

Pastor's Point

Pr. J. David Bryant

Dear Friends---

"Christos voskres! Voistyno voskres! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!" With those words, Ukrainian Christians enter Easter. The plight of war in Ukraine has overshadowed Lent and is still quite visible as we enter Easter. As we see the war's devastation, via the daily and nightly news, we wonder to ourselves, "what do we do?" Of course, in the list of what-we-do is pray and give, and offer care to those who emigrate to the U.S. All of these are faithful responses to, "what do we do?"

This Easter, as with each Easter that has gone before it, the question, "what do we do," comes our way. After all, we've been with Jesus from Transfiguration's pinnacle, and plummeted down with Jesus into the grave, there to find ourselves raised to new life with Jesus. After such a journey, "what do we do?"

For starters, we remind ourselves how Easter is not a single day celebration, and not just a church season, either. Easter is a lifestyle pattern of a celebration people. Every Sunday is a "little Easter" that serves to remind us how God's people follow the pattern of their Lord: 1) GO, 2) SUFFER, 3) BE KILLED, and 4) RISE. This is our pattern for it is our Lord's pattern. We could call it, the "Easter Pattern." Every Sunday, we gather to practice this pattern and to celebrate its fruits---forgiveness of sins and certainty of life-everlasting in Jesus. Easter is not a pattern that is just for Sundays; it's our everyday pattern because Jesus is not just "the resurrection and the life" (Jn 11:25) for us on Sundays.

So, bearing this in mind, "what do we do?" We don't hang out at the tomb, that's for sure. We get about the business that Jesus has already been doing all long. When the women leave Jesus' tomb, St. Luke says, "they remembered the words, and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest" (Lk 24:8-9). They left the tomb changed, and told this news to whoever would listen, which is why, for 2000 years since, every tomb has been rife with hope for God's power over sin, death, hell, and evil has been revealed.

What do we do? We do what the first witnesses to the resurrection do. We tell! We tell what we have seen and what we have come to know of the resurrection---right where we are. That's what the first witnesses do. They go back to their lives telling others what they have seen and heard. They tell the news as they live in the hope of resurrection. It's what they do. It's what we do.

The second verse of *Alleluia! Alleluia! Give thanks to the risen Lord!* we sang together on Easter. It truly is the answer to our what-do-we-do question; we "Spread the good news o'er all the earth: Jesus has died and has risen." That's what we do, knowing that such news will naturally spread, we tell that good news right where we are.

Highlights of the April Church Council Meeting

The computers in the secretary's and Pastor's Office have been updated and rebuilt. The systems now have more memory and a faster drive. This will speed up the workflow in the office. Both offices also have new larger monitors making the work on spread sheets and data bases easier as well as when working on multiple files simultaneously.

Once again, we have rented a house for our Day Camp Counselors. This was done as the result of the Day Camp Counselors coming in contact with all the people as the go from one camp to another and Covid-19 is still with us. We thought it would be better to rent a house rather than asking members of the Congregation to house the counselors.

Pastor Bryant receives 4 weeks paid vacation each year. This year he is required to take his 4 weeks of sabbatical leave. In addition to his 4 weeks of vacation and his 4 weeks of sabbatical leave, our Bishop and the Synod Compensation Team has recommended that given the stress and strain of the past two years, dealing with Covid-19, all rostered clergy be given a gift of Grace in the form of a paid extra week of vacation for health & wellness. This is a recommendation as a one-time gift of appreciation for all the Pastor had to deal with during the pandemic. This would mean Pastor Bryant would have 9 weeks of paid leave this year. After much discussion, the Council approved the additional week recommended by the Synod.

The Memorial Bricks for our memorial garden have finally arrived and the Property Committee will install the bricks.

The finance chart that appeared in the March Issue of Tidings of JOY, was approved by the Council. The chart will now appear quarterly in the Sunday bulletin.

The next meeting of the Church Council Meeting will be held on May 25th at 7:00pm.

Property Committee

The Property Committee continues to maintain the grounds during the Spring and Summer, the grass mowing and gathering of pine cones and tree branches continues.

During the end of March beginning of April, the lady's restroom received much needed replacement of the bathroom sink faucet and shut off valve thanks to David Steinhorst stepping to the plate and performing the job.

The office computers were rebuilt with a new up-to-date motherboard and processors, as well as additional memory and new solid-state drives. These updates will allow us to continue to use the current computers for the next few years before we need to address the issue once more.

We continue to address the cost of our electrical usage and some tweaks may need to be made to the duct work allowing us to benefit from more efficient use of the air-conditioning system. This may necessitate the installation of dampers in the smaller office and kitchen system duct work.

Susan Getter has been able to assist us in the weeding and mulching the flower beds in front of the church as well as weeding the back of the church by the entrance to the church office. Once all of the weeds are removed, we will be looking at a permanent solution to the back garden.

The new cabinets and countertops for the kitchen are in the process of being installed in the next few weeks. This will help make the kitchen more efficient and provide the ladies with more counter and storage space.
