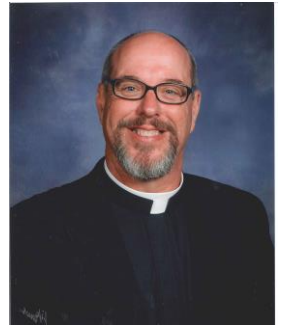

Pastor's Page

In the joint Roman Catholic-Lutheran statement *From Conflict to Communion*, the two churches offer five "ecumenical imperatives." The second reads: Lutherans and Catholics must let themselves continually be transformed by the encounter with each other and by the mutual witness of faith.

Two things strike me about that statement. One is the sharp contrast between that hope, and our antagonistic relationship over 500 years! The other is the high degree of vulnerability that each church brings to such a task.

Over the past 500 years each 'side' has operated on the principle of mutual suspicion. Of, "Well if they think/do/believe that, then it must be wrong!" Absent from such a hermeneutic of suspicion is any true adherence to the Eighth Commandment: "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor." To which Luther adds: "Instead we are to come to their defense, speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the best possible light." (Luther's Small Catechism)



Moving into God's future, the churches agree to be more open to each other. Indeed, not only open to hear, but open to learn from each other, and thereby be changed by each other. Or, as the agreement puts it, to be transformed by the encounter with each other. I cannot think of any greater vulnerability than that: to be open to the other, in a posture of transformation and change. To admit that I do not have all the answers and that I may learn from my former enemy. That the one whom I have been taught to dislike and distrust, may be able to change me for the better; might help me grow.

This is, of course, wonderful! And, it can be just as transformative when individual Christians adopt it as their own attitude of heart. Looking backwards only long enough to see where hate, fear and distrust led to division and the destruction of relationships. Then, to learn to trust again after much prayer, dialog, self-examination, and mutual repentance.

Imagine the transformative possibilities of an Eight Commandment Christian life!

Shoe Box Ministry

Remember this verse when you are filling a shoe box: "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me." Matthew 18:5 (NRSV)

There are 32 shoe boxes sponsored and ready to be filled from Good Shepherd. Have you received yours yet? See Terry or June on Sundays to pick up your shoebox. You may also call them at 527-2706 (Terry Lucente) or 637-1226 (June Dreger-Parsons).

Empty shoe boxes include a guide of what to put in them, when they are due back to the church, and how much is given for the processing fee. Each box requires \$9 to cover the booklet "The Greatest Gift" (narrated by the Apostle John, introducing the Gospel in a simple way, with bright colors and offered in over 77 languages), training for the Ministry Partners in over 100 countries, paying for the training manual for "The Greatest Journey" course and the outreach event when the children receive their shoe boxes. Whew! That covers a lot of assistance, plus includes shipping.

Some of the shoe boxes are delivered by canoe, by camel, or by elephant to the remote villages. Come and be a part of this ministry!

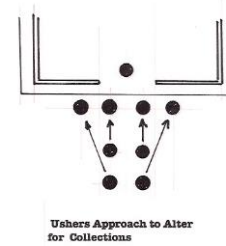


"ATTENTION USHERS"

