Epiphany and the Epiphany Season

Epiphany is on January 6. Epiphany means “to show” or “to make known” and is often called the Gentile Christmas because this is the celebration of when the Magi, who were Gentiles, came to worship Jesus. The Epiphany season continues until the day before Ash Wednesday. The color for most of the season of Epiphany is green. White is used on the Day of Epiphany, on the first Sunday after January 6 when we celebrate the Baptism of Our Lord, and on the last Sunday before Ash Wednesday when we celebrate the Festival of the Transfiguration.

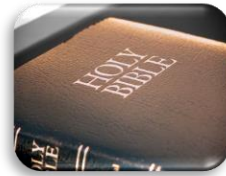


“Eve Circle”

Friends,

The Lord be with you.

Here we are, almost a year to the date, to the anniversary time when God, through JOY, extended me a call to serve with you. It has been a wonderful year, not a perfect year, but a wonderful year.

We've a year behind us and a year before us. And, bless us, some of us create resolutions to mark the change to the new year. If we succeed at these resolutions, we celebrate ourselves, and should we fail, we shame ourselves. It's as if we treat ourselves to a heaping helping of 100% Law, then short-change ourselves on the Gospel.

One pastor asked it this way, "Is the coming of the new year a matter of law or gospel for you?"

If the new year is a fresh start, a new beginning, then the start of the year is "good news." If the new year brings self-disparagement for failure to live into resolutions, then that is "bad news."

Still, shouldn't we take some time to consider what God requires of us?

Do we own our part in challenges and problems?

Have we been attending church?

How is our thought life?

How is our prayer life?

Are we reading and meditating upon God's Word?

These are law questions and the new year is a grand time to ask them.

We each have different answers to these questions, but we all share that our answers will be insufficient, so we note the new year's gospel aspects. To do any less would leave us feeling crummy and accused by the Evil One, despairing and sad.

To this end, in Table Talk, Martin Luther asks, *"What is the believer to do when confronted with the devil's lie?"*

For our answer, Luther turns us to back to Christ, saying,

"I know nothing of any other Christ than he whom the Father gave and who died for me and for my sins, and I know that he is not angry with me, but is kind and gracious to me; for he would not otherwise have had the heart to die for me and for my benefit." (Nebe, Luther As Spiritual Advisor, p. 180-181.)

So, successful resolutions or not, together, with Luther, we "know nothing of any other Christ," and realize that, Christ "is not angry with us, but is kind and gracious to us." As a consequence, 2019 will be another year as God's baptized child, another year when God offers abundant, lavish, boundless grace again and again and again, and another year of God's unmerited forgiveness through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

With such love and grace supporting us, and abundant forgiveness granted us, 2019 is already off to a grand start. Wouldn't you agree?

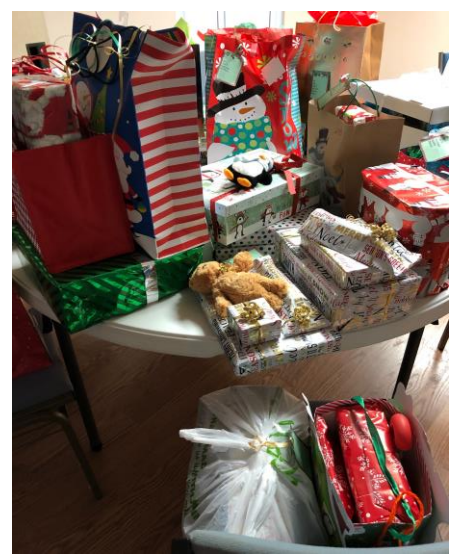

Feeding the hungry and the homeless is an important part of what Daily Bread does, but is not all that they do. Help is offered to individuals – through a comprehensive array of programs and services – to navigate their way to self-sufficiency.

Today, anywhere between 220 – 275 hungry and/or homeless neighbors are provided a warm nutritious meal each day.
