# Rules and Conditions

## Type of Camping

Tent camping ONLY. RV's and large campers are not permitted.

## Check-in and Check-out

Arrival & check-in is no earlier than **1:00 pm on Friday, April 28, 2023**. Please notify Fort Staff of estimated arrival check-in time. It is recommended that group leaders check-in with Fort staff at the Interpretive Center before going to their reserved camping spot.

Departure time is no later than **1:00 pm Sunday, April 30, 2023**.

## Vehicles

All vehicles and trailers must be parked in the designated areas only. Vehicles may not block road traffic at any time.

## Campfires and Stoves

Campfires are allowed in designated areas. Above ground fire grates and stoves are permitted. Every person who starts a fire or who has control of a fire shall ensure the fire is attended and kept under control at all times, and will provide equipment and other resources for building, controlling, and extinguishing the fire.

## Trash

Campers are expected to maintain their camping areas. All trash and debris is to be removed from the campsite to designated trash bins and collection areas at the site prior to departure/check-out.

## Payments, Cancellations, and Refunds

Payments are due upon arrival/check-in *at the absolute latest*. Payments made by check may be mailed to the site or given directly to a member of Fort staff upon arrival/check-in. Payments made by cash may be given, in exact change, to a member of Fort staff *only* upon arrival/check-in. Payments made by debit/credit card or digital wallet will be made online via a SQUARE invoice emailed to the primary contact listed on the camping form. Payment receipts are available upon request.

The deadline for cancellations eligible for a full refund is **Friday, April 21, 2023**. Any cancellations after this date may be eligible for a partial refund. The Apple River Fort SHS will retain a minimum of 10% of the total camping fee as a cancellation fee. Early departures after check-in due to weather, etc. may not be eligible for a refund. Any and all refunds will be issued by check *only* to the primary contact listed on the camping form.

## Prohibitions and General Rules of Conduct

- No climbing, leaning, or pushing on the Fort walls/buildings.
- Do not move furniture, rocks, firewood, or other site property within the Fort itself or elsewhere on site.
- Do not use the Fort for storage of personal items at any time.
- Do not use the Fort's walls/buildings as anchor points or ballast for any tents, awnings, etc.
- No alcoholic beverages or drugs (illegal or controlled substances) are allowed on site.
- No firearms or ammunition are allowed on site.
- No fireworks are allowed on site.
- No open flames are allowed in tents or inside the Fort itself, or near its walls/buildings..
- No pets of any kind are allowed in camp, excluding service animals.
- No person shall remove, damage, or deface any property, including signs, equipment, plants, or trees.
- No person shall abandon any motor vehicles, trailers, or any other camp-related equipment.
- No excavation, treasure hunting, or metal detecting allowed.
- No person shall use abusive or insulting language, nor shout or make excessive noise disturbing to other persons in the area at any time. Campers are expected to be respectful to site staff, fellow campers, and any visitors to the site they may encounter.

- No person shall engage in horseplay or other rowdy or unruly behavior that is disturbing, disruptive, annoying, or unsafe to themselves, others, or the site itself.

Quiet Hours

Quiet hours are from 10:00 pm to 7:00 am.

Restrooms and Potable Water

Portable toilets are conveniently located at the Fort site. Potable water is located at the Fort site, near the main gate of the Fort itself. Showers are not available and not permitted on site. Site water is for washing, drinking, cooking, fire safety, etc. use only; water is *not* to be used for horseplay or other non-utility purposes.

Emergency and Non-Emergency Assistance and Security

**Dial 911 for emergency assistance.** County law enforcement and emergency county organizations have been notified of camping at the Apple River Fort SHS during the US Grant Pilgrimage weekend and will respond appropriately to emergency calls. Fort Camping Support Staff will be available for non-emergency assistance.

The Apple River Fort SHS is *not* responsible for any losses, damages, or claims to property of campers that are due to fire, theft, accident, weather, or any other cause. The site and its staff will monitor and provide security to the best of its ability. However, it is the sole and final responsibility that any and all property is properly secured by its owner(s).

This site and its staff reserve the right to refuse service to campers who do not follow the rules and conditions listed here.

## Directions to the Apple River Fort State Historic Site

### **If coming in from the East (Chicago):**

- Head **west on US Route 20** towards Elizabeth / Galena, IL.
- As you enter Elizabeth, IL, **turn right onto East Myrtle Street**, just before Main Street begins.
  - The parking lot for the Apple River Fort Interpretive Center is the next immediate right. You are allowed to park here long term if you wish.
  - We recommend that the troop leader checks in with Fort staff at the Interpretive Center to confirm final reservation details, provide payment, get a map / directions to the troop's campsite, get free trash bags, etc. before proceeding to the campsite.
- Take the **second right turn onto Old Fort Road**, and follow the curve to the left. The road to the Fort runs straight ahead.
- To get to Dawes Road, take a right just before the gate onto Illinois Street, then take the next immediate left onto Dawes Road. This road is paved up to our maintenance building, then turns into a gravel road. There is a gravel lot behind the maintenance building that you may park in.

### **If coming in from the West (Galena / IL Route 84):**

- Head **east on US Route 20** towards Elizabeth, IL.
- As you enter Main Street, go around the sharp right curve. Immediately past Main Street, **turn left onto East Myrtle Street**.
  - The parking lot for the Apple River Fort Interpretive Center is the next immediate right. You are allowed to park here long term if you wish.
  - We recommend that the troop leader checks in with Fort staff at the Interpretive Center to confirm final reservation details, provide payment, get a map / directions to the troop's campsite, get free trash bags, etc. before proceeding to the campsite.
- Take the **second right turn onto Old Fort Road**, and follow the curve to the left. The road to the Fort runs straight ahead.
- To get to Dawes Road, take a right just before the gate onto Illinois Street, then take the next immediate left onto Dawes Road. This road is paved up to our maintenance building, then turns into a gravel road. There is a gravel lot behind the maintenance building that you may park in.
