

Pastor's Corner Pr. J. David Bryant

Dear Friends---

Here we are in Christmastide, the season when we ask ourselves questions like, "how long does the Chrismon tree remain in the sanctuary?" It is a season of questions. Many of which get answered in a word, "Epiphany!"

Epiphany has an explosive start (Bethlehem's Star) and an equally explosive ending (Transfiguration's Star). The last Sunday of Epiphany explodes in starry, shining Transfiguration. Still, as beautiful as these stars seem, stars fade. Bright miracles and bright festivities give way to the unremarkable as everyday life resumes. This resumption of the ordinary creates questions like, "Is God no longer present?" The answer is, "Epiphany!" Epiphany is a vision or experience of God. Epiphany declares what we cannot fully perceive; how we are called to follow Jesus on the mountaintops and in the valleys.

Sometimes we do not perceive starry light, yet God is no less present to us. Genesis 28:16 which has Jacob blurting out "surely God is in this place and I did not know it." Isn't this how it often goes with us?

This is a Truth of Epiphany: God is in our space, yet we do not perceive the Presence. Sometimes we focus on ourselves, our sin, or our inadequacy, and this causes us to completely miss Epiphany. That missed Epiphany is God's presence. Sometimes we miss it because of our wrong focus, other times we miss it because we see Epiphany and do not like what we see. Epiphany is not necessarily a thing that we will like, follow, or even grasp. Jacob's Epiphany desire is to, "… come again to my father's house in peace." Yet this Epiphany doesn't inspire Jacob to reconcile with the brother and father that he's fleeced. Almost two decades later, Jacob finally follows where Epiphany light leads.

Epiphany is great, but following Epiphany is another matter entirely. Magi rejoice and follow Bethlehem's star. Disciples leave the mountain and follow Jesus into the valley. The Christian life is one of Epiphany and of following. God is surely here. Emmanuel is with us in this place. Our challenge is to have a right focus, so that we perceive and experience Epiphany; to become excited, to embrace it, then to follow it. Of course, we do have other options. Herod and his scribes hear the Epiphany report of the Magi, yet none of them opts to follow. People around Judaea and Galilee experience Epiphany miracles again and again, yet refuse to like, follow, or even grasp them. Light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it (John 1:5), still, many shake off the Christmas story along with bright Epiphany, clearly preferring other stars. Christmas and Epiphany stars are leading stars. They are challenging stars, because as soon as we spot them, they call us to follow. Then, the give us two questions to ponder, "Am I willing to follow where Epiphany light shines, and, will I still follow after star lights fade?

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

As we prepare to close 2020 it is only fitting that we look back to see the kind of year 2020 has been for JOY Property Committee. The COVID-19 Pandemic caused committee to stop the Friday coffee and pie fellowship break during the Property work day. The in-person meetings were suspended until late fall when the decision was made to allow for groups and committees to meet following all safety protocols, but without coffee and pie). The following projects simply highlight some of the work performed by the committee.

The major effort in the first three quarters of the year was spent on clearing and cleaning the West end of the property of Palmetto Palms, underbrush and some pines.

A FEMA Grant application for purchasing and installing security cameras around the exterior perimeter of the building was filed in late March early April. As of the end of November we have not been informed of having won a grant and since most of the awards have been made at this point, it appears that we were not successful in our effort.

Gary Krause replace the old pole lights around the building with new pole-lights and more efficient LED lightbulbs.

Gary also replaced all the fluorescent tube lights in the church offices, kitchen, meeting and classroom were changed to more energy efficient LED lights saving us money on our electric bill.

Gary Sherman and Ken Laumer have diligently worked around the church power washing the concrete parking lot and walkways.

Jim Collins has been busy repairing all imperfections in the interior walls of the church in preparation for next years projected painting of the interior walls of the Sanctuary

A secure mail box was installed on the secretary's door to allow members to drop off contributions safely and securely.

Warren and Karen have continued to keep the shrubbery around the buildings trimmed and looking professional.

Some of the original door locks started to show their age and were repaired and replaced as needed and the front doors are slated to be replaced with new aluminum and glass doors.

The edges of the parking lot with cracks and broken areas were repaired and plans go forward to contract repair to the larger areas in the center of the parking lot in the New Year.

On April 27th. 2020 the Church Council established a temporary Reopening task Force for the purpose of developing plans and procedures allowing for JOY to resume in person services. Meeting on weekly basis with few exceptions form May 2020 until the opening of the church for in person services in September 2020. The committee continues to meet as needed reviewing current plans and any changes to be made based on latest recommendations from CDC, state and local officials as well as the Synod. The committee will continue to monitor our progress in 2021 with the hope that the need for the work of the committee will become to end and the committee can be disbanded.
