Pastor's Page

Welcome to the summer season of the year. It has been my experience that now that the seasonal members have returned to their summer homes, many families take time to go to other places in order to visit friends and family, the result is that worship attendance drops and church activities become less a priority. Church programs go into a summer mode. Stuff around the church seems to slow down. But, that is not quite true. I know you have heard this before, but I need to say it again. Even if we go on vacation, God, Church, Worship, and the Grace of God do not. Mission and Ministry still take place. The Holy Spirit works in and through us all the time. I will give you a for instance: SOS will continue to serve those in need on Thursday mornings – hunger does not take a vacation.



I make that point because we, as a congregation, will be having projects this summer. We also have ideas, but need to work on these ideas to bring them to life. This time of year we can do some things we normally would be hard pressed to do. Did you know we are working on putting together an Independence Day Celebration? We are trying to have a meal of smoked ribs and coleslaw. Nothing is final yet, but there are people working on this project. Would you like to help? The more the merrier.

However, before Independence Day comes Vacation Bible School which we share with Hope Lutheran Church in Citrus Springs. Front-line help and behind-the-scene help is needed for the one week in June where kids will learn to Fully Rely On God (FROG!). What an opportunity to share the Good News with those around us!

How about a summer “Beat the Heat” afternoon or evening (once or twice) here at Good Shepherd? Here is a good opportunity to invite friends and neighbors (hint, hint). But, we need people to help in order to bring that opportunity to reality.

Another project we'll look at is helping each other with simple home maintenance tasks -- tasks that some of you cannot do yourself, but others can. For example: changing a lightbulb that requires a ladder, or changing smoke alarm batteries, repairing broken light switches, etc. The goal is to help those in need from paying licensed contractors for minor tasks. Interested in helping?

This summer we will look at the possibility of having a Pumpkin Patch this fall in conjunction with Trunk or Treat and our Hayride. There will be a need for everyone to help. Interested?

Then there is Stephen Ministry. I have had a couple of folks tell me they are Stephen Ministers that served in other places. I have also had folks ask me to explain what Stephen Ministry is and how it works. Stephen Ministry is a ministry that does not replace what I do. It is a ministry to enhance what I do, as the pastor. This ministry is intended to be an extension of what I do. This is a ministry of lay people for lay people. Stephen

Ministry is a ministry that brings hope and healing to hurting people. Those who are Stephen Ministers are well trained and sent to serve "one-on-one" with someone who is hurting in mind, body or spirit, or feeling alone, or all the above. This ministry allows us to do as scripture tells us, "to equip the saints for the work of ministry." (Ephesians 4:12).

Stephen Ministry is not new. It has been with us for a number of years now. There is a chance you may know a Stephen Minister and did not know they were a Stephen Minister. Over 600,000 people have been trained since 1975. There are three congregations, Joy Lutheran Church (Ocala), Hope Lutheran Church (Citrus Springs) and First Presbyterian Church (Inverness) in our area that have an active Stephen Ministry. Although we have a number of Stephen Ministers within our congregation, our congregation is not registered with Stephen Ministry. For them to serve, we need to be registered to be active and we would probably be working with one or more of the congregations mentioned earlier to carry on the ministry. The sale of shirts that our Deacon, Rick Mainster, is working on will help raise money to make this possible. But, we still need help from you.

So, you see the point? In the summer Mission and Ministry still happen. They just happen in different ways. We still need you. I know everyone likes to be asked, personally, to be a part of something. Here I am asking you to be a part of what the Holy Spirit is doing in and through us here at Good Shepherd.

If you have any ideas or suggestions for something we could do, I am all ears! The Holy Spirit works that way, too.

SOS (Serving our Savior) is in dire need of volunteers. Each Thursday we distribute food and personal items to the needy in Citrus County – numbering well over 100 families each week. In April we served 555. Some volunteers are there early in the morning (5am) to set up in the fellowship hall. Others arrive anywhere from that time to 8:30am when we officially open. There are various “stations” manned for distributions and then there are volunteers that push grocery carts down the ramp to assist with the final items that are given out from the coolers and the shed. We officially close at 11am, but sometimes it runs past that time. People are needed in all those areas, but what is **REALLY** needed are those that could assist with a clean-up crew. Once we are closed, the tables need to be

wiped, everything is vacuumed, counters cleaned, tables and chairs rearranged, and the floors mopped. As you can imagine, the ones that have been there since the wee hours are tired – as are the volunteers that have been on their feet since we opened. What you do:


1. Paint your right palm and press it on the back of the right adult glove. Lift to reveal your handprint. Repeat with your left hand and the left glove.
