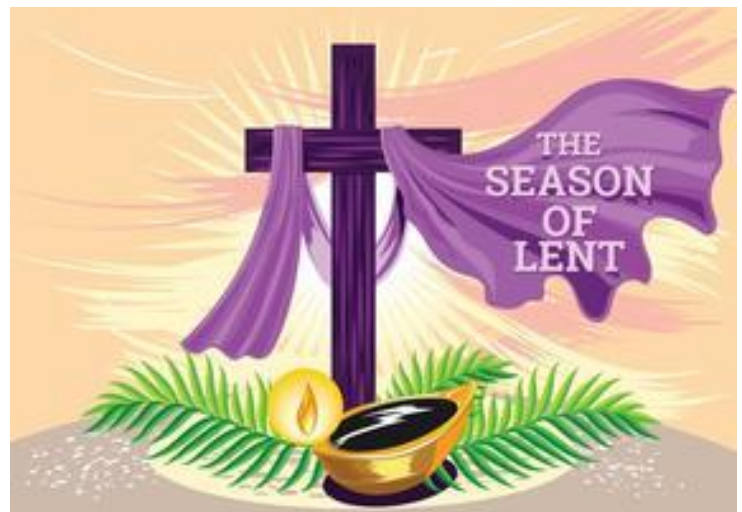
Ash Wednesday

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

The season of Lent comes upon us with Ash Wednesday, March 5th. With the sign of the ashes, we are summoned to die with Christ, and we are summoned to live with Christ. Lent can be a time of reflection on God's love for us. Saying yes to the gift of God's love is saying yes to the experience of the Cross. The Cross brings suffering and death and resurrection for our Lord and Savior, and for us.

The season of Lent calls us to recommit ourselves to the Cross and all that it brings to our lives. This recommitment, this annual travel through Lent can be challenging and unsettling for us; for it brings our attention and focus on that by which we measure our lives ✕ the Cross of Jesus Christ ✕. Lent can be a time of reconciliation with God, with those around us. The ultimate reconciliation comes in the Cross – in the death and resurrection of Jesus. Your presence in worship and witness to our Lord in Lent, Holy Week and Easter bring a focus to all that we say and do in the Holy Name of Jesus.

Lent was originally a time of intense preparation for new inquirers of the Christian faith – it was called the catechumenate. For the whole season of Lent, these catechumens were taught the meaning of Christian life and practice. They were not allowed to be a part of the faithful who gathered in Sunday worship – the catechumens had to listen to the liturgy at the door or the window, for they were not yet ready for initiation into the household of God. Finally, after weeks of preparation, fasting and prayer, they were privileged to receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism at the Easter Vigil – as the first light of the Easter Day broke new Christians were set apart in the waters of forgiveness and hope. They were brought into full fellowship as new brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus.

For us today, the season of Lent can be a time to focus on our own preparation for rising to a newness of life that began with our own baptism and continues daily in our life in Christ. Lent can be a time to move from darkness to light, from sin to freedom, from fears to hope. Lent is a discipline, in listening to the Word of God, in faithful, trusting reception of the Sacrament of Holy Communion, in being part of the faith community which gathers for strength and hope to face the world around us. Lent can be a time to take stock amidst the changes and challenges in this time, in this life, and renew our relationship in faith in Christ Jesus.

I ask each of you to make a special effort to be a part of our community life in Lent and Eastertide. This is not about entertaining you or making you feel good about yourself or being a nice or a good person. This is about saving your life in the Holy Name of Jesus. These are the seasons that are the core of our faith and life: The Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Be intentional about worship and study in these coming seasons of Lent and Easter. Use all the opportunities to be a part of the community of faith that gathers in the name of Jesus. Start with Ash Wednesday and follow the example of Our Lord Jesus (Luke 9:51): “he set his face towards Jerusalem.” Follow the path that takes you to the most precarious of places – the foot of the Cross and continue through to our hope and resurrection in the Death and Resurrection of Jesus.

LENT 2025

The phrase, the theme for the season comes from St. John 3:16; **“For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whosoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.”**

The good Dr. Luther called it “the heart of the Bible – the Gospel in miniature.” It is on the Lenten coin we give out on Ash Wednesday—that you carry with you for the season, and life beyond Lent. Life in Christ solely points to the Cross for those who hear the words of hope and promise.

