Pastor's Corner

Pr. J. David Bryant

Friends,

The Lord be with you.

As we navigate Lent, allow me to remind us that, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in time of trouble. Therefore, we will not fear." (Psalm 46:1-2)

The continuing situation with coronavirus and its resulting perpetual flow of negative news saturates us, causes anxiety and worry for our future, our well-being, and our mental health. During this intensely challenging time, we must remember God's promise to be with us. God made us. God gave God's Son to save us. God will not abandon us to the pandemic.

God is with us. God inhabits the praises of God's people. God meets us in our prayers. We are not a people who, in trying times, despairingly saying to one another, "Well, I guess all we can do is pray." Prayer is not our last resort!

Prayer is living into the lovingly faithful promise from our Lord that we are heard by God. We pray for all suffering from coronavirus, for front-liners, for caregivers, for vaccine seekers, for the hopeful and the frustrated, for the worried and the anxious, and for all people everywhere each according to their needs. The James Epistle says, "You don't have because you do not ask, and if you do ask, then you ask with wrong motives." (Pastor Bryant paraphrase of James 4:2b-3) Prayer is powerful and effective, especially when God's people make it a regular practice. (Maybe a regular daily Lenten practice?)

We JOY Lutheran folks know how, in response to God's love shone so liberally in Jesus, God calls us to serve our neighbor. God works through us to meet needs. To this end, amidst abounding needs, pray that God will show and empower us to be blessings to others, to "put a rainbow in someone else's cloud."

God calls us to put rainbows in the clouds of congregation members, particularly isolated members, to put rainbows in the clouds of congregational leaders and church staff. One incredibly faithful way to do this is to continue to make sound decisions to support the health of one another through sanitizing spaces, washing hands, wearing masks, and following guidelines. This is a reasonable way to keep our missional community healthy so that we are better enabled to serve others, and be rainbow makers.

We do not exist in a vacuum. Actions taken and decisions made in one place often rapidly impact others in other places. JOY's continued caring response to this pandemic must intentionally look to the impact had on others. We serve our neighbors by seeking ways to minimize the impact of coronavirus.

As it becomes both easy and desirable to slip back into comfortable patterns, we must ask ourselves two questions: "How is God calling me to serve?" and, "What is the potential impact on others?" These are core questions that inform our mission.

Needs abound. Prior to this outbreak, loneliness and isolation were already problems. Social distancing has compounded these problems. How might God invite us to remind neighbors inside and outside of the congregation that they are not alone?

Is God calling you to listen to others? To speak a soothing word? To help provide for those who lack? To share your blessings in such a way that an unmistakable rainbow becomes visible in another's cloud? A phone call is a rainbow in an isolated person's cloud. A written letter in your neighbor's mailbox is a rainbow in your neighbor's cloud. In times of social distancing, we can safely reach out in love and grace to hang rainbows in cloud after cloud. God calls God's people to be a blessing and, most importantly, to provide hope to those in fear. And, if it stretches us, moves us out of comfort zones to do so, then we've truly started to understand Lent.

Inconveniences, challenges, and frustrations are hallmarks of Lent, and are realities of the pandemic. May God empower us to see that these are opportunities for rainbow making rather than opportunities to grouse. We are in a time when clouds are many and rainbows are few. Every one of us is a rainbow maker, for God is at work in each of us. God is our refuge and strength, our very present help in time of trouble. Therefore, we will not fear---we will put a rainbow in someone else's cloud.





Some of the items discussed were:

1. Replacing the film on the windows above the altar.

2. The Property Committee will begin painting the interior of the Church after the Lenten Season. They will continue to patch and sand the walls. The estimated cost of the paint is approximately \$650.00

3. The Property Committee is still waiting for bids for replacing the front doors.


4. The Council discussed reinstating the Financial Committee. The discussion will be continued at the next Council meeting.

One company gave us a quote of \$1,100.00. This item will be readdressed at our next meeting.

It is a new year and the Property Committee has started the ground running. The first few weeks of 2021 has seen the men tackle the grounds more with clearing brush, removing tree stumps and cutting down a tree or two.

Once the answer comes to the member, the next question to be answered where is the location of the job.

Some of us older members are grateful for the younger members who keep us grounded and on track. We would like to see members who are able and willing to climb ladders to join our group as some of the older crew have lost their privileges to climb ladders.
