Friends,

We are together as pastor and people for almost four years now, which is to say, "Pr. Bryant is due for a sabbatical." The ELCA and the Florida-Bahamas Synod encourage sabbaticals for rostered leaders every three to four ministry years. Pr. Bryant's sabbatical is one month long. It was penciled in for October 2022 yet will likely occur in July 2022.

A sabbatical, from the Hebrew for to rest/to cease, is no vacation; it's time to reconnect with life's most important parts, such as sense of call. It is stepping away from professional religious life to spend time focusing on a pastor's personal religious life. A sabbatical is time that God consecrates in which Pr. Bryant rests, disengages, studies, explores, reconnects with family, reflects, and prays.

This sabbatical's intent is that Pr. Bryant returns to JOY refreshed and renewed, ready to move into the next portion of our life together. Sabbatical activities for Pr. Bryant keep changing due to the pandemic. The hope is that some portion is spent in a silent retreat.

During the sabbatical, together with a supply pastor, the church council will see that JOY runs smoothly. A supply pastor will handle 100% of the responsibilities that Pr. Bryant handles, including emergency on-calls, funerals, weddings, etc.

A sabbatical invests in the common future of pastor and congregation. Pastors stay vital, both spiritually and professionally. Healthy pastors enhance the life and ministry of their congregations.

During the sabbatical, congregations often experience change or refreshment. People gain confidence in their leadership abilities. Lay leadership can be expanded in new and creative ways. The congregation has opportunity to experience new voices and see ministry from different, expansive perspectives.

Full compensation and benefits, excluding travel reimbursement, for Pr. Bryant will continue through the sabbatical. Pr. Bryant applied for a grant, but the grant was not funded due to the volume of applications. Pr. Bryant will use continuing education funds to address sabbatical expenses. All remaining expenses are covered by Pr. Bryant. Pulpit supply and mileage are covered by the budget's supply line item.

During the sabbatical neither Pr. Bryant nor the congregation are to be in contact. How come? Because sabbaticals are time away from congregational and pastoral ministry. The supply pastor will reach out to Pr. Bryant in the unexpected nature of an event that this becomes necessary.

God is up to good things in sabbaticals.

Highlights of the September 15, 2021 Church Council Meeting

Upon recommendations from the Worship and Music Committee it was decided to keep the church service as it is for now. The Council will review the situation again next month.

The Property Committee presented two action items for approval. One was to replace the hot water heater in the kitchen and the other was to allow Life Care Screening to use our building in January 2022. Both items were approved

Over the past several months the Executive Committee have been meeting with various Financial Investment firms to decide the best way to invest our "Gift". They met with our representative from Thrivent, Pastor Ana Lugo from the ELCA Foundation and Rosita Cotton from Financial Cornerstone Group.

Upon recommendations from the Executive Committee, the Church Council has decided to invest our "Gift" with Rosita Cotton of the Financial Cornerstone Group. The reason the Executive Committee made that recommendation was because they made the best presentation. They explained all our options, answered all our questions and gave us the best advice.

For the purpose of insurance, for cost replacement of Joy Lutheran Church, the church council decided to have the church property appraised.

Vice President Don Heine contacted Bonnie Sue Bedell of Worthy & Company Real Estate Appraisals and Consulting Services to do the appraisal. The appraisal for replacement cost Code Compliant came in at \$838,874.00 and is subject to Special Limiting Conditions. We are checking with Joy's insurance company and several other insurance companies to see if we need to increase our coverage.

In a sad note, Don Heine, church council Vice President has resigned. Don was a great asset to the council during our sessions with the Financial Advisors. He knew the questions to ask and helped us with our decision. Don was very supportive of the work the Executive Committee and the Church Council did.

On behalf of the Church Congregation and the Church Council I would like to thank Don for serving as the Vice President of Joy's Church Council.
