Dear Members and Friends of Good Shepherd, A Happy and Blessed New Year's 2025!

We know that we've come to a God unlike any other when we hear the beautiful words of Psalm 23. In this beautiful Psalm, the one true God is delighted to reveal himself as a Shepherd who blesses, loves, and protects us. What a great way to begin the New Year 2025!

A king, we can understand. A warrior, we could expect, a counselor, we might anticipate. But a Shepherd? What ancient religion would ever think to boast that its God was a Shepherd and tended sheep? What primitive faith would glory in a deity eager to identify with lambs and ewes? The gods of the ancients were cunning and vindictive beings best symbolized by lions, dragons, and other monsters with powerful claws and fangs.

Yet the one true God reveals himself as a loving Lord in His Son, Jesus Christ (whose birth we just celebrated at Christmas) and identifies himself as our Good Shepherd! 



Fellowship


Our Fellowship Committee meeting will be held on Monday, January 13, 2025, at 1:30 PM. We are asking our committee members to attend if their schedule allows.







What you need:

- · Wooden craft sticks
- Metallic paint (gold and silver)
- Paint brushes
- Jingle bells (gold and silver)
- Hot glue gun
- Metallic ribbon
- Scissors
- Adult help



What you do:

- 1. Paint half the sticks gold and half silver. Let dry.
- 2. Glue three bells to each stick.
