Dear Members and Friends in Christ Jesus,

Ready or not, the Fall Season is upon us! After a very hot Summer, I am looking forward to cooler days. School is back in session and the football programs are in full swing everywhere. I do enjoy football as an armchair spectator for the competition and challenge presented by the different teams as well as by individual team members. When the game ends, one team comes off the field a winner and the other as loser.

With this football image in mind, we who are God's people in the Christian Church are also engaged in a contest with the world around us. Every day we either <u>affirm</u> or <u>deny</u> that Jesus Christ is Lord and that He is truly in charge of our lives. St. Paul wrote about this very challenge for believers in his Letter to the Ephesians: *"For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realm" (6:12)* 

As we engage in this battle against the devil and his evil forces in the world, St. Paul counsels: *"Take...the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God". (Ephesians 6:17)* 

As the children of God, we must be armed to fight against the forces of Satan by living according to God's will revealed in God's Word. The Daily Bible reading and Prayer are excellent disciplines in our faith journey. We also need to be strengthened in God's will through our <sup>1</sup>

participation in Worship, Christian education opportunities and service in Jesus' name. This is how we grow in our faith and are strengthened to do the work the Lord calls us to do in our daily lives.

A good beginning for our daily faith contest is to let the Lord rule our every thought and action. Then the Lord Jesus Christ will be the entire focus of our living. *"That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Philippians 2:10).* 

Being a Christian is to "Regularly Work Out" with these spiritual principles which focus our attention and very lives' on God whom is described so powerfully --yet beautifully-- in the hymn "A Mighty Fortress is our God" written by Martin Luther. This is a hymn we Lutherans love to sing on Reformation Sunday (October 27, 2024) and at different times throughout the year:

The old satanic foe, Has sworn to work us woe! With craft and dreadful might

WELCOME to Good Shepherd's annual financial response, during which we respond to God's abundance and generosity and commit to supporting God's work. You'll hear the words abundant, abundant living, etc. throughout this year's response program. Living

abundantly focuses on the abundant resources and opportunities available to us through God's generosity and the creator and ultimate owner of everything. Living a life of abundance means having a surplus of spiritual fulfillment and joy that spills over into the world around you. It does not mean being wealthy and owning a lot of stuff.

Stewardship is about so much more than money, but during annual response 'campaigns' there is often special emphasis on money. Jesus's recorded words in the New Testament include a lot of money talk. Some folks say he taught more about money than anything else, while others say that's incorrect. In any case, the point of much of what Jesus said about money was the need to have the right relationship with money. The best illustration of this is in Matthew 6, the sermon on the mount, where he says: "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven. where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be." Read that last sentence again. Jesus is not saying that where your heart is, there also is your treasure or in other words, your priorities are where you spend your money. No, he is saying that where your money goes, there also go your priorities. This is why the rich man walked away sadly when Jesus told him to sell everything he had and give the money to the poor: he loved his stuff too much to realign his priorities. When we give generously to something, our heart follows. Generous giving to God's church can help lead our hearts to a closer relationship with Jesus. There is no separation of faith and finances like that of church and state; faith affects our giving and our giving affects our faith. Of course, this can happen oppositely. If our first priority is our money or our possessions and we hoard those and give God a bit of what's left over, our relationship with Jesus is bound to suffer.

Even those of us who don't have a lot of material wealth are very rich in comparison to the average citizen of a developing country. Those of us who do have more wealth also have a duty to give more generously of what God has entrusted to us.

Our three areas of focus during this response season can form the sign of the cross. They are 1) **DOWN** - God made all of creation and entrusts us with everything we have. God came to us in Jesus, who came so that we might have abundant life. God also comes to us today through the Holy Spirit. 2) **IN** - We look into ourselves to discern our gifts, material and spiritual, and to see in what ways God has abundantly blessed us. 3) **OUT** – From the abundance we're given, we respond to God's generosity by sharing with others.

**USHERS** Greet you (hopefully with a smile), hand you a Service Program as you enter the Sanctuary.


**USHERS** Assist you if needed, guide you to receive Communion at the rail, or if you choose at your seat.


Use scrap paper to fuel new growth and make a gift that keeps on giving.

#### What you need:

- Scrap paper
- Water
- Herb or flower seeds
- Blender
- Strainer
- Cookie sheet
- Towel
- Adult help

#### What you do:

- 1. Tear the scrap paper into strips and place in a bowl. Cover the paper with water and let it soak overnight.
- 2. Pour the mixture into a blender and blend about 10 seconds.
- 3. Strain and squeeze the paper pulp to remove excess water. Place in a bowl.
- 4. Sprinkle seeds over the pulp and mix to incorporate them into the pulp.
- Shape the pulp into a flat layer on the cookie sheet. Use a towel to soak up excess water. Allow the paper to dry completely.
- 6. Tear paper into shapes or fold into a card. You can plant the paper directly into soil. Water it and then watch your plants grow!