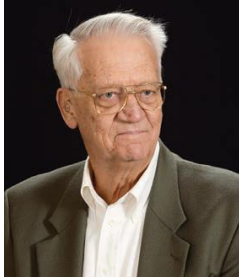

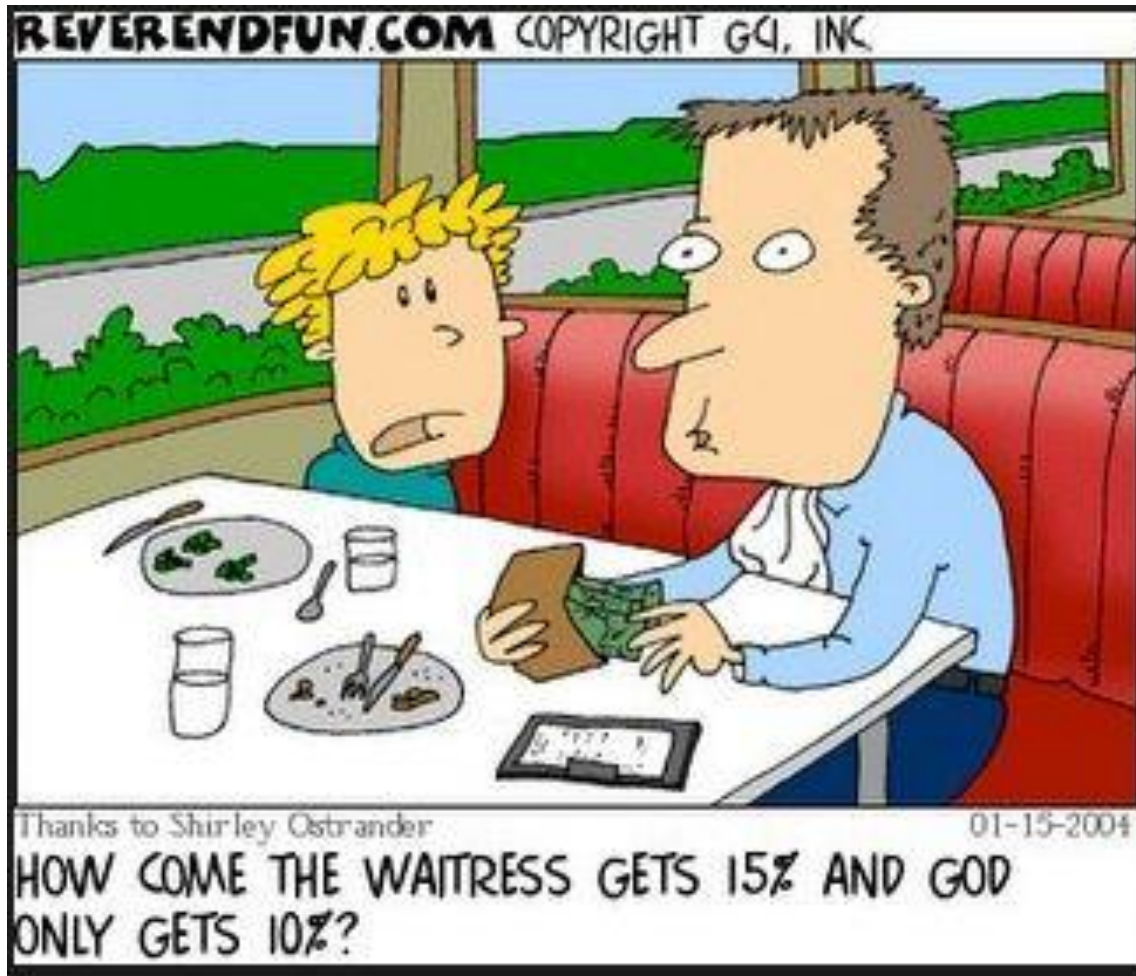

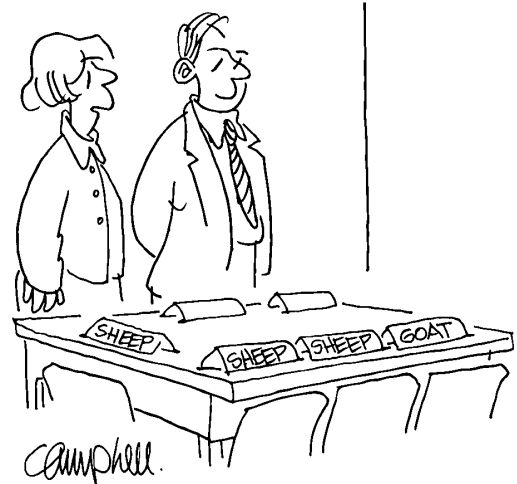
