

Pastor's Point

Pr. J. David Bryant

Dear Friends---

Greetings in the name of Jesus.

Back in June of '21, then again in October of '21, I quoted the cantankerous *Teacher* in Ecclesiastes who says, "Better is the end of a thing than its beginning; the patient in spirit are better than the proud in spirit." (7:8)

At the risk of making a presumption, it appears that we are nearing the pandemic's end. Several news sources indicate that we are now in an endemic rather than a pandemic. What that means is this, Covid is moving in the direction of being like the Flu. Some even believe that it will soon be handled as we already handle the Flu. The good news in this is that we already know what to do with the Flu, and within the past 3 years, we have had a crash course in learning what to do with Covid

Given how for the past 7 days, the Covid positivity rate in Brevard County has hovered around 2.09% and daily cases average 5.2 per 100,000. Such numbers as these, taken from the Florida Department of Health, have motivated JOY's church council to move us quickly towards pre-pandemic practices. Details of these changes will be in the council president's April newsletter article.

Perhaps this news will raise comfort levels for those who have been away from regular inperson worship for so long. Perhaps this will also help us get back to business as usual. As a church family, we certainly have done admirably given what we have had to manage over the past 2-3 years. The people are weary. The pastor is weary. And, although I might be wrong to think this, I do believe that as we feel comfortable enough to do so, we should create our own individual plans to get ourselves back into in-person worship, to get back to being a family visibly together, and to actively engage in the faithful ministry of processing our pandemic journey together.

I cannot underscore how grateful I am for each of you, especially in those times when the pandemic had seemed to have gotten the best of us. Your faithful tithing, faithful patience, faithful presence, and faithful love have made all the difference in how we have handled what the pandemic has brought our way. Thank you so very much for being---FAITHFUL!

Because you have been faithful, and because God is ever-faithful, JOY Lutheran did not go the way of St. James Lutheran, Hanford, CA, or the way of North Park Lutheran, Buffalo, NY. pandemic closed those churches permanently. This was the story with so many congregations. Thanks be to God and thanks be to you, that is not the story of JOY. A recent article noted how, [in] "August 2020, Dave Kinnaman of the Barna Group told NPR...that as many as one in five American churches – or 20 percent – may close within 18 months." Because of faithful people and faithful God, that is not us.

In days to come, let's continue to make wise choices, to use hand sanitizer, to not impose our idea of what is best on others, to let one another do what each must to for the sake of comfort and peace. In short, let's continue to take care to look to the needs of our neighbor above our own personal preferences and individual practices. Yet, while caring for neighbor and self, as best as we are able, let's carry on, going onward and upward, getting back to being the JOY church family visibly together, as visibly gathered and as visibly active as possible.

When it comes to this pandemic that seemingly moves in the direction of an endemic, again we say, "Better is the end of a thing than its beginning!"

Stay well. Thanks for being so very faithful.

We sent our recommendations to the Task Force for approval. They were then sent to the Church Council. The following changes were approved:

- Uncover the water fountain
- No longer use Masks and Gloves during communion
- Once again commune at the rail
- Continue to offer Individual Cups and add back in The Common Cup.
- Begin standing during Sharing of the Peace. Share with those around you and not travel around the church.

These changes were implemented on March 20th.

Easter Lilies will be offered again this year. The sign-up sheet is in the Narthex. The price is \$10.00 per plant. Also, if you are interested in purchasing a Palm Tree, let me know. These will be able to take home after the Palm Sunday Service.

Highlights of the March Church Council Meeting

Worship and Music along with the Task Force made the following recommendations to our Church Services.

- **1.** Unwrap the water fountain in the Narthex
- 2. Pastor, Pastor's assistants and Communion assistants would not be required to wear gloves and masks.
- **3.** Communion would return to the rail with a limit of eight each time at the rail.
- **4.** Communion distribution will be with the individual cup and with the common cup.
- **5.** Sharing of the Peace. Stand and greet those around you. Avoid moving throughout the Sanctuary at these times.
- **6.** The Offering Plate will remain at the back of the Sanctuary.
- **7.** Water will be placed back in the Baptismal Font.
- **8.** The Lenten Wednesday night soup and sandwich meal will begin on Wednesday evening March 23, 2022, at 5:15 PM.

The Church Council approved these recommendations.

The Worship and Music Committee also recommended that we hire Mr. Bruce Bateman as our supply organist. The Council approved the recommendations to hire Mr. Bruce Bateman.

The Church Council voted to approve \$1,450 for new computer equipment for the secretary's and pastor's offices.

The Synod Assembly is scheduled for June 3 through June 5, 2022, to be held in person at Carib Royal Resort in Orlando. Deadline for reservation is May 11, 2022. We need 2 members to represent JOY at the Assembly. Anyone interested in being our representative, please see pastor Bryant or Marjorie Maenpaa.

Council approved \$1,000.00 donation to the ELCA Lutheran Disaster Response to the Ukraine Disaster.

The Finance Committee reported that they are working on the means and frequency for providing the members of the Congregation with financial status. This will be done quarterly and will be in the Sunday Bulletin and in the Newsletter. Once the format is developed it will be forwarded to the Council for approval.

The Council discussed the upcoming Sabbatical of Pastor Bryant. After four years of continuous service in a call, the pastor is eligible for four weeks of Sabbatical leave. Pastor Bryant will be taking his Sabbatical leave during the month of July 2022. Pastor Pamela McMillian who is the Grief Counselor at Hospice of St. Francis, will be our supply Pastor.

Next Council meeting will be on April 20, 2022, at 7:00 PM, with all committee reports due by April 13, 2022.
