Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus.

REFORMATION DAY, OCTOBER 31st, tends to get submerged in all the Halloween ruckus. (We lose sight that Halloween is All Hallows Eve; let alone the fact that as I write this in late September, the Halloween supplies are now on clearance at the big box stores and Christmas is starting to be stocked on the shelves.). We celebrate the day actually on a Sunday; October 26th this year. This year we commemorate the 508th anniversary of the formative act of the public struggle to reform the church: the posting of the 95 Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg October 31, 1517. But that is not the sole act of the Reformation, nor is Dr. Martin Luther the sole actor.

For there is a heritage and history of discovery that in God's grace, and only through God's grace, we are set right with God by the death and resurrection of Jesus. We can do nothing but receive God's reconciliation and grace. We come to faith only by the work of the Holy Spirit. But is the Reformation dead and buried? Is it an act of history barely remembered only once a year when we change the color of the paraments and vestments? Is our church merely a remembrance of the good old days? Or is there something more?

The fundamental premise of our life in faith is that the Gospel of Jesus Christ has given us the saving act of our lives in Jesus' death and resurrection. We are gathered as brothers and sisters in faith into the Body of Christ: that is the church catholic. It calls us into fellowship with one another around the Word and Sacraments. It calls us into service in the Holy Name of Jesus. It gives us the gifts of joy, peace and love that can only come through Jesus Christ. It is the church as the gathered Body of the Risen Christ (not the building), that makes the bold proclamation to the world of the saving event in Jesus. What does it mean to take a further step in faith and life as a Lutheran – an heir of the Reformation? What does that mean for the people of Joy Lutheran Church, Palm Bay, who seek to discern where God is calling them to be in these next years, in the transition from a long-term pastorate to the calling of a new pastor?

We believe and we teach that the Reformation continues on in our struggle to be faithful to God's commands to live our faith daily in the Name of Jesus. The Reformation struggle continues in the questions of our identity as a church body in our community, in our nation. Why is being a Lutheran important for the Palm Bay community, let alone the western section of Brevard County and beyond? The true spirit of the Reformation is based on the conviction that it is God's love and forgiveness that overwhelms all that we are and offers us a new vision of what we can do in His Name. Reformation Day is a chance for us to see again, in renewal, the vision and work of the church as the Body of Christ. It is a day for us to recommit to the fundamental understanding of grace alone by faith and our response to God's gift. Make your commitment to God in strength and hope. Come to the Reformation Day liturgy and proclaim the graces of God, that we have been set right with God by the death and resurrection of Jesus the Christ.
