

#### 1 December 2025

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

This is the last time I write these words to you as your interim pastor. My time with you ends December 31. These days seem quite different for me, and for you, as the parish. We have a wide range of conflicting feelings this December 1 as we try to look forward to the celebration of the birth of the Christ child. There are so many issues and things that draw our attention away from these days of preparation. The parish has the uneasy feeling of once again moving into transition and change again after a different level of change and transition in September 2024. So many changes at so many levels. And yet, whether we like it or not, Christmas is coming.

There is the change based on issues and issues in our society, our choices in the electoral process, decisions of the church in all its levels that manage to incite some sector of our faith communities. Some of us face issues that come as a part of the life cycles in decisions about our health, the health of a loved one, choices (or lack of choices) in vocation. We face fears in challenges in the world in the concentric circles of violence and destructions in actions that ripple across our nation, across the whole world, no matter where they start. And the people suffer and we want to do something. Yet we feel overwhelmed by it all. And yet, whether we like it or not, Christmas is coming.

The work of Christmas begins:

To find the lost, to heal the broken,

To feed the hungry, to release the prisoner,

To rebuild nations, to bring peace among the people

To make music in the heart.

St. Luke tells the story of the birth of this king. The angel said to Mary that the child to be born of her will be named Jesus, Savior, and that to his reign of peace, there will be no end. This celebration of the Nativity of Our Lord – Christmas, is a beacon of hope. That does not change. In what we celebrate on that day we profess our belief that there is a purpose and a direction and a conclusion to the human story – and to our life story. And that hope, that promise made real in the Christ child, is what enables us to make music in the heart.

We profess our belief that the Son of God came into our world, and because of this, there is always at work the power of God to transform our world into his kingdom of justice, peace, and love. That does not change. This power will ultimately triumph. With that music in our hearts, we can begin the work of Christmas:

To find the lost, to heal the broken,

To feed the hungry, to release the prisoner,

To rebuild nations, to bring peace among the people

To make music in the heart.

My prayer for you for this Christmas and this new year to come, is that we cling to that which is unchangeable. By the grace of God, we move forward, to make music in the heart.

To all of you and yours, A Blessed Christmas and a Healthy New Year 2026!

# EVANGELISM OUTREACH TIPS FOR INVITING PEOPLE TO CHURCH

WHAT BETTER DAY OF THE YEAR TO INVITE SOMEONE TO COME TO WORSHIP THAN IN THE ADVENT - CHRISTMAS SEASON! INVITE SOMEONE FOR CHRISTMAS EVE!

On one of the most powerful days of the year that we proclaim the essential truth of God's claim on our lives, put your faith in action by making the invitation. Just tell them, "come and see."

- **1. Pray about your inviting** The Holy Spirit wants to work through you, to help others come to church, to hear the good news. Ask the Spirit's help through prayer as you reach out to someone else.
- **2. Invite someone you know** A number of surveys show that a majority of people first come to church because a friend invited them. When you invite someone, it is not only personal; it is also the most effective invitation.
- 3. Invite people to worship with you Non-churched visitors will attend our services more readily if you are there to worship with them. More than once, people have said that they would like to visit services, but do not know anyone. Arrange to bring them or meet them at church and sit with them. Being with visitors for the first time also gives you an opportunity to help them with worship practices we may take for granted.
- **4. Invite persons to special services** Special worship occasions are also times when people may be open to an invitation. Natural opportunities to invite visitors are Christmas, Easter and when Sunday School or Preschool students participate.
- **5. Invite people who do not have a church home** While our congregation is happy to have visitors from other churches, our reaching out is aimed at non-churched persons. Our parish family in not seeking to steal members from other congregations. Instead, our congregation treasures opportunities to serve relatives, friends, and associates of our members, who do not have a church to call their own.

The simplest form of evangelism is to say, "come and see." It was what Phillip said to Nathanael in John 1:46. Later in John's gospel, the words "come and see" were on the lips of Jesus himself. We could not have any better example to follow! Inviting your unchurched family, friends, neighbors, co-workers, and other acquaintances with the words "come and see" might even be considered right up there with three other words packed with meaning, "I love you."

#### A NOTE TO TEMPER THE FRANTIC PACE OF THE CHRISTMAS SEASON:

I often think: "a life is like a day; it goes by so fast. If I am so careless with my days, how can I be careful with my life?" I know that somehow I have not fully come to believe that urgent things can wait while I attend to what is truly important. It finally boils down to a question of deep and strong conviction. Once I am truly convinced that preparing the heart is more important than preparing the Christmas tree, I will be a lot less frustrated at the end of a day.