Our Lenten journey asks us if we can make that same claim for our life as followers of Christ. Lent can help us move towards that goal. The question is this: does our life in Christ daily move us to love the Lord, our God knowing full well that we carry the cross of Christ in our hearts.

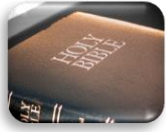

Kidnapped and sold into slavery in Ireland, Patrick escaped after six years and returned to his native Britain. A voice in a dream told him to return to Ireland to serve the people he had met there. His life is rich with stories, among them that he used a shamrock to teach about the Blessed Trinity just as the shamrock has three distinct leaves and yet is one plant. God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – three Persons in one Supreme Being. Using a shamrock to teach about a central Christian mystery appealed to the imagination of the Irish. They sensed that God is present in all creation. St. Patrick showed them that in the mystery of the Holy Trinity, God is beyond all creation as well.

SHROVE TUESDAY March 4th

Burning of the Palms at 5:45pm



Typically utilizing ash created by the burning of palms from the previous Palm Sunday, this symbolic rite is a reminder of the sign of the cross that was placed on us in our Baptisms, our mortality (“Remember: you are dust, and to dust you shall return.”), and the filth of our sin that has been washed clean by the blood of Jesus.

Pancake Supper at 6:00pm



The origin of Shrove Tuesday comes from the idea of - the night before Lent begins - consuming everything in the household from which one planned to abstain during Lent. We serve pancakes to connect us to the customs of a time when flour, eggs, milk, butter, and other food items were all on the Lenten abstinence list. These days we celebrate the evening before Ash Wednesday more as a foretaste of the feast to come at Easter. (ELCA)

Daily Bread Update

Some of you are aware that there are many changes coming up to the Daily Bread (DB) organization as they operate currently. Before I get into the changes, I wanted to share some information about what they achieve.

In 2024 DB had 1241 Volunteers who put in 35,129 volunteer hours. They provided 14,901 showers. The cold night shelter was open 14 days and provided a warm bed for 212 clients. They feed a hot meal to approximately 130-160 clients each day.

They understand that feeding a meal each day does not solve the homeless situation. It is housing that is needed. They work with their clients to get them into housing, which has been highly successful until a few years ago. The rent prices in Brevard went crazy as many of you know.

To solve this issue, they have been working on a housing unit called Providence Place. The plan was in place to build on Sarno Road in Melbourne. That had to be changed, and they are now building on Apollo Blvd. in Melbourne. This has set them back about 2 years.

The City of Melbourne originally said they could keep the current Daily Bread running until Providence Place was open. They have changed that, and Daily Bread will have to be shut down within the next few months. The final date is not yet available.

They are now scrambling to figure out how to offer all the services they do now in a different way. They had already planned to bring food trucks and shower trucks to the homeless camps. But they thought they had 2 years to work that out.

Providence Place will house 119 units, and it will be like an apartment building a permanent housing for those that live there. As I get more info I will continue to share with you.

What I ask is that you pray for Daily Bread and if you are able to, a financial donation will help greatly. Daily Bread does such great work to help those that need it the most.

Those with abnormal results should discuss possible next steps with their family healthcare provider and ensure they understand the risk and benefits of any additional testing or procedures.

Privacy Issues

Under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPPA) of 1996 and subsequent legislation and executive orders, hospitals and long-term care facilities are greatly restricted in their ability to disclose patient information. So, I will not know whether you or your loved one has been admitted to the hospital unless you let me know. In the event that you are hospitalized, then, you or a family member should call the church directly.

In addition, please be aware that the Sunday morning greeting line may not be the best time to let me know you have a need or concern – mainly because I will not be able to give you the attention it deserves, but also because of privacy concerns. See me a little later or call the church with details. That greeting time is a special time to welcome the parish family and make those important connections with our visitors.

New changes in healthcare laws (every year) and our rapidly changing society present new challenges to the church as we seek to continue to support and nurture one another and to be for one another the body of Christ. These challenges, however, do not change the truth that we hold the command of Jesus to “love one another” as a sacred and solemn duty as well as a real joy. Thank you for helping to share this ministry in Jesus’ name.
