One and Done – Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), complete the Seminole State Application for Admission, and register/preregister to vote all in one place on Oct 9, 2019 @ 5:30, LBHS Media Center.

NACAC College Fair - Free and open to the public, National College Fairs allow students to interact with admissions representatives from a wide range of postsecondary institutions. Saturday, October 5, from 1-4 pm, at the Orange County Convention Center, 9800 International Drive Orlando, FL. Directions and Parking info at the OCCC website.

ASVAB - This Vocational Aptitude Battery instrument aids students in determining which vocations they are most suited for coupled with their primary interest areas. The ASVAB is free and given at LBHS during the school day on November 14.

Preregistration is necessary in Bldg 5 by the end of October. Listen for announcements.

Meet “early” or “priority” deadlines to improve admission chances and for best financial aid. University of North Florida Priority Admission & Scholarship deadline – Oct 15, Florida State University & University of Florida application deadline – Nov 1, UCF Priority Financial Aid deadline – Dec 1, USF Priority Admission Scholarships deadline – Feb 15

Transcripts

First, how does your college want to receive your transcript? Electronic, Common App, Sendedu, or maybe they don’t need your transcript. Once you know, complete a transcript request form @ Build 5 Counseling Suite. Transcripts can be printed, mailed, faxed, sent electronically, or uploaded to an application platform; never emailed.

Letters of Recommendation

If a letter is required as part of your college/scholarship application, ask your recommenders in person at least two weeks prior to your deadline. Ask if they need additional information about you and provide it promptly.

FAFSA – Free Application for Federal Student Aid www.fafsa.ed.gov

Gateway to all federal financial aid (grants, scholarships, loans, and work study).

You will be able to file a 2020 - 21 FAFSA (that's the year you'll use the money) as early as Oct. 1, 2019.
