



Pastor's Point

Friends,

Are you familiar with the DC Comics hero, Superman? Probably so. Take a moment before reading further and think about Superman's strengths and weaknesses.

St. Paul says, "...if you think you are standing, watch out that you do not fall. No testing has overtaken you that is not common to everyone. God is faithful, and God will not let you be tested beyond your strength, but with the testing God will also provide the way out so that you may be able to endure it." (1 Corinthians 10:12-13)

While you thought about Superman, did you remember than Kryptonite is an element that weakens and disempowers the DC Comics character Superman? Think of three things in your life that are like Kryptonite to you. (*pause*) Think of three things that are like Kryptonite in JOY Lutheran's life. It is important to considerer such things, particularly in Epiphany, then Lent.

This week I landed myself in a debate with a friend about whether Superman was the best of heroes or whether it was Captain America. My friend explained how, "No matter how amazing Superman happens to be, Superman has both an enemy and a weakness. Evil is the enemy and Kryptonite is his weakness."

Like Superman, we also have an enemy and a weakness. Our enemy, the devil, uses schemes that appeal to our weakness, hoping that we find ourselves divided, distracted, and defeated; the goal here is to destroy us.

On a personal level, things like social media addiction distract us, weaken us, and take us off mission, keep us from forming solid relationships. On a congregational level, stuff like worship wars over whether the communion wine should be red or white, or whether we should always sing *All Glory, Laud, and Honor* on Palm Sunday, keep us from pointing others to Jesus. These things are common, and they can prove challenging, but God gives us the way out (1 Cor 10:12-13).

For those who are in Christ, we have the right to be called children of God; we are new creations. And we've received "supernatural" power through the Holy Spirit to live a holy and godly life. Each has the power to overcome temptations and be obedient to Christ---to be neither overpowered nor overcome.

What is your Kryptonite? What are the things that tempt you, that you often give into when under pressure? What makes you weak? What things give the enemy an easy advantage over you? And over our congregation?

Begin to see these temptations as Kryptonite – things that weaken us and derail us from accomplishing God's purposes in our lives and our congregations. And let's avoid them like the plague that they are!

Winter/Spring 2023 Bible study, "The Ten Commandments" Eve Circle (Bible Study) 3rd Tuesday, February 21 @ 11:30



Join *Gather* magazine and revive your soul in 2023 with a four-session study of the ten commandments. ELCA pastor and Bible study author Christa von Zychlin will help us see how these commandments are more than they may appear at first glance. For example, Martin Luther taught that the commandment, "Do not kill," means not only refraining from murder, but actively promoting the health and life of others. Get ready to explore old and new interpretations of God's laws, using Luther's Small and Large Catechism and more!

February 2023 Session two: Rhythms and respect (Commandments 3 & 4)

Some might say the Old Testament commands Remember the Sabbath and Honor Your Folks seem outdated and quaint. After all, didn't Jesus routinely break the Sabbath? Didn't Jesus (on occasion) talk back to his mother? Yet these commandments are far from outdated. Find out how these commands offer a source of peace and inspiration in today's often hectic and generationally segregated society and church.

Did you know.....

Recently a person asked me, "Since our sins are forgiven in Baptism, why do we have Confession every Sunday?" For starters, the Lutheran practice has historically been to offer Confession and Absolution on Communion Sundays. This is the practice of the ancient Church because Confession and Absolution are rooted in Baptism, even after we are Baptized.

Luther tells us: "... adversity assails us in more than one form. There is...the sin remaining in our flesh after baptism, the inclination to anger, hatred, pride and unchastity, and so forth, which assails us as long as we live. Against this we not only need the help of the congregation and of Christ, in order that they may fight with us against it, but it is also necessary that Christ and His saints intercede for us before God, that sin may not be accounted to us according to God's strict judgment. "

This is from Luther's "Treatise Concerning the Blessed Sacrament of the Holy and True Body of Christ and Concerning the Brotherhoods." We confess before eating the "Blessed Sacrament" how we are wrapped up in sin, in bondage to sin, and have been captive to sin, even while we are being saved by God through Baptism. It is our, "...inclination to anger, hatred, pride and unchastity, and so forth," says Luther, that keeps us confessing and absolving one another until the Last Day.


