## PASTOR'S PAGE

Greetings to all in the name of our risen Lord, Jesus!

Ordinarily at this time of the year I would be writing about Jesus and the Resurrection and the life that we have in Jesus. However, an issue has evolved that I feel needs to be addressed immediately. That issue is regarding Bob's and Rick's internships. There are a few rumors, some false information, and a couple of misunderstandings that are circulating around the congregation. So, I am laying out the facts for all to read. The first thing that needs to be pointed out is that the Holy Spirit is at work in our congregation. Sometimes the Spirit works in mysterious ways and one of those mysterious ways is happening amongst us right now.

As you may already know, Bob Bonomo and Rick Mainster have been seminary students for several years. They are both very close to achieving their goal of seminary graduation and ordination. However, there is one big requirement left that they (both) need to fulfill. That requirement is an internship in a congregation. Internship is an ELCA and a Seminary requirement for ordination in the ELCA. Internships last anywhere from nine to twelve months.

Interns are placed by the local synods in conjunction with an ELCA seminary. In the case of Bob and Rick, that seminary is Luther Seminary, located in St. Paul, Minnesota. Luther is one of our 8 ELCA seminaries. Bob and Rick were placed/ assigned an internship site by the Florida- Bahamas Synod in conjunction with Luther Seminary. Bob was assigned to Joy Lutheran Church located in Ocala and Rick was assigned to Rock of Ages Lutheran Church, located in Wildwood, and Good Shepherd. He is <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> time at Rock of Ages and <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> time at Good Shepherd. We (as a congregation) have little to no say in this matter. We can request an intern, but that is all that we can do – make a request. We are not part of the decision process when it comes to assigning an intern to an internship site.

It is standard practice to send an intern to another congregation that is not their home congregation. For instance, I was a member of a congregation in the Pittsburgh area, but I was sent to serve as an intern in a congregation in Columbus, Ohio. Only under extreme circumstances is an intern permitted to serve their home congregation. This is not a new practice. It has been this way for decades.

With that information in mind, earlier this year, there was some difficulty assigning Bob and Rick to an internship site. Both gentlemen need to stay in the area and serve a congregation in a relatively close location. There were no other congregations within a 50 miles radius that would consider hosting an intern. A letter was written to the Florida-Bahamas Synod Office by the leaders of this congregation requesting that Bob and Rick be allowed to intern here at Good Shepherd. Then things began to change for the betterment of Bob and Rick. The Holy Spirit as work maybe?

The Florida-Bahamas Synod knew there was difficulty with placement and worked behind the scenes to find a way to put both Bob and Rick in an internship site. In order to help Bob and Rick with internship site placement, the Florida-Bahamas Synod Council, at their last meeting, put together a special fund to help congregations fund an internship. Then Joy in Ocala contacted the Synod Office and personally invited Bob to serve their congregation. That is why he is now at Joy in Ocala. Bob (contrary to popular belief) was not "fired" from Good Shepherd and he was not asked to leave. The other rumor that I have heard is that Bob was "pushed out" of Good Shepherd because Rick has stayed at Good Shepherd and there is only room for one intern. This is completely false – don't listen to this rumor!

Here is the reason that Rick is at Good Shepherd. There was no place that could "afford" to have him serve as an intern, even with the funding from the Florida-Bahamas Synod. Rock of Ages was willing to invite him to serve at that location, but they could not afford the full salary (even with the synod's funding) that is required for a congregation to have an intern. Their pastor is willing to serve as Rick's internship supervisor full-time and have him serve <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> time. Since our leaders offered to have Rick stay at Good Shepherd, we were asked to provide Rick the other <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of time to serve Good Shepherd. This is a very unlikely scenario and only happened because we requested this. So, Rick will be with us 3 out of 4 Sundays each month and will be serving at

Rock of Ages one or two days a week. Rick, as an intern is a full-time staff member of both Good Shepherd and Rock of Ages. He can do everything that I do with the exception of presiding at Communion.

In the meantime, both gentlemen are still members of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church and they will be coming back to Good Shepherd when their internships are completed. At this point, they will then be available for a call to serve as Pastor in the ELCA.

I certainly hope this clears up the misunderstandings and puts the false rumors to an end. If you have any questions, please do not assume or spread false information. I will be more than happy to discuss this further.

Now I have one more request for all of you. We need to put together a group of 2-4 people who will work with Rick to serve as his advisory group. There are certain requirements that need to be fulfilled by Rick and the group will be working with him to advise him along the way in order to fulfill those requirements. Since we are doing this in conjunction with Rock of Ages, they too, will have 2-4 of their congregation as part of this overall group. If you are interested, please let me know ASAP. In the meantime let's see where the Holy Spirit continues to lead us.

### **Applying Bible Principles**

Let's play an old game called "Let's Pretend." Let's pretend that we are poor, dirt poor, as poor as proverbial church mice. Suddenly, without warning, a financier crosses our path and makes a startling announcement. Today, the financier is creating a special bank account for us. Starting tomorrow and continuing every day for the rest of our lives, each morning he will deposit into our account \$86,400 that is ours to use as we like.

There's only one catch. Every day, whatever we do not use will be lost at the end of the day. No balance can be carried forward in this account. Given that prospect, each of us would no doubt draw out every cent every day.

Dr. R. G. Lee, a pastor in Memphis, wrote:

Well, you have such a bank, and its name is "Time." Every morning, it credits you with 86,400 seconds. Every night it rules off — as lost — whatever of this you have failed to invest to good purpose. It carries no balances. It allows no overdrafts. Each day, the bank named "Time" opens a new account with you. Each night it burns the records of the day. If you fail to use the day's deposits, the loss is yours.

God entrusts to each of us 86,400 seconds seven days a week, 365 days a year. How we use this resource is up to us. We can waste those seconds, minutes and hours in pursuit of things that don't really matter in the light of eternity. Or we can invest them by using as many of them as possible in serving the Lord, especially here at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church.

- 1. How do we value one year? Ask a student who failed a grade.
- 2. How do we value one month? Ask a mother whose baby arrived prematurely.
- 3. How do we value one week? Editors of weekly newspapers know.
- 4. How do we value one hour? Ask someone who lies terminally ill waiting for a loved one who is late.
- 5. How do we value one minute? Ask someone who missed a plane, a train, or a very important engagement that can never be rescheduled.
- 6. How do we value one second? Ask an Olympic medalist, someone who just missed having an accident, or someone saying good-bye to a loved one they will never see again.

Last week you were given 168 hours or 10,080 minutes or 604,800 seconds. How many of each was used in pursuit of your interests and activities? How many were used in seeking first God's kingdom and God's righteousness? In retrospect, what was the real value you placed on the time God gave you? "



Thanks for bringing in the donations of sheets for the back of our quilts.


41 Quilts went to Lutheran world relief for 2024. Our group is sewing quilts making them using new guidelines. (2025)

# Kid's Corner



A flower frog sits atop a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!


#### What you need:

- Air-dry clay
- Roller
- Vase (or jar)
- Plastic knife
- Straw
- Acrylic paint and brushes

#### What you do:

- 1. Roll out a portion of clay to about 1/2-inch thickness.
- 2. Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.)
- 3. To make holes for stems, use a straw to punch out circle shapes. If you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns.
- 4. Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
- 5. When dry, place the frog atop the vase. Arrange flowers and greenery to make a Mother's Day bouquet.


