

Pastor's Point

Dear Friends,

September is here and soon days will shorten; we are turning towards the end of the Church Year. Sunday readings will increasingly point to the Last Day---when our Lord will return as victorious, righteous Judge. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus says, "For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man." (Matthew 24:37-39)

The Last Day will arrive unexpectedly, and then the Judgment will begin. St. Paul issues a warning, "For all of us must appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense for what has been done in the body, whether good or evil." (2 Corinthians 5:10) The Last Day is inescapable. Faced with this reality, the Evil One works to deceive you into believing that you are not God's child, that you are sinful behold hope, that you are a failure. The Evil One works to keep you in hell-on-earth by keeping you in a place of never knowing whether you are a Christian, whether you are saved.

In this hell-on-earth, nights grow long, light fades, and we feel as if time for us is running out. Despair and anxiety cause us to forget what Jesus says in John 15:3, "You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you." Jesus doesn't say that you will be clean after you get your act together or have become uber-pious. Jesus says you are already clean. It's a done deal. Because of Jesus' suffering, dying, and rising from the grave, your sin has been handled. All of it. And in the waters of your baptism, you were connected to Christ. Galatians 3:27 reminds us, "As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ." When the Word of God was spoken over you with the water, you were dressed in the righteousness of Jesus. When God the Father sees you, the Father sees the holiness of Jesus.

Cling to this truth when the Evil One whispers or shouts doubts in your direction. Days will come when you stumble into sin. Days will come when you don't "feel" like God's child. On those days, the Evil One will work to cause you to doubt your connection to Christ. On those days, remind yourselves that, "You are already clean (justified, saved, redeemed, bought, sought, marked, and claimed)," says Jesus, "because of the Word which I have spoken to you," and celebrate how your bond with Christ Jesus, the Devil will never sever. Look to Jesus, claim the promise, and know that you are God's chosen, beloved child. This is your day-to-day reality. It's as true on your first day as it will be on your Last.

Did You Know?

Did you know...

Martin Luther used profanity, especially when targeting rivals. Perhaps Luther's favorite targets were Erasmus and Zwingli, although Pope Leo X and Schwenkfeld both ranked high on Luther's list. Luther and Erasmus had words over the concept of *free-will*, something Lutherans neither believe nor teach. For Luther, the will inclines towards evil. For Erasmus, the will has choices to make. Luther so completely disagreed with Erasmus on the matter that their debate gave birth to Luther's *Bondage of the Will*. Luther believed that the only direction towards which the human will is oriented, inclines towards evil. For this reason, a rather common confession used in Lutheran worship resources begins, "we confess that we are in bondage to sin and cannot free ourselves." Because Erasmus, had he been given the opportunity, might've worded that confession something like, "we confess that we have chosen sin willfully rather than chosen what is right," Luther called Erasmus, "the vilest miscreant that ever disgraced the earth," and went on to say, "Whenever I pray, I pray for a curse upon Erasmus." (Luther's quotes are from *Table Talk*)

We have had a great response for all the members and friends when bidding on the 5 silent auction quilts that have been made by the Dorcas Quilting Circle during the year. Each year as we quilt along and make the quilts that will be sent to Lutheran World Relief to be distributed to foreign countries, we select 5 quilts that we feel have been done exceptionally well and put them in the Silent Auction. The proceeds of the sale will go towards the fabric, sheets (for backing) and most importantly, for the batting. The batting costs approximately \$170 a roll and we will get about 20 quilts per roll. We will use between 4-5 rolls per year in order to complete the 70-80 quilts. That can be a big expense for Dorcas Circle so the funds we collect during the Silent Auction help to offset that expense.

We are fast approaching the Craft Sale and Silent Auction and I am excited to say, we have some awesome quilts! The Silent Auction will start at the beginning of October and continue until the November Craft show. So, get your pencils ready and bid!





Property Committee

The kitchen painting has been completed and the first half of the Wollom-Jackson room was also painted. The interior painting of the church will be completed by the end of September.

The Council approved the purchases of a new zero turn riding mower to replace one of the current older mowers. The new mower will allow us to cut the grass more efficiently requiring less in service and repairs.

The Boys Scouts will complete the mulching of the playground in the new few weeks as the temperatures will start to moderate. This will complete the planned improvements to the playground.

The central air-conditioning unit used for the office, the quilting and knitting room and the Wollom-Jackson Room has not been working and it is in need of service. The technicians were in last week to service the unit, but they were unable to repair it. We will have to have the technicians back to get the system serviced. The Wollom-Jackson Room is not being cooled at this time as the mini split unit is also not working at this time.
