## Pastor's Corner

Friends---

The Lord be with you.

We enter Lent on February 17<sup>th</sup>. And, within that season, we take stock of what our Lord requires of us and how we live (and do not live) into those requirements. Consider God's words to Ancient Israel through Prophet Micah:

"He had told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"  
---Micah 6:8

Prophet Micah asks, "what does God require of us?" Amidst Ancient Israel's challenges, with so many voices clamoring for attention, with traditional structures previously deemed secure shaking, it was easy to lose sight of God's requirements as people perceived themselves to be awash in personal agendas, dishonesty, corruption, and injustice. In a nation where both the leaders and the people had gone so far afield that they were completely lost, Micah raises the God requirement question.

Given the intended audience of Micah's question, they'd probably answer: properly prepared sacrifices, dutiful worship attendance, at least the bare minimum offering, and to never use God's Name in vain.

However, Micah answers not from a human perspective, but from God's perspective. And the answer challenges us to ask, "am I really living into that?"

Amidst post-election pandemic challenges, with so many voices clamoring for our attention, with traditional structures previously deemed secure shaking, isn't it easy to lose sight of God's requirements? To this end, please allow me to remind us that God doesn't require what we have come to expect. God does not require us to show up for worship in fancy clothes, knowing all books of the Bible in alphabetical order, and having all dogma and doctrine perfectly worked out. God has never required such things. To the contrary, God has perennially required that we do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God. These are requisite actions for living lives of faith.

Too often we reduce faith into perfected beliefs and into how precisely we can articulate those beliefs. Yet, Micah calls us to see faith as something more, as what we do. How does relationship with God change how we live our lives, change what we do? It's a faithful question.

Jesus summarizes the life of faith as totally loving God and totally loving our neighbor as ourselves.


Faith is no feeling, no perfected collection of dogmatics; it's a verb. It is how we live lives with a love that humbly walks with God, seeking justice, and extending kindness to all. This is God's requirement.

Micah isn't seeking to disparage us; Micah realizes how we miss the mark. None are perfect. We all struggle to live into this. Still, we are called to aspire. God's grace empowers us to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with God. It's a daily practice, not a daily perfection.

How about let's make it our daily practice, not just for Lent, but for all that days to come.

As the New Year gets under way, we continue to keep after the property by clearing out brush and some tree stumps of old palm and pine trees that have been removed earlier in 2020.

The light at the top of the portico directed to the front of the church and the cross was finally replaced by Ken Laumer and Gary Krause. The new light is a welcomed addition to the overall lighting scheme around the church.

Some additional lights and spot lights around the perimeter of the building as well as, around the Memorial garden will receive some much-needed attention this coming year.

We will also have the broken areas in the center of the parking lot repaired. This work will be completed by outside contractors as the work is beyond the members of the JOY Property Committee.

We are still waiting for bids on the plan to replace the exterior front doors at the portico.

The interior walls of the sanctuary are tentatively scheduled to be painted starting on April 9<sup>th</sup>. 2021

The parking lot is on track to be power washed later in the year.

## Audit Committee

The 2020 audit has been completed and the report will be included in the JOY 2020 Annual Report.

Following the Annual Meeting, the committee will continue to meet on a quarterly basis. This will allow us to complete the audit in a timely fashion.

In 2021, we will conduct and prepare an inventory of JOY tangible property with an inventory record at the office as well as off site.

The Audit Committee is also recommending to the Church Council to have the building appraised professionally. This will allow us to see that the insured value of our building reflects the accurate cost and that we are not under valuing or over valuing our building on our insurance policy.

We are also recommending that our property and liability insurance policies are once more placed on bids to ensure that we are properly insured at competitive pricing.
