

Pastor's Page

Greetings! Well I do not know about you, but I find it appropriate that we should be entering back inside our building on Palm Sunday and just in time for Holy Week and Easter. I am ready to celebrate Easter and the Easter season with all of you this year. I say that because last year we were not able to be in our building and celebrate the Resurrection as a faith community.

This last year was full of bumps along the way because we needed to be faithful and at the same time keep the health and safety of everyone in mind as we went about being the Church. It has been pretty clear to me that the Holy Spirit has been moving with us along the way. Just think of all the blessings you have received. Many of you did not rely on the internet, or email. Many of you had never heard of Zoom, YouTube or Facebook Live until we were forced to find alternative ways to meet together. Remember when the word "zoom" was a word used to describe the excessive speed of cars and jet aircraft? Now, it is a way to communicate.



I hope and pray that the worst of the pandemic is now behind us. There are, and will continue to be, restrictions around us for the coming months. We cannot fully open yet. It is still not completely safe to gather in crowds. Our kitchen is not open for coffee hour. We still need to wear masks in public. Nursing home/rehabilitation Centers severely restrict visitation, hospitals have restrictions on visitation, and we still must observe social distancing. The restrictions due to the pandemic have made hospital visitation very difficult, and with the privacy laws that are in place, it is almost impossible to find out if someone is in the hospital. Which brings to mind one thing I need everyone to know. Hospitals and Nursing homes/rehabilitation facilities do not notify the church if you are a patient. They are not allowed to do so due to patient confidentiality (HIPAA) laws. Did you know ... that any employee of those facilities who releases any person's information without the patient's express consent is subject to immediate dismissal and fines? The hospital cannot tell us if you are (or were) a patient in the hospital! Here is a for instance - If you are at Bayfront Health Seven Rivers and you encounter Linda (my wife who is an employee), she cannot, and will not, tell me that she saw or spoke with you unless you gave her permission to do so.

The way the laws are written it is up to you to let us know your situation. I say this because we have had a couple of occasions when a member of the church was hospitalized and was upset that we did not contact or visit them. We simply did not know. And, I will be perfectly honest with you; I failed (miserably) the mind reading class offered at the seminary☺. If you do not tell us, we will not know.

As we move on into the future, I am looking forward to seeing where the Holy Spirit is leading us in spite of the challenges ahead. The Resurrection was about new beginnings and new directions. There are still events and situations for which we will have to follow the Spirit as we figure this all out. Where do we go from here? Maybe we follow the Holy Spirit to a new, and sometimes different, direction.

The Spring Gathering of the Women of the Pinelands Conference was held at St. Timothy Lutheran Church on Saturday, March 6. Sallie Haley welcomed the eleven women who attended in person and the seventeen who attended on Zoom. Pastor Joanie Holden set the theme of our morning together with a devotion "Using Your 'You-ness'." God has created each of us with a unique purpose and given us unique gifts to fulfill that purpose. Conference president, Sallie Haley, chaired the business meeting. Information was shared about the Fall Gathering at Lake Yale, and the importance of registering early. The current conference officers were re-elected for one more year. Laurie Nelson installed Sarah (Sallie) Haley as president, Shelly Fortin as vice president, and Jeannette Robertson as secretary/treasurer. Continuing the theme of "Using Your 'You-ness'," Shelly Fortin's Bible study led us through a spiritual gifts assessment to help us discover our own gifts. She shared Bible verses referring to specific gifts and gave examples of how to apply them to fulfill our unique purpose.

After a brief stretch, we resumed with a craft. We made origami bookmarks. The short fun break was enjoyed by everyone, both at St. Timothy and at home on Zoom. “. . . if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away . . . everything has become new” (2 Cor. 5:17). Christians should have a different outlook on life, including money and material possessions. They realize that they own

nothing, that everything they have belongs to God, and that they are only managers and stewards of what God has entrusted to them. Because of that, Christians should have a different attitude towards “things.”

That attitude demonstrates itself in many different ways. For example, Christians show mercy and give, in contrast to those who borrow and do not repay (Psalm 37:21). Christians should hold possessions with an open hand, and “refresh” others with their bounty (Proverbs 11:24-25). They are honest and demonstrate their faith by their work and integrity (1 Thes. 4:11-12). They give to those in need and thereby demonstrate to a watching world the love of God (1 John 3:17).

When this kind of lifestyle is present in our lives, Jesus said that people will see our good works — our different attitude and perspective — and will glorify our heavenly Father (Matt. 5:16). And as we seek his kingdom first and foremost, we have his promise that he will provide what we need (Matt. 6:33).

As others observe you and your lifestyle, do they see any difference because of your faith in the Lord Jesus Christ? Is your view of money different from a person who is not a Christian?

As others observe your relationship to “things,” especially to money, do they realize you are a manager, a steward, and not an owner? Can people watching you tell you are a Christian by how you use your money?

Is the manner in which you handle money and material possessions a testimony to your faith in Christ? Can you honestly say you are seeking first God’s kingdom?



SUNRISE SURPRISE

The hidden surprise in these sweet rolls hints at the reason behind Easter's joy.

What you need:

- ½ cup chopped pecans
- 10 uncooked frozen rolls, thawed
- 10 large marshmallows
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- ½ cup melted butter
- ¼ cup brown sugar
- Adult help

What you do:

1. Grease a round baking dish. Sprinkle pecans on the bottom.
2. Flatten each roll. Place a marshmallow in the center, wrap dough around it and pinch edges together.
3. Combine sugar and cinnamon. Dip each roll into melted butter and coat with cinnamon-sugar. Place in pan, seam side down.
4. Sprinkle brown sugar and remaining butter over rolls. Cover with plastic wrap and let rise 30 minutes.
5. Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, about 30 minutes. Cool in pan.
6. As you bite into a roll, you'll see the marshmallow has melted, leaving an empty center — just like Jesus' empty tomb!


