

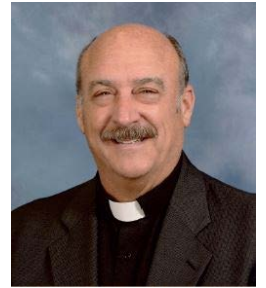
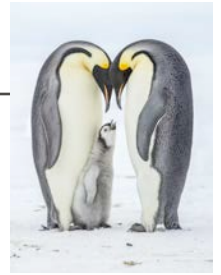

PASTOR'S PAGE



We are now in the season of Epiphany. Epiphany concludes the Christmas season with a celebration of God's Glory revealed to the world in the person of Jesus Christ. As I have told you many times, the word "epiphany" is a Greek word that means that something is "revealed," or that we have a sudden "understanding" or "revelation", hence an "epiphany". Ever had one of those moments when something happened or something was said and it caught your attention and you said to yourself something along these lines, "*Oh, ya. Wow! Now, it makes sense!*" That is Epiphany!

This season begins on the day of Epiphany, January 6th, when the church celebrates the revealing of Jesus as the Messiah, as exemplified by the three gifts of the Magi in Matthew's Gospel: gold, a tribute to a king; frankincense, recalling religious sacrifice; and myrrh, an ointment used for embalming. Presented by emissaries of a foreign religion, these offerings highlight the Gospel's portrayal of Jesus as the Savior of the World.

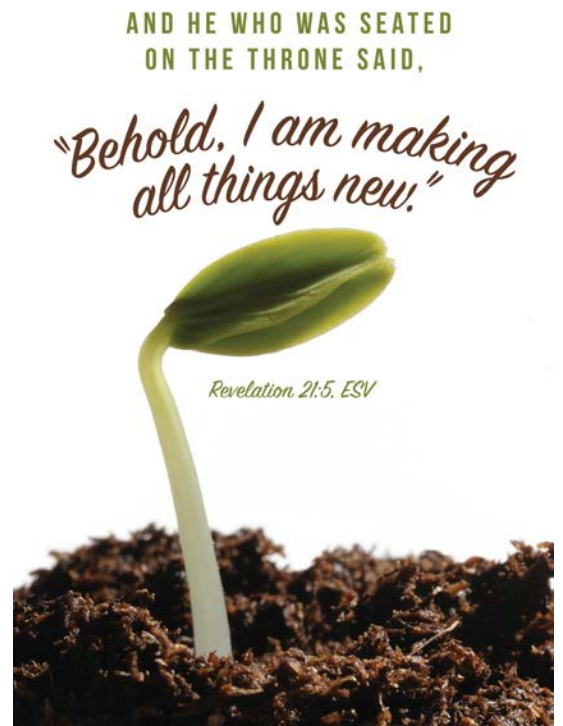
The light of the star that guided the magi to Jesus is telling us that Jesus is the savior of the entire world and is a foreshadow of the great commission given to the disciples to spread the Good News throughout the world. The Apostle Paul in his letter to the Ephesians, reflecting on the words of the prophet Isaiah foretelling of the coming Messiah, tells us that we, too, are "fellow heirs" in God's covenant.



Each Sunday in Epiphany will continue the theme of “revelation”. Maybe we are being prompted to consider “where have you seen God at work in your life?” Each Sunday (there are six Sundays in Epiphany), we will hear how an aspect of Jesus’s identity, power, and purpose is being made known. As we learn who Jesus is, we also learn who we are as his followers. During this season I have a suggestion for you. After you hear the story on one of these Sundays in Epiphany, try completing this sentence: “*Because Jesus is _____, I am _____.*” Let’s all see what is/has been revealed to each of us.

By the way, have you ever noticed the sign over the door into the fellowship hall that says, “20+CMB+23”? It is not a secret code. The words and numbers are asking our God to bless this house in 2023. That is an old tradition in many parts of Europe to write this message over the door at Epiphany. This year the sign will change to read “20+CMB+24”. We will be asking that the Love of God “revealed” in and through Jesus will continue to be “revealed” to us as we continue our role as the Church of Jesus Christ into the year 2024.

Approved the Iglesia Evangelica Tabernaculo de Alabanza request for the use of Fellowship Hall on January 19th for a Movie Night.

