



Are you ready for Easter? What preparations have you made? Have you bought the traditional "Honey Glazed Ham" yet? How about the new clothes for Easter? How about gifts? After all, society seems to think we should view Easter as another Christmas. Did you get your candy? So many Easter deals!

What is Easter anyway? That is not a question easily answered in the small space of a newsletter article, but here you go. Christians consider Easter to be the "first day". From Easter comes the practice of worshipping on Sunday morning. It is the first day of the week. It is also the "first day" of a whole new creation, sometimes referred to as the "eighth day" of the week, for on it Jesus arose from the dead restoring the image of God in humanity and in so doing also brought restoration and renewal to all of creation. As the Psalmist wrote in Psalm 118:

O give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; his steadfast love endures forever! Let Israel say, His steadfast love endures forever."...

The LORD is my strength and my might; he has become my salvation. There are glad songs of victory in the tents of the righteous: The right hand of the LORD does valiantly; the right hand of the LORD is exalted; the right hand of the LORD does valiantly." I shall not die, but I shall live, and recount the deeds of the LORD. The LORD has punished me severely, but he did not give me over to death.

Open to me the gates of righteousness that I may enter through them, and give thanks to the LORD. This is the gate of the LORD; the righteous shall enter through it.

I thank you that you have answered me and have become my salvation. The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone. This is the LORD's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes. This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.

The Easter season proceeds from and celebrates this brand new "first day". In the resurrected Jesus, there is time after the end, life after death, restoration of what was broken, the brightening of what had gone dark. It is in the Easter season of the Church Year that the Church considers not only redemption in Jesus through his resurrection, not only humanity, but also the restoration of all creation. In the fifty days of Easter, Christian communities around the world strive to worship God in a way that illustrates that the body of Christ lives now in the heavenly places and also in the gathered body in the world. Worship on Sunday is designed to be where heaven and earth meet as all of creation celebrates the redemption of all creation.

So, are you prepared for Easter? I pray that you will be and I pray that I will see you on that glorious day for worship at 8:30 am and 11:00 am to celebrate!

Stewardship is living out our commitment to Christ.

Applying Bible Principles

One promise from the Old Testament that can be readily applied to Christians living in the 21st Century comes from First Samuel 30:24 and goes like this: "For the share of the one who goes down into the battle shall be the same as the share of the one who stays by the baggage; they shall share alike."

How in the world can that promise apply to us? After all, we are not staying by the supplies for someone who is going to battle. Surely in a best-case scenario, that promise is applicable only to folks in the military. Right?

Dr. M. R. DeHaan, founder and teacher of the Radio Bible Class, once said, "Every Scripture has a primary interpretation, and most have a secondary application as well." That's true of First Samuel 30:24.

Although the primary application of this verse was to people in the Old Testament who were involved in battle, there is a much broader group than the military being described here. The secondary application, which applies to us, is this: Those who work behind the scenes will share in the rewards of all that is accomplished just as much as those who are serving God in a way that is more visible.

Yes, there are a select few whose roles here at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church are very visible, such as the pastor, the organist, the ushers, those who head up boards and committees, and Sunday school teachers. But there are many more whose primary work and service are not very visible: the folks who take care of the parking lot, the people who vacuum the carpets and clean the restrooms, those who take out the trash, make coffee on Sunday mornings and prepare meals for shut-ins, those who serve faithfully on boards and committees, those who operate the sound system and count the offerings.

Some of these roles may be so "behind the scenes" that we might not even be aware of who does them. But what's important is that God knows their names. In fact, Hebrews 6:10 describes God's view of such people, including many of you: "For God is not unjust; He will not overlook your work and the love that you showed for His sake in serving the saints, as you still do."

Chuck Swindoll was trying to emphasize the importance of people who might be nameless in the kingdom, men and women who "with silent heroism and faithful diligence, relinquish the limelight and live in the shade of public figures." And then to illustrate his point, he asked several questions:

• Who taught Martin Luther his theology and inspired his translation of the New Testament?

- Who visited with Dwight L. Moody at a shoe store and spoke to him about Christ?
- Who followed Hudson Taylor and gave the China Inland Mission its remarkable vision and direction?

Swindoll concluded,

Had it not been for such unknown persons, a huge chunk of church history would be missing. And a lot of lives would have been untouched...

Because of God's foreknowledge and sovereignty, the decision as to who gets to be seen and who stays behind the scenes is not ours to make. God's sovereignty explains why we know Luther better than Malanchthon, Moody better than Kimball and Taylor rather than Hoste.

What's important is that God knows your name. God knows what you are doing in your "work and the love you have shown Him." God will remember what you have done and are doing in whatever way you are ministering to people here and elsewhere. What's more, God is faithful, and that faithfulness will be demonstrated both in this life and in the life to come.

As you think about your present and future involvement in the life and outreach of our church, remember the promise from First Samuel 30:24, "They shall share alike."

"Jesus Himself evangelized"





Fellowship



We would like give a shout out to our three volunteer painters, Nina Giglio, Bob Deck, and Dennis Moore.




