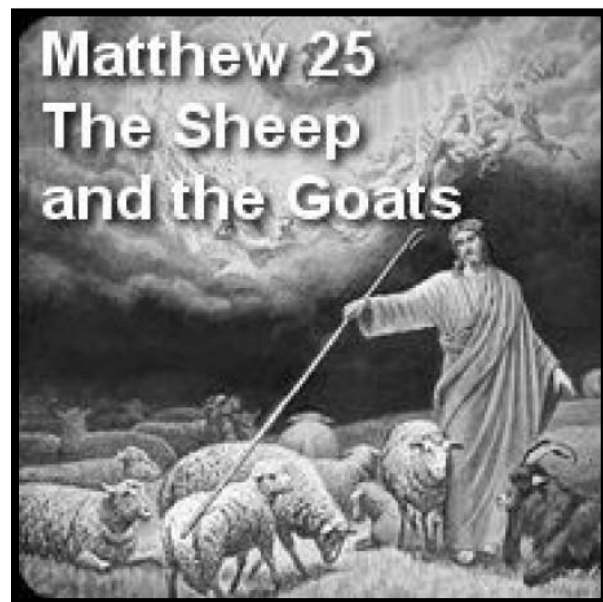

## Pastor's Point

Pr. John David Bryant

Friends, someone asked me, quite recently, what do Lutherans think about the Holy Spirit? My teasing remark was, "Often, we don't."

In Luther's Small Catechism, we read, *"I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, made me holy and kept me in the true faith, just as he calls, gathers, enlightens, and makes holy the whole Christian church on earth and keeps it with Christ in the one common true faith. Daily in this Christian church the Holy Spirit abundantly forgives all sins – mine and those of all believers. On the last day, the Holy Spirit will raise me and all the dead and will give me and all believers eternal life. This is most certainly true."*

Luther says distinct things about the Spirit:

### ***"I believe...I cannot believe."***

It sounds paradoxical, but we trust that God saves us and calls us to faith. Faith is God's gift to us. Faith is not something we manufacture. It is not being "spiritual but not religious," nor extreme piety. Faith is relationship in God which the Spirit invites and empowers us to share. (John 14:1-31)

### ***"Called"***

Faith comes to us. And though we are experiential beings, the Spirit specifically calls us to faith "through the gospel" – the good news of Jesus Christ in his life, death, and resurrection. The Spirit empowers us to "follow" the pattern of Jesus: live, die, and rise. Luther explains how the gospel is given to us in God's word of forgiveness, holy baptism, holy communion, confession, forgiveness, and the mutual consolation of believers, 'where two or three are gathered' (Matthew 18:20).

### ***"Gathered"***

The Spirit gathers us into community, the Church. The Church, per Luther, is a "[mouth house](#)" where we hear God's word and live it, reflect on it, cultivate it, nurture it, and are changed by it.

### ***"Enlightened me with his gifts"***

The Spirit gives us gifts for ministry; each of us is called, gathered, and enlightened for faithful service. In 1 Corinthians 12, Romans 12, and Ephesians 4, you see gifts given to the body of Christ. Galatians 5:22-23 says the Spirit produces in us, "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things."

### ***"Made me holy (or sanctified)"***

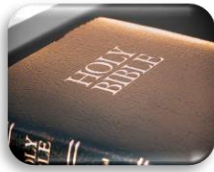
2 Corinthians 3:6 says, "The letter kills, the Spirit gives life." To be holy is to have life, the life of Christ – but we must die to ourselves to be raised. The Spirit kills us under the law and raises us to new life in Christ through the gospel. Holiness, set-apartness, results from the Spirit who gives life.

### ***"Kept me with Jesus Christ in the one true faith"***

The Spirit keeps us connected to Jesus as we go out and serve. The Spirit does this by keeping us connected to each other and God's word. Luther says in the Large Catechism, "Therefore we believe in him who daily brings us into this community through the same word and the forgiveness of sins. Then when his work has been finished and we abide in it, having died to the world and all misfortune, he will finally make us perfectly and eternally holy. Now we wait in faith for this to be accomplished through the word."

Ultimately the Spirit's role among us is to reveal Jesus. Whenever you see the business of calling, gathering, enlightening, sanctifying, and creating new life in Christ, you are seeing the handiwork of the Holy Spirit. And since we see these things in our midst, we Lutherans can think about the Spirit, and talk about the Spirit, too.

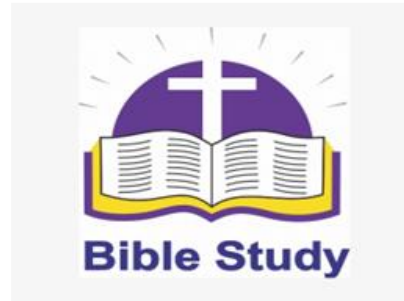

Did you know....

