

Grace and peace to you from God our Savior and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

It is bittersweet for me to be writing my last newsletter article for Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. To be honest, I struggle every month with what I want to say in my articles. Hopefully, over the years you have learned a bit from them, pondered some of what I've said in them, and felt a call to learn more and share your gifts with the congregation and wider community.





#### Florida Bahamas Synod Assembly 2024, Orlando, Florida. Part 1.

May 31, June 1 and 2 was **the 37th Annual FBS Assembly.** In attendance from GSLC were Pastor Dennis Koch, Deacon Bob Bonomo, Deacon Rick Mainster, Mike Busler, Angela Busler and Anne Storan. The Theme for this year's program was **"Who comes up in your Dreams?"** 

At <u>www.fbsynod.org</u> you can obtain the agenda, ministry moments and results of other actions taken. One of the most memorable was the acknowledgement of the **Lutheran Church in St. Augustine that is 165** years old.

I am reporting on the Theme and the Sermons and addresses. At the opening Eucharistic Service, the sermon was given by Rev. Dr. Rafael Malpica Padilla, from Puerto Rico, the keynote speaker of the Assembly. More information about his amazing life is available on-line; to me, most noteworthy, he was ordained as a Bishop at the age of 30. He is the youngest Bishop ever in the ELCA. And that was forty-six years ago. Rev. Rafael began by talking about modern times, modern inventions that are shrinking the world, he termed it "smaller technology", and, in turn, this draws us closer, creating a "tribal community", a "settler-colonial mindset", we are so close that we are threatened and deal with this threat by domination of other "tribes". We are bodies of identity, not thought, because the "tribe" does the thinking for us. All this is the source of divisiveness. Jesus, walking with his Apostles along the water and seeing a boat, he invites them to join him on the boat and "go to the other side"; first, they are overcome by a storm, they survive that, only to reach the other side and find a person "possessed by a legion of spirits." Jesus converses with him and frees him from his "slavery". The crossing of the Sea is symbolic of the tribalism, the division, and "the other side" was unclean, representing "we are in" and "the other side" is out. This story asks, "Who is my neighbor? How do we expand our geographies? Love is an overused word. The Beatles sang "All You Need is Love", Tina Turner sang "What's Love but a Secondhand Emotion?" Love resolves all boundaries; it is stubborn, unwavering, commitment. Thirty years ago, we, the ELCA, established a Mission question: How do I engage the others in Global Dismissiveness? Three ways: 1. Seeking an understanding of "the other". 2.Based on the understanding, build relationship of trust. 3.Leads to peaceful coexistence. This is only possible by a commitment to Jesus; only then can we have an unwavering state of love. Claiming and living in that love has its challenges and confronting risks. A monk in Denmark, prior to his execution by Nazis wrote, "What is our task today? Faith, Hope and Charity? No! It is Recklessness! A Holy Rage! Rage when Justice lays prostrate on the ground! Rage when children are starving! Rage at lies of death! Rage at destruction of Peace! Rage against conformity! In the Church, we symbolize our Faith with a lion, or a lamb, or fish, or a dove. Never do we symbolize the Church with a chameleon!

The Opening Eucharist was co-led by our **Bishop Suarez and The Bishop for the south area of Florida from the Episcopal Church**. As Bishop Suarez said, "This is a big deal, you guys. History is being made! We are overcoming barriers and crossing divisions!"

During the service, Bishop Suarez, installed two assistants to the Bishop of the FBS. One is a Pastor of the Lutheran Church who will cover the Northern part of the Synod. The second, a bilingual Pastor ordained in the Presbyterian Church will cover the Southern part of the Synod.

**After the Service**, the Assembly began as our Bishop Pedro Suarez led us in prayer. He then welcomed us "home" reminding each of us, "The Synod Assembly is the most powerful organization in the Synod."

Bishop Suarez discussed **Full Communion Ministry**. This is the concept of two Churches joining together to worship. **Episcopal Bishop Douglas Sharp**, co-celebrant of the Eucharistic Service was introduced, he is our Ecumenical Partner in Full Communion. Bishop Sharp covers 12 counties. Bishop Sharp stated, "Your Bishop has the responsibility of all 67 counties in Florida plus another Country. So, you win!" Bishop Sharp went on to say he is responsible for nurturing relations between the two dominations. Bishop Sharp talked to us about how solutions are not in new structures, or new committees. He said, "We need to begin with healing the body of Christ". He talked about his commitment to the Oneness of Church. He talked about restoring all people to unity and Oneness in Christ. "People on the outside do not care about "the brand", but about what we do and

how we act. We have an image problem. A survey in America showed 84% believe Jesus is significant in religion. 32% said Christians are arrogant. 30% said Christians are judgmental, 50% said Christians are hypocritical. They like Jesus, but they are not sure about us. Our survey of ourselves showed we consider ourselves as generous, passionate, forgiving and loving. Time to act is now. "Our Oneness is essential to our witness."

**Bishop Suarez's Report for 2024**: The theme for this year's Assembly: **Who comes up in your dreams? Acts 16**. Written by Luke who was a medical doctor. He accompanied Paul who dreamed of a man pleading to come to Macedonia to help. They traveled a great distance by ship, carriage and foot. Once in Macedonia on the Sabbath, they found a group of people who were worshiping. They met Lidia, who was a worshiper of God, and a wealthy dealer in purple cloth. And she invited them into her home. Bishop Suarez said, "What if it was a woman who appeared in Paul's dream". Paul was looking for a place of worship, Lidia listened and opened her heart and was hospitable. Sharing, listening, talking, inviting people to events. Mathew 28 says, "Go therefore to all nations, **all ethnia**, those who are different from us.

The **Community Church of Babcock Ranch** was introduced, and action was taken to welcome new congregation in ELCA. April 14 the membership of CCBC voted unanimously to become a congregation in the ELCA. As the highest level to make decisions for the ELCA, the FBS Assembly added the new church to the roster of ELCA.

Key Address by Rev. Rafael Malpica Padilla. Rev. Padilla (who I will refer to as RMP after this) delivered his address "Who is showing up in your dreams? Mission Engagement in a Time of Intense Uncertainty and Transitions". He quoted Julia Duin's (Washington Post Editorial) "Quitting Church: Why the Faithful are Fleeing and What to Do about It". Church attendance dropped from 31% in 2002 to 18% in 2005. "Un-churched" growing about one million each year. 14% of the population has no religious preference. 78 million Protestants belong to the camp of "no show-up". We are growing older, and the younger are not filling the positions. Noteworthy: migration into the US has helped the Roman Catholic Church fill in their decline. RMP's definitions and a Statement: God's Mission: to restore community. Church: an open and inclusive community of followers of Jesus serving a world in need. "Mission-ology" defines ecclesiology. Relationship of Three Gods in One, RMP calls "One Extreme Relationality". The Story of Genesis of Adam, Eve, Cain and Able and the story of Original Sin, is a sin against our origin. We were created to be One Extreme Relationality and the story of Genesis displays break up of that close relationship.


We meet at 8 AM every Friday to cut grass in the summer. It's about two hours of cutting.

You don't have to visit the beach to make a sandcastle.
Make fluffy "moon sand" to build fun structures.

### What you need:

- Large bowl
- Wooden spoon
- 8 cups flour
- 1 cup baby oil



### What you do:
