

Pastor's Point

Friends---

Consider these words, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile, and you are still in your sins (1 Corinthians 15:17)."

Sobering words, aren't they?

As I write this "Pastor's Point," we are in Lent, still sifting through our lives, looking for what might require renewal, repentance, and rebirth. Soon, though, we will enter Holy Week, where we will prepare for three days that culminate in the resurrection of Jesus. Consider how different that first Easter morning was, when there were no crowds, no lilies, no hot cross buns, no hallelujahs, no trumpets, and no joy. There was a burial detail of women, nothing more. How many women depends on which gospel you read. These women were on a mission to anoint Jesus' body, because it had not been done before his burial.

A loud tremor disturbs their mission as an angel comes and rolls back the stone, then sits on it. This angel, clothed in brilliant white, looks like lightning. The guards quaked in their sandals. But the angel says to the women, "do not be afraid; I know you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. But he is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come see the place where he lay." The angel then encourages the women to go and tell Jesus' disciples that Jesus has gone ahead to Galilee and will meet them there. But note that even had the story ended there, the fact is proclaimed that Jesus is raised. The tomb is empty. Despite the women's awe, death has no last word on Jesus; this is why the story goes on and on.

Good stories have the power to change lives and change history. We all have stories to tell. We have stories to tell about how God redeems us, claims us, forgives us, changes us, uses us, and blesses us as we follow, worship, serve, obey, and love God. When we tell our stories, others hear how God is not a character in our story but rather we are characters in God's story. God sends us to tell God's story, which others experience as "the Gospel according to You." Others have heard the Holy Gospel of Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Mark, Matthew, Luke, and John...now, others hunger to hear the Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to You. This is not the end, in the garden, at the tomb, or even in the New Testament; that is only the beginning. The story goes on and on through folks like me and folks like you. Go and tell the good news that Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

"Digging Deeper"

For those who are looking to do a 'deep dive' into what it means to be 'Walking Wet.' A short course of 10 1-hr sessions facilitated by Linda Collins. Sessions will begin Thursday, April 20th, 10am. These sessions are especially useful if you are new to JOY. These will help you connect and build friendships. There are six slots available. A signup sheet will be in the narthex on April 1st. See Linda Collins or Pr. Bryant if you have questions.

Beginning Thursday, April 20th at 10am, here at JOY, we have a chance to "Dig Deeper" into what it means to be "Walking Wet." Co-facilitators, Linda Collins and Rene' Harper will guide us on a journey of 10-hour long sessions that explore what it means to be a Jesus Follower: from the moment we are splashed in the font, and then move from the font into living our life in grace.

This is not a lecture-styled study. The format for these sessions is small group discussion centered on the Gospels. There is space for six people. We are capped at 6 people because too many people in the study makes it hard to stay within the hour-long period and inhibits the formation of intimacy required for sharing to occur. Did You Know?

Most Lutherans in the U.S., prior to WWI, attended worship services held in the languages of their European homelands. English speaking services were rare. This proved to be a major evangelism challenge in a nation that primarily spoke English. English speakers were not inclined to attend services in languages they did not know. For this reason, the Common Service Book (CSB) was developed in 1917. It took the first Lutheran liturgy in English, the 1888 Common Service, and married it to the other worship elements fully translated into English.

Because the developers are smart, they borrow heavily from the Episcopal Book of Common Prayer and the King James Version of the Bible. In fact, they borrow so heavily from these resources that British, rather than American, English spellings are used, e.g., Saviour, honour, etc. British capitalization styles are employed. The Lord's Prayer gets directly copied from the Book of Common Prayer. And, in fact, Anglican tunes for liturgical service elements are employed and retained for the next 60-ish years. This was the reality in Lutheran worship resources until the 1978 arrival of the Lutheran Book of Worship (LBW).

Property Committee

The "Property Committee" continues to stay busy. The men's restroom painting was completed and the work for remodeling the counters in both the women's and men's restrooms has started. The work will involve the removal of the old counter tops and replacement of new counter tops. The plan is to have the work completed by the latter part of May.

On Saturday March 25th, a group of members of the Property Committee, the worship and Music Committee, and a member of the Boys Scouts reorganized the storage space in the large shed. The work consisted of removing most of the materials on the center shelves, re-positioning the center shelves thus allowing for space to move around the shelves and replacing items on the newly configured shelves. This will allow members to walk around the shed placing and removing items from the shelves with ease and allowing for more efficient use of the existing shelve space. The plan to place the center sections of shelving lengthwise was developed by Harold Lengel, which was quickly adopted and approved by the Committee as the best solution for the shed. All Committees, Cub Scouts and Boys Scouts will be instructed to keep the isles open and free of obstructions.

Following the reorganization of the large shed, we will be moving into the Sanctuary and start the work of cleaning out and reorganizing the two closets on either side of the entrance.

On Saturday April 1st., the members of the Calvary Church will be working at JOY to replace sand, add stones around the church, and remove some of the old plants.

Starting May 1st. 2023 all Committee Chairman/Secretaries will be asked to file all Committee meeting minutes on the JOY Office 365 online system. Starting April 17th. - April 28th. Committee chairs will be instructed in the use of the new system.

A hearty thanks and appreciation go out to Jackie Baudek and Linda Collins for the great job in cleaning and buffing the floor in the Wollom-Jackson room. Thankyou Ken Laumer, for taking the opportunity to cut and remove the tree that toppled during the last hurricane of the 2022 season.