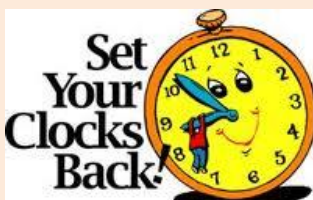
Lutherans believe and teach that Jesus seeks us, not the reverse. In 1522, on the First Sunday in Advent, Martin Luther preached:

*"I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me." (Revelation 3:20)*

He comes, comes unto you. Yea, verily, you go not to Him, neither do you fetch Him. He is too high for you, and too far away. All your wealth and wit, your toil and labor, will not bring you near Him, lest you pride yourself that your merit and worthiness have brought Him unto you. Dear friend, all your merit and worthiness are smitten down, and there is on your side nothing but sheer undeserving and unworthiness, and on His side is pure grace and mercy. Here comes together humanity in our poverty and the Lord in His unsearchable riches.

Therefore, learn here from the Gospel what happens when God begins to build us into the likeness of Him, and what is the beginning of saintliness. There is no other beginning than that your king comes unto you and begins the work in you. You do not seek Him, He seeks you; you do not find Him, He finds you; your faith comes from Him, not from yourself, and where He does not come, you must stay outside; and where there is no Gospel, there is no God, but sheer sin and destruction. Therefore, ask not where to begin a godly life; there is no beginning but where this king comes and is proclaimed."

## 2023 Conference on Ministry

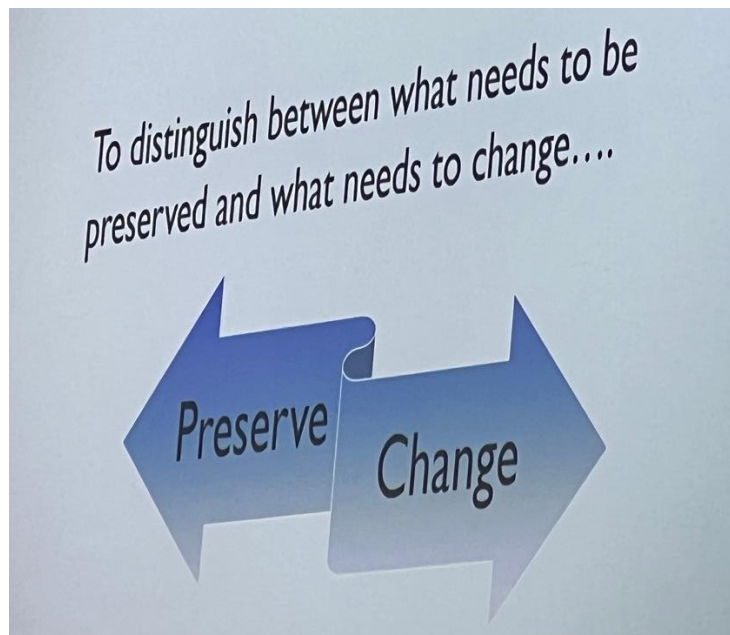
Conference on Ministry (COM) is one of the two required annual meetings for Florida-Bahamas Synod clergy (the other is Synod Assembly). And I deeply thank you for your generous support in sending me each year, although I do whine about its long meetings.

Typically held in Autumn, COM lasts for 2-3 days. Clergy gather and compare stories, receive reports from our bishop, celebrate Holy Communion, and often renew our ordination vows. A large part of our time together is spent in learning sessions led by a keynote speaker. This year's keynote speaker was [Tod Bolsinger](#), a Fuller Seminary vice-president, who authored the popular leadership text, [Canoeing the Mountains](#).

Tod spent three hours in sessions as we explored together the challenges that face all congregations in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. One of the things that Tod pondered with us was how, these days, things are less a matter of people being change resistant and more a matter of people being loss resistant. Tod also spoke about how leaders develop tempered resilience in a time of great change. In that session, Tod reminded us of a rather sobering quote from Presidential Medal of Freedom recipient Eric Hoffer, "in times of great change, learners inherit the earth, while the learned find themselves beautifully equipped for a world that no longer exists." I think the culmination of Tod's sessions might be contained in a single slide that calls us to ask ourselves, "what needs to be preserved and what needs to change?" It's a faithful thing to ponder, isn't it?

## Property Committee

The building thermostats have been set on a schedule taking into consideration the current usage of the facility. When setting the thermostats for cooling or heating, please follow the following guidelines:

1. To turn on the main air conditioners in the Sanctuary, please turn them on one at a time in thirty-minute intervals. This will prevent us from incurring on demand surcharge for the energy used by the units.
2. Make sure to use a temporary hold on the units for the time period you are using the facility. This will keep our energy usage lower as the units will return to the normal set schedule after the expiration of the temporary hold.

The damage from the termites in the large shed on the men's side turned out to be more extensive than the initial inspection indicated. The West side wall was opened up resulting in additional evidence of termite activity. The area has been treated and we will repair the wall where there was damage. This will require some lumber to be purchased to replace affected materials.

The organ continues to have some issues, and this is being addressed by our organist and the organ repair company.

The transition from the current G-mail (email) used by the staff, officers, council, and committee chairs to Outlook Email on Microsoft Office 365 will begin on December 1, 2023. The new email addresses for JOY Lutheran Church, Pastor Bryant, staff, officers, council members and committee chairs will be shared with Congregation Members as well as on web site and newsletter.
