





Applying Bible Principles

Mention the word "discipline" and some folks get nervous. Why? Because generally, ours is an undisciplined age. With some rare and noticeable exceptions, society as a whole has become accustomed to not adhering to a disciplined lifestyle.

And that's true in the spiritual realm as well. For many, spiritual discipline means legalism and putting ourselves back under the Law with all kinds of rules and regulations. But as R. Kent Hughes points out,

...nothing could be further from the truth if you understand what discipline and legalism are. The difference is one of motivation: legalism is self-centered; discipline is God-centered. The legalistic heart says, "I will do this thing to gain merit with God." The disciplined heart says, "I will do this thing because I love God and want to please God." There is an infinite difference between the motivation of legalism and discipline. Paul knew this implicitly and fought the legalists bare-knuckled all the way across Asia Minor, never giving an inch. And now he shouts to us, "Train [discipline] yourself to be godly!" If we confuse legalism and discipline, we do so to our soul's peril.

One of the areas in which we need spiritual discipline is in our work and service in the kingdom of God, including here at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. It's far easier to quit than to continue to serve. It's far easier never to serve at all than to respond positively when opportunities for Christian service are presented to us. It's far easier not to get involved than to be actively ministering in Christ's name to others. It's far easier to do nothing than to do something.

But God didn't call Christians to lives of ease, comfort and pleasure. He called us to take up our cross, to deny ourselves, to sacrifice, to be disciplined for the sake of the Gospel. There's nothing wrong with enjoying life to the fullest extent possible. There's nothing wrong with taking time off now and then. Even Jesus admonished His disciples in Mark 6:31 to come aside and rest for a while.

But the greater need for this day and hour is people who will stay at the task, serving the Lord, faithful in their work and service. Will you be one of those?
