

#### **Pastor's Point**

Friends---

If you are of a certain age, you sang songs in school, so you might recognize these lyrics: "Put your right arm in, take your right arm out. Put your right arm in, and you shake it all about. Do the Hokey Pokey and you turn yourself around, that's what it's all about!"

As I pondered what to offer in this article, these lyrics seemed fitting for June.

In Sundays and Seasons, our denomination's digital worship resource, the weekly liturgical "buffet" that provides a selection of Scriptures to be considered each week seems to be dancing the hokey pokey. It goes into something, then out of it, only to do it all again.

With Holy Week and the Resurrection moving behind us, logically we'd move deeper into the New Testament readings. We could imagine how we'd motor into the early days of the church—before it was a church, but rather a benign movement within Judaism. Instead, we'll motor into a series of readings from earlier in John's Gospel before we veer into the Matthew's Gospel. As we make our way through these readings, like so many billboards along the roadside, we'll see a series of teachable moments in which Jesus "school" disciples.

Why is that? Well...as I said in the announcements on May 14th, we are in a waiting space, a pregnant time that exists between Ascension and Pentecost. When we wait, often we reflect. We consider what came before, and what might be yet to come. Given that the Church calendar, and the Revised Common Lectionary have given us this waiting place in which to pause, let's take a breath, and soak in what it means to follow the risen Christ. Let's look at two things Jesus said to the first Jesus followers:

"Believe in God, believe also in me...I will come and take you to myself." "If you love me, keep my commandments...Because I live, you will live also."

Notice how, like the Hokey Pokey, there is movement. Jesus moves to issue a command, then moves to attach a promise to it. These movements serve to remind us how beliefs—like actions—have consequences. We believe in a risen Savior, and a God who loved us so much that God was willing to do the unimaginable to save us. More than that--God was willing to do the unimaginable just for the chance to save us. Faced with such love...What is our response? What's our move?

What does being the recipient of such wondrous love mean for how we should love others?

And, maybe just as important a question, what does God's wondrous love for you mean for how you should love and respect yourself? After all, God's love and grace falls like rain, soaking any under its cloud boundary.

Consider these questions your homework for Pentecost—wrestle with them as the Spirit empowers---and since we Lutherans are big on grace, let's make it an open book test.

Session One: Promised Salvation Now— Jesus Brings Wellness

Did you know...

As the Living Lutheran mentioned in April 2013, "Composer Johann Sebastian Bach, a devout Lutheran, is credited with 1,126 musical works listed in the complete Bach catalog (Bach-Werke-Verzeichnis, or BWV). He wrote about 200 cantatas, including at least two for each Sunday and holy day in the Lutheran church year." A member of Bach's family has served as the musician in residence at St. George's Church in Bach's hometown of Eisenach for six solid generations. Imagine Bach playing organ not too far from the crucifix at the altar. People who want to become gifted musicians, rub the left foot of Bach's statue in the narthex of the church. Did you notice Bach's shiny left foot?

## **Property Committee**

The lawn maintenance of the property is once again starting to get busy. This past month we welcomed Bob Getter as he provided us with much needed help in mowing the grass around the church.

The remodeling of the countertops in the men's and lady's restrooms was placed on a short hold as we tackled some more pressing safety projects.

James Collins installed a doorbell on the front door with chimes inside the church. This will allow us to leave the front door locked and when people or committee members need to enter the church, they can ring the doorbell and people in the church will be able to come and open the door. This will be very helpful for the ladies of the quilters, crafters, and knitters as they meet during the day.

Jackie and Linda Collins have continued their work of cleaning the tile floors in the restrooms. They have worked hard, and the floors look amazing. The men of the property group will seal the floors.

James Collins installed a handrail for the entrance to the ladies/scout's side of the large shed. This will make it safer and easier for the ladies to enter and exit the shed. In addition to the handrail, the property group installed a dehumidifier in the shed, which was purchased by the ladies of WELCA.


The two shut off valves to the main water line of the church have not worked for several years and it was decided to have one of the valves replaced so that we could have a working shut off valve in or right outside the church. Since this project entailed more than the property group was willing to tackle, we called Paul's Plumbing to see about doing the work. After Paul had the opportunity to look at the valve, he discovered a leak at the bottom of the pipe coming into the church. It was decided to place the new valve outside the church wall on the right side of the front entrance and eliminate the old water line coming into the church and replace it with new section of water line coming through the wall. Paul came and installed the new line and a new shut off valve.

Kim Tolley was able to obtain a multifunction laser printer/copier/scanner. from her employer as a donation. This printer is much faster than our old printer and, it is capable of doing much more than our old machine. This will help make our office much more efficient.

Our move to the new Microsoft Office 365 has been delayed as we needed to assure Microsoft that we had 85% usage of the system. This is a requirement of Microsoft in order that we will be able to continue using the non-profit program for free. We will start making the move to the new system beginning in June.

#### What is MP100?
