

Friends,

St. Paul opens his epistle to the Christians at Philippi, saying, "I thank my God every time I remember you." In that single sentence, St. Paul captures my sentiments about our congregation. I thank God for you, and thank God that God allows me the joy-filled privilege to be your pastor.

Summer is upon us, and it is again the time of the year when faithful giving drops dramatically. This is a common pattern in many Florida-Bahamas Synod congregations. JOY experiences this pattern, too. A challenge of this pattern is that it inhibits our ability to support essential ministries and brightly shine the light of Jesus.

Many wonderful things happen through JOY because of God's blessings and the faithfulness of our church family. Please continue to give faithfully during these summer months, and, if the chance presents itself, to increase your gift as God empowers.

Here is the rest of St. Paul's opening thanksgiving and prayer to the Christians at Philippi:

"Constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart, for all of you share in God's grace with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight to help you to determine what is best, so that on the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God."

May St. Paul's prayer prove as true for our congregation as it was for the congregation at Philippi.

I look forward to seeing you all upon my return from sabbatical.

Summer 2022: Crafted in Christ A summer of rest and renewal

Eve Circle (Bible Study) –3rd Tuesday, @11:30am, July 19th

For summer 2022, participants will enjoy a three-session Bible study that uses the concept of quilting to explore rest, renewal, and Christian community.

We will discuss Old and New Testament readings as we consider the patterns we follow and how the pieces of our lives and communities are bound together in Christ. No actual sewing experience is required.

While no actual sewing experience is required to complete the study, participants can opt to create a quilting project as a lasting reminder of their time together.

Daily Bread

Daily Bread (DB) held a Volunteer Dinner on June 25th, which Rene Harper, Marilyn Brindle, and me, represented our JOY volunteers.

After dinner we watched a video and then Jeff Njus, the Executive Director of Daily Bread, spoke to us about Daily Breads mission and future.

Daily Bread has eight employees and 100's of volunteers. It takes twenty-five volunteers a day to keep Daily Bread operating. Daily Bread began on January 1st, 1988, when some kind people knew there was a need. They began as a soup kitchen and the first day served thirteen people. Before the pandemic they were serving 200-225 people per day, 365 days a year. During the pandemic, the numbers dropped to 100-125. They are not totally sure of why that was. The numbers are now just beginning to raise again.

Besides feeding their guests here are some of the additional services that are provided. There is a gentlemen named Ray who is one of Daily Breads success stories. He was homeless about 3 years ago and with the help of DB has found shelter. He now heads their Peer Support Specialist. He works with the clients to help them get cell phones through a government sponsored program. Everyone needs a phone in today's world.

DB has an Outreach Specialist as well as a Critical Transition Team that helps in finding housing once they are ready. DB helps them navigate the pathway to finding a home. In 2019 DB was able to place one hundred clients in homes. 2020 - 123 Clients and in 2021 - 147 clients found housing. Currently with the housing crisis in the area, this has become more difficult.

Daily Bread has volunteers that work as Employment Councilor. They help with Resume's, how to interview and has been known to drive clients to interviews when needed.

They offer showers and clean clothes daily to those that want they. On Wednesday's, The Brevard Health Alliance mobile van comes and offers Medical, Psychiatric, and pharmacy services. These are just a few of the services that are offered at Daily Bread.

Through grants and financial donations from the Cities of Melbourne and Palm Bay, DB is working on building a new facility to be opened in 2024. This will be able to offer permanent housing, and temporary housing to those that are in transition to move into another housing location.

The most important thing that Daily Bread gives is LOVE. It is a No Judgement Zone when they walk into Daily Bread. Jeff shared a few success stories. He shared that he received a Thank You note from a young woman. She thanked them for having open Arms and being compassionate in her darkest hours. She had been abused as a child and later in relationships. Daily Bread helped her break that cycle.

I want to thank all the members of JOY that continually support Daily Bread. You are all doing God's work and changing lives.

Before dinner Pastor Norm Holm (Our Ruth's son) opened with a beautiful prayer. We prayed for God's Special Children.

Thanks for all the members of JOY that have volunteered and supported this program.

Finance Committee

Our Finance Committee is mainly intended to support the Council, the Treasurer and the church's leadership in financial reporting and procedural matters; but I wanted to share a few thoughts about the role of each of us as members of JOY. The main point I would like to make here is that our church is a gift given to us by God and passed along by all those who have come before us. Perhaps fortunately for JOY, none of us can support the entire ministry of our church by him/herself. Rather, each of us through our offerings takes responsibility for a part of the ministries. Summer is often the hardest time for the finances of the church; weekly giving tends to be down due to vacations and the like. Please remember that our church's needs do not go on vacation; so, our continued giving weekly, monthly or even annually is very important. Here are a few Q&As about church finances and giving:

Q: There are 365+ envelopes in my box! Do I need to give every week?

A: No ... they are there for your use to help you keep track of your regular offerings.

Q: If I give monthly, what should I do with the other envelopes?

A: You only need to use the ones that you need. You can recycle or discard the rest.

Q: I do not have any offering envelopes.

A: Just ask the President or me, and we will get a box for you.

Q: What if I cannot find or did not pick up my box of envelopes?

A: Any blank envelope will do. Just print your name and envelope number (if you know it) on the envelope and drop it in the offering plate on Sunday.

Q: What if I am going to be gone on Sunday?

A: There is a secure drop slot on the office door at the back of the church.

Q: What if I am going to gone for the Summer or for several weeks?

A: See the answer above. You can also send a check to the church's address 3174 Jupiter Blvd. SE, Palm Bay, FL.

Q: Can I pay via an electronic transfer from my bank or credit union?

A: Yes ... there is a link on the church's website (<u>www.joylutheranelca.com</u>) for credit cards, or your bank or credit union's online banking website may provide a way to request an electronic transfer.
