

Jesus setup the church to be a community of believers that by sharing their gifts and abilities they would carry on his mission of sharing the grace of God with all people. According to John, chapter 15, Jesus said:

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

I could go into a very detailed "lecture" on the above passage, but I will keep this short and to the point. This month my article is a flat out call for help. We have written it before and we have asked. Now, I am flat out pleading for help. We are emerging from the pandemic and we need help with many programs in the

Now, they continue to go above and beyond the call of duty keeping this congregation going for all of us. And now, they need help. Now that we are working to get back to where we were a couple of years ago, we need your help. This congregation, as a volunteer organization, cannot operate without volunteers. Where can you "bear fruit"?

I know. I have heard it. "I am retired and I am too old". "I have done that before, I do not want to do that anymore". The other side is that Bob, Rick, and Shirley are tired. They are pushed to the limits. They cannot do anymore. Everyone can be a part. Deacon's Corner



Greetings Church family,

In the blink of an eye, we celebrated Advent, the birth of Our Lord Jesus, and now Epiphany. Ash Wednesday is close behind and the church calendar date is February 22nd, where we are reminded of our mortality. We receive ashes as the Pastor/Deacon speaks: "Dust you come and dust you shall return". At this point we are then into the Lenten Season. So, what is Lent? What does it do to us or for us?

Let's start with Ash Wednesday. The ashes remind people of their sinfulness, and of our mortality. "Since ancient times, God's people have used ashes as a sign of humble repentance (e.g. Jonah 3:5-9; Job 42:6; Daniel 9:3: Matthew 11:21; Luke 10:13)." When one willingly goes up to a pastor and receives ashes on his/her forehead, they are admitting that they are sinners in desperate need of salvation. They are admitting that they have sinned not only against their neighbors, but against God Himself. The ashes demonstrate that without God, all people are spiritually dead. The ashes remind the wearer of their need to repent and confess to be turned back to God. The ashes demonstrate our pleading that the Lord would purify us. The ashes serve as a tangible and visible sign of our failure to love God as much as He loves us. God said to Adam, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Ashes also tell us the good news of the Gospel! You see, ashes aren't just smeared on your forehead. The ashes are given in the shape of the cross. In receiving the ashes, we remember that our Lord Jesus took all our sins. He who was sinless became sin. Jesus was crucified on a piece of wood. The Cross. He was crucified for us. He descended to the dead on our behalf. Then Jesus conquered death through His resurrection. He has taken the ashes of our past and created in us new life, allowing us to live forever in the holy presence of God! He has redeemed His children, making us clean and new. Through the cross of Christ, the power of death has been destroyed. Through the cross there is life.

Remember, Lent is not about giving up something. Lent is for us to remember what Jesus gave to us. Every day when we take a breath we must thank and honor The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit for everlasting life in Heaven.





Applying Bible Principles

Deuteronomy 3 records an interesting event in the life of God's man, Moses. Because Moses had sinned in numbering the people when God had specifically directed him not to, he was not permitted to enter the Promised Land.

With that fact already known to Moses, God told him,

Go up to the top of Pisgah and look west and north and south and east. Look at the land with your own eyes, since you are not going to cross this Jordan.

But commission Joshua, and encourage and strengthen him, for he will lead this people across and will cause them to inherit the land that you will see.

So Moses was given a most difficult assignment. He was to commission his successor, Joshua, the one who would lead the people into the Promised Land. And if that were not difficult enough, God told him to "encourage and strengthen" Joshua. Chapter 31 records that Moses did as God had directed and became a tremendous encourager to Joshua.

The need for encouragement was not limited to Joshua. All of us need encouragement. All of us need to be strengthened by other Christians.

"Now may our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who loved us and through grace gave us eternal comfort and good hope, comfort your hearts and strengthen them in every good work and word" (2 Thessalonians 2:16-17).

According to these verses, God gave us eternal encouragement. By definition, if it is "eternal," this encouragement will last forever. At first glance, this encouragement would appear to be sufficient. If God gives encouragement, and if this encouragement never ends, what more could we want?

In several passages in the New Testament, the Apostle Paul ... writing under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit ... indicates that we are to encourage other Christians. Just as Paul sent Timothy on several occasions to encourage believers at Ephesus, Colossi and Thessalonica, so, too, the Lord sends us as ambassadors to encourage other Christians.

Wow ... that sounds great, doesn't it? But how do we do that? How do we fulfill our God-given role as encouragers? Probably the best way is to ask God to give us opportunities to encourage others and then to earnestly look for those opportunities to materialize.

In his book, *Another Chance*, Dean Merrill tells about a man who was ousted from his profession. He took work as a hod carrier simply to put bread on his family's table. He was suddenly plunged into a drastically different world. Instead of going to an office each day, he was hauling loads of concrete block to the fifth level of a construction site. Instead of a

nice suit, white shirt and tie, his attire had changed to jeans, boots and a T-shirt. Gone was the piped-in music in the corridors; now he had to endure blaring boom boxes. The language was course. Worse still, as the new man on the project, he was the butt of all the jokes and subjected to endless taunts, put-downs and devastating rudeness.

Near the end of the third week, he felt he couldn't take any more. "I'll work until lunch time," he told himself, "and that's it. I'm going home." Shortly before noon, the foreman came around with paychecks. As he handed this man his envelope, he made his first civil comment to him in three weeks. "Hey, there's a woman working in the front office who knows you. Says she takes care of your kids sometimes." "Who?" The foreman named the woman who sometimes helped in the nursery of the church where the man and his family worshipped. The foreman then went on passing out checks.

When the hod carrier opened his envelope, along with his check, he found a handwritten note from this woman who happened to be the payroll clerk. It read, "When one part of the body of Christ suffers, we all suffer with it. Just wanted you to know that I'm praying for you these days."

He stared at the note, astonished at God's timing. He hadn't even known the woman worked for this company. Here, at his lowest hour, by God's grace, she had given him the encouragement to press on.

That's such a little thing, isn't it? Yet, it's the little things in life that usually make a big difference in the lives of people. if you want to do an interesting word study someday, look up in the Bible all of the places and ways in which the word "encourage" is used. You'll discover how very vital it is for us to encourage one another!

William Arthur Ward summed it up this way:

Flatter me, and I may not believe you.

Criticize me, and I may not like you.

Ignore me, and I may not forgive you.

Encourage me, and I will not forget you.

Do you want to be remembered as one who made a difference in the kingdom of God? Be an encourager. In doing so, you may make a greater difference than you might ever realize.


