committee for review and audit by the committee.

The 2019 Audit Committee made the following recommendations to the Church Council:

- The WELCA, Memorial Fund and Men of JOY check registers to be completed on a computer as opposed to hand written format.
- The memorial Fund and Men of JOY accounts transferred to TD Bank for consistency.
- Committee having completed the 2019 Audit presents.
- Copy of the Men of JOY Group, Memorial Fund and WELCA check registers sent to the JOY treasurer monthly.
- The JOY Lutheran Church Treasurer to be a signer on all bank accounts operating under the JOY EIN Number.
- Require each account to have two authorized signature on each check to protect JOY and each of the
  individual officers. (Council recommended to have only checks in excess of \$5,000.00 require two
  signatures)
- All unbudgeted expenditures of money require a formal motion with a second and vote approving
  the action, properly recorded in the minutes by the Recording Secretary or respective secretary of
  the committee/group secretary.
- All personnel files including tax related files, performance reviews of both current and former employees to be filed in a secure location.
- All minutes of committees and groups to be filed in the office in separate committee meeting files, or with the council minutes.
- Council to develop, review and approve annually all financial policies and procedures.
- Council to develop requirements and instructions for marking, recording and inventorying JOY physical property.

The council has approved the Audit Committee recommendations and has proceeded to implement these items.

The fiscal year 2020 audit is currently underway and will be part of the 2020 Annual Report to the Congregation.
