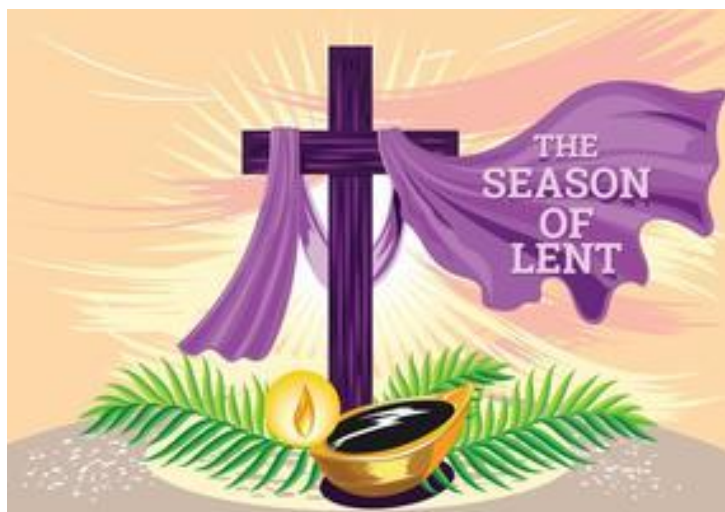

## **Message from Pastor Mary Marcotte**

***And he said to them, "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation."*** Mark 16:15

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, grace and peace to you from God our Father and Jesus Christ the Savior. Amen

We have been talking a lot about outreach, membership, and evangelism lately. Some time ago I came across a devotion that got my attention. It is a story of a little boy in his childlike innocence reaching out to a neighbor in a very ordinary way. The child talks to the neighbor about his faith. Each of us has neighbors who may very well need us to reach out to and share our faith just as this little boy did. Who knows what might happen if we do!

Here is the devotion shared by the Pastor of Abiding Savior Lutheran Church, Mounds View, Minn.

When my son Andrew was a little boy he asked a neighbor, "How come you don't go to church?" She shrugged her shoulders; then he closed the door part way and put his hand over his mouth so I wouldn't hear, "I think you are really lucky that you don't go. All you do is get dressed up, just to sit there!" And with that wonderful invitation to church our neighbor was standing by our van to go with us to church the next Sunday morning. Many weeks later on the way home from church Andrew said to our neighbor, "Can you see Jesus?" She shrugged her shoulders again. He said to her, "I can see him. I can hear him. I can feel him in my heart." Then he called her by name, and went on, "Even if you can't see him, Jesus sees you and he loves you."

Thank you Lord Jesus that you use our most ordinary words to tell the story of your love. Amen.

Lori Embrey has been volunteered to serve as Financial Secretary. We thank Linda Kratzer for her many years of service.

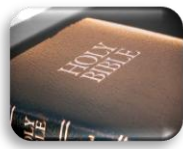

### **Providence Connects Formerly Known as Daily Bread: Hygiene Kits.**

Rachel Circle packed up 25 personal care kits for Daily Bread in January. All contributions are Very Welcome. Health kits are made up of: deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrushes, shaving cream, hair combs and brushes for women & men, razors for men & women, wash cloths, chap stick or lip balm, fingernail clippers or nail file, sunscreen, gallon size zip lock bags, small (individual) hand sanitizer.

**Note:** We continue to make health kits for Providence Connects. The physical facility will be closed but health, food & shower trucks will be available for the homeless. Health kit items are needed.

**Special Thank You to our Girl Scout Troop** meeting at Joy on the 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturdays. The Troop provided abundant items: deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrushes, shaving cream, combs, razors, gallon size zip lock bags, etc. for Daily Bread Shower Truck hygiene kits. It makes a difference to our homeless community.

**Lutheran World Relief (LWR):** Dorcas Circle made 69 quilts for LWR, 25 children's quilts to Salvation Army, and 60 school supplies backpacks. Quilts and school supplies are distributed by LWR all over the world, where most needed. Each quilt or school backpack is a gift of love supporting the health and well-being of our neighbors in need.

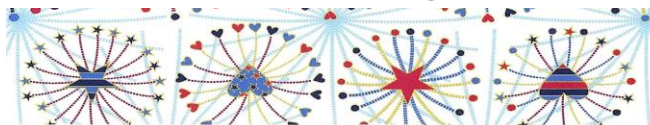