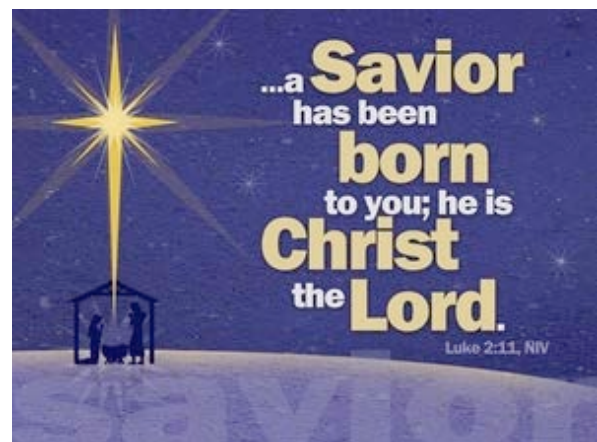
Approved the Iglesia Evangelica Tabernaculo de Alabanza request for new worship times for 2024.

Applying Bible Principles

When he was president of InterVarsity Christian Fellowship, Gordon MacDonald said, “One of the greatest missing teachings in the American church today is the reminder to men and women that nothing we have belongs to us.”

We own nothing. We have been given material means to use, but not to own. All that we have belongs to God. God is our Source according to Psalm 62:5. We are only managers and stewards of what God has entrusted to us.

Because all that we have belongs to God, and because He gives us the ability to obtain wealth, every spending decision is in reality a spiritual decision. According to First Corinthians 10:31, our constant goal must be to glorify God in all of life, including how we use His resources.

Stephen Olford wrote this: “. . . man’s chief end is ‘to glorify God and to enjoy Him forever.’ We are to glorify God by our worshipful praise (Psalm 50:23). We are to glorify Him by our consistent fruitbearing (John 15:8). We are to glorify Him by our spiritual unity (Rom. 15:6). We are to glorify Him by our entire dedication (1 Cor. 6:20). And we are to glorify Him by our good works (Matt. 5:16). In this last category is included the matter of giving. Only in this way can we provide for ‘honest things in the sight of the Lord.’ The glory of God should motivate us to give and to give our best.”

If our goals and ambitions are truly set on spiritual things, if our emphasis in life is to glorify God, we will use the funds He has “loaned” to us on a temporary basis to glorify Him. We will put His money and possessions to good use by giving to His work and by storing up “treasures in heaven” (Matt. 6:19-21).

In *Run with the Horses*, Eugene Peterson tells how he saw a family of birds teaching their young to fly. Three young swallows were perched on a dead branch that stretched out over a lake.

One adult swallow got alongside the chicks and started shoving them out toward the end of the branch. The end one fell off. Somewhere between the branch and the water four feet below, the wings started working, and the fledgling was off on his own. Then the second one.

The third was not to be bullied. At the last possible moment, his grip on the branch loosened just enough so that he swung downward, then tightened

again, bulldog tenacious. The parent was without sentiment. He pecked at the desperately clinging talons until it was more painful for the poor chick to hang on than risk the insecurities of flying. The grip was released, and the inexperienced wings began pumping. The mature swallow knew what the chick did not — that it would fly, that there was no danger in making it do what it was perfectly designed to do.

Birds have feet and can walk. Birds have talons and can grasp a branch securely. But flying is their characteristic action, and not until they fly are they living at their best, gracefully and beautifully.

Giving is what we do best. It is the air into which we were born. It is the action that was designed into us before our birth. Some of us try desperately to hold on to ourselves, to live for ourselves. We look so bedraggled and pathetic doing it, hanging on to the dead branch of a bank account for dear life, afraid to risk ourselves on the untried wings of giving. We don't think we can live generously because we have never tried. But the sooner we start, the better, for we are going to have to give up our lives finally, and the longer we wait, the less time we have for the soaring and swooping life of grace.

There are two key questions to be asked concerning money and possessions: First, are you glorifying God in how you are using the money and possessions God has entrusted to you? And second, are you viewing these things as yours or as God's?

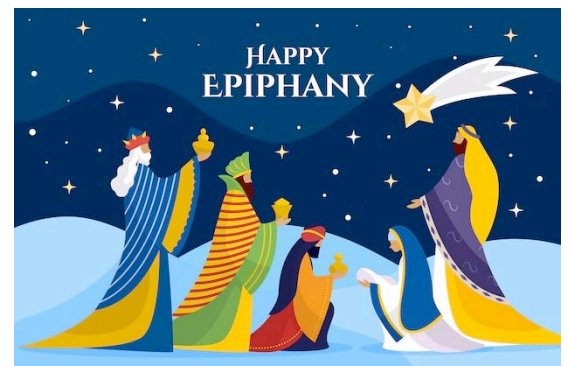

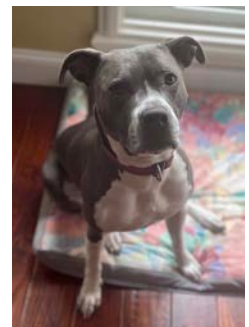
