Synod Assembly 2018 Pastor Bryant's Take

Our 2018 FL-Bahamas Synod Assembly was full of workshops and full of elections to various synodical offices. Some members of assembly encouraged me to be nominated to serve in some office or another, but I graciously declined, saying, "I am too new in this current call to feel ready to take on additional responsibilities. Maybe I'll feel differently in years to come, but for now, sufficient are the needs of JOY Lutheran."

In terms of needs, the FL-Bahamas Synod is in solid financial position; neither too wealthy, nor too poor. We should be mindful that our faithful giving to mission support makes this possible. Congregations should seek to give 10-15% (or more) of their annual budget to mission support which funds so many amazing ministries. Our synod council vice-president gave her report citing a truth, "...part of mission is funding the mission." This is the reality for congregations, missionaries, synods, and the ELCA's Churchwide expressions.

In terms of focus, our synod council vice-president made it clear that we should be proud of, and interested in "the Draft Social Statement on Women and Justice," up for discussion and for potential adoption at Churchwide Assembly 2019. Congregations should be studying this document and offering comments. The period for commentary submission ends in October 2018. (JOY should take some time to review this document and provide commentary before the deadline.) A brochure on the social statement may be provided by Pr. Bryant upon request.

In terms of empowering people for ministry and mission, many offerings were made available by presentations or through the "Connections Café." Programs such as DIAKONIA, presented to JOY on 6/17 by Sr. Michelle Collins, provide education for ministry enabling us to feel prepared and qualified to do God's work. Programs like "Seeds for Haiti," one which our lay voting members, Lee and Barbara Bockelman, thought might be a good fit for JOY point us towards missional ways we can make a huge difference, even with such small things as seeds.

Bp. Suarez offered a faithful report, available via the video link offered below. Bishop did fabulously at point to the "why" that drives us. An excerpt (verbatim) from the bishop's report says,

"As I have been going around listening to our people in the synod, I hear many things. I hear that the two strongest enemies of our congregations are fear and apathy. I also hear that there is an incredible joy when we share what God has done in our lives. I have shared some words from John Vest. He says,

'The why of evangelism is not to attract more people to our worship services and youth programs. It's not to increase our membership. It's not to keep struggling churches alive. It's not to save declining institutions. It's not to justify our jobs. It's not about saving souls from hell. It's not even serving others and working for social justice, as important as these things are. These are all whats and hows.

The why of evangelism is something much deeper. The why of evangelism—the why of everything we do—is the gospel itself.

Before we can ever say what evangelism is and how we ought to do it, we need to have clarity about what we think the gospel is. We have to understand what's at stake in the world and in our lives and how the gospel addresses these needs. We need to be able to articulate why Jesus matters.'

That's why I believe we need to be Grounded in the Gospel. We have had our moments with Jesus, moments when we have felt him for real--his powerful love moving beyond anything we know or understand. That's our ground. That is reason enough to be joyful. We can articulate why Jesus is important to us."

To better prepare us to articulate why Jesus is important to us, continuing education, workshops, and lectures were provided. Often these included a variety of media. God is up to good things in the FL-Bahamas Synod and we, JOY, are a vital part of getting out the word that Jesus is important to us, the Jesus is what it's all about. Thanks for all you do to make God's dream for God's world a reality.

Musical Notes from Pilgrim Journey



Blessings and peace to all our friends at JOY Lutheran Church from all of us in Pilgrim Journey.

"Change is gonna come" by Sam Cooke is a song that comes to mind as I write this. In February 2010 Pilgrim Journey started offering a "rock style" worship service at JOY. We have been blessed to do this these years. Before anyone jumps to any negative conclusions we are NOT quitting. Our plans are to continue to offer you a chance to rock out in God's house. We love the LORD and are always praying for more opportunities to praise and worship Him with our music.

I pray that God will let this be a new time for praise and worship at JOY. I believe it was in early 2015 that Pastor Ludder asked Pilgrim Journey to move the Saturday night worship to Sunday morning. Pilgrim Journey members wanted to keep the Saturday evening service so we did. At that time JOY did not have an organist and the computer automation that we eventually used for worship was not yet fully developed. Pastor Ludder had faith that our band would be good for JOY during a time of transition. I think he was right about that.

That was a time when our "Last Saturday of the month" congregation was also attending on Sunday morning. The "Last Saturday of the month" was intended to be an option for worship (Saturday evening OR Sunday morning). While that did happen for some it really seemed that those who liked the band would attend Saturday night and then worship again on Sunday morning. This is most excellent and we have ALWAYS appreciated those of you who attend and are complimentary to us as well. Thank you if this describes you even once in the last 8 years.

Since we began playing for the 10:00 AM service on the "Last Saturday of the month, and the following Sunday morning" we have been successful and sometimes not so successful in matching everyone's expectations as to how loud a band should be. Fact: Pilgrim Journey is a rock band. Always was. Still is. We do lots of styles in our music; swing, ballad, country, shuffle, reggae and rock. We do lots of variety including hymns, modern and not-so-modern praise music from the late 20th century. Pilgrim Journey is basically a rock quartet with vocalist. That means electric guitar, electric bass, drums, keyboards and a singer. I assure you that compared to other bands (and I include church bands), Pilgrim Journey is not a loud band. That said, "too loud" is always a subjective statement and expresses an opinion of which we all have a right to have.

I hope that all this helps explain when you hear that Pilgrim Journey will be taking a break from playing on Sunday mornings. Steve Weiss will be doing his usual wonderful job on organ and piano and when he is not available a substitute organist will be found. (JOY can also use the computer automation to play the organ and keyboard like was used before Steve came to JOY.)

Worship and Music committee and JOY Church Council are working together to make this change a positive one. Pilgrim Journey will continue to offer a "rockin'" praise and worship service on the last Saturday evening. Acknowledging our identity as a rock band that praises God, we will endeavor to bring you some Holy Spirit lead worship and prayer. If you don't normally attend on the "Last Saturday of the Month" please do come and give us a try. Feel free to wear ear plugs if it helps. No hard feelings.
