
# Pastor's Page

appy Independence Day! On the Fourth of July we have picnics, family outings, and fireworks. We have all kinds of commemorations and celebrations. We run around in red, white and blue clothing. We talk about liberty and freedom, enjoying freedom as we know it

outlined in the Bill of Rights. And we chant, USA! USA! USA!

Sometime around July 4 someone will usually ask the question is freedom really free? And we reflect on the fact that we remember that this freedom and liberty that we celebrate in July for the last 243 years cost the lives of people; real people with real hopes and dreams who bled and died.

Did you know this is not new to North America? Freedom and liberty have been dreamed about for centuries. In fact, the Bible uses those two words quite a few times. I have two favorites. In John 8:32 Jesus says, "You will know the truth and the truth will set you free." And the Apostle Paul wrote to the church in Corinth, "Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty." (2 Cor. 3:17)



This freedom and liberty that Jesus and Paul are telling us about describes our relationship to the God we know in and through Jesus. That freedom did have a cost. The cost was the cross of Jesus. Payment was made in blood. As Paul once said, Jesus was killed for our iniquities and raised up for our justification.

Jesus died that we could live in a relationship with God. His death freed us from sin, death and the power of the devil. We are no longer slaves to sin. The devil has no more power over us. And death is no longer the final word.

So, we are set free. But free for what? We are free to live! Like Jesus said, "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly." It also means that we have been set free for others. We no longer have to look out for ourselves and our relationship with God. We are not trapped in a vicious cycle of sin and working for our own forgiveness. Jesus has set us free.

I like what the Life Applications Bible Commentary has to say about Jesus, truth and freedom: "Just as the Jews misunderstood what Jesus meant by "the truth shall make you free," people today still take it the wrong way. In fact, this familiar phrase has been used out of context to promote a wide range of freedoms. Universities use it on their seals to promote the value of academic knowledge. Yet around the world people who know academic truths are still in bondage. So Jesus must have had some other kind of truth and freedom in mind. For many, "knowing the truth" means personal autonomy, creativity, and freedom from oppression and ignorance, which they define as mental slavery. But Jesus didn't die to guarantee personal freedoms of expression. The error comes when we think of truth as a concept rather than God, Godself, which was the way Jesus used the term. Jesus clarifies his meaning when he said, "So, if the son sets you free, you will be free

indeed." By interchanging "truth" and "Son", Jesus implied that granting forgiveness is God's work. So Jesus promised freedom from slavery to sin. That freedom begins when we acknowledge our bondage to sin. Only God can free us through his forgiveness . . . Jesus' sacrifice did not free us "to do our own thing," rather Jesus freed us from doing our thing so that we could serve him!"

We are now free to do the work of the Gospel (which means "Good News") and work for others; to let them know that they are set free.

Freedom is not a concept. Freedom is love in action for all people. Thanks be to God!



# **Nominating Committee Report**

It's that time of year again! The Nominating Committee is preparing for Rally Day, August 25. This is the date we will be having the next congregation meeting at GSLC. This is also the date we will be voting for Council officers (Executive Council) and Council members. In seeking nominees for Council officer or Council Member, we are reminded their job is to be the religious leaders of this congregation and they are the decision makers of the "Business of the GSLC."

Let's review what our constitution has to say about these positions. Executive Council members are elected for one year at a time with the ability to serve 4 one-year consecutive terms. All of the members of the Executive Council have indicated a desire to serve a second term. This includes: President: Dan Cashman, Vice President: Bill Mehnert, and Secretary: Gladys Kean. Treasurer: Kathy Swartz is appointed by the Executive Committee. Anyone who wants to run for an office will be added to the ballot. Executive Committee meets once a month, a week prior to the Council meetings. And Executive Committee meets with the Council once a month.

Council members serve two year terms with the ability to serve 2 consecutive terms. The list of council members is: Michael Busler, Eric Hahn, Dick Hildebrandt, Diane Kittleson, Pat Ouwerkerk, Mary Wagner, Randy Wagner, and Jack Wolff. Council meets once a month and these meetings are open to the congregation. Nominees are encouraged to attend a meeting.

For your information Diane Kittleson and her husband, Chuck, moved to Vero Beach and her current successor has been elected by majority vote of the council. Phyllis Powell, at the request of the council, is the current successor. This seat has one year (2020) remaining. The constitution requires a vote by the congregation (at the next congregation meeting) to fill the remaining one-year of the term. Phyllis will be seeking election for the one-year to complete the term.

Eric Hahn completed 2 two-year terms and cannot run again. Dick Hildebrandt completed 2 two-year terms and cannot run again. Jack Wolff completed one two-year term and, as the constitution states, he is eligible to run for a second two-year term.

Nominees are running for the positions available: 3 seats for two-year terms and 1 seat for one-year.

As this article is being written, we have the following nominees for the 3 seats for two-year terms: Shelly Fortin, Jane Isenstead, Ann Neville, Tom Stickler and Jack Wolff.

Let's start with checking in at the 3 day event. We received our official name badges allowing us to enter the room and designating us as voting members of the attendees. Additionally we received red buttons reading: "Heard About VITALITY!" This is a new program introduced to the synod by the Assistants to the Bishop, Pastor Rob Carlson and Pastor Khader El-Yateem. Additionally Pastors Rob and Khader are Directors for Evangelical Mission. Pastor Rob Carlson was the assistant to the bishop who represented the bishop and officiated at our Pastor Dennis' installation in December. 


Create this colorful July 4th craft.

#### What you need:

- Decorated card stock square (5"x 5")
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- 2 one-inch circles of card stock
- Glue
- Pipe cleaner (3 inches)
- Drinking straw

#### What you do:

- 1. Fold the square corner to corner to form an X. Unfold.
- 2. To make spokes, cut the four creases until an inch from the center.
- 3. Punch a hole in the middle of the square, near the tips of each spoke, and in the middle of each circle.
- 4. Fold each spoke toward the center, lining up the holes. Glue in place.
- 5. Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the top of the straw. Thread a circle, the pinwheel, and the remaining circle onto the pipe cleaner.
- 6. Roll the pipe cleaner end into a ball. Then spin!
