Dear Members and Friends in Christ Jesus,

With September our Autumn schedules begin with an ever-growing number of things on our "to do" list. For some people, it may seem there wasn't even a summer hiatus from all the hustle and bustle of life as our world has become a place of instant demands. In such a world, many people even desire an instant spirituality --- like the sending of an e-mail or text message or preparing an air fryer or microwave dinner that can be done in an instant. When Property started, the basic duties were to cut the grass, replace light bulbs do minor repairs and change the Sanctuary Banners. Now Light the Seven Day candle, hang and steam the banners by the season, change the Paraments on the Altar, check the restrooms that all is working and any repairs that we can do without hiring outside workers. We have a great four-person team but would like some additional help with **special projects** that could use a few more hands. Future projects coming up will be prepping and installing fifty-six acoustic ceiling panels in the Fellowship Hall and replacing thirty-two fluorescent light bulbs with LED bulbs and eliminating the ballasts.

Call Committee



As previously mentioned in our monthly newsletter update, the Call Committee has been making progress on the Mission Site Profile (MSP) paperwork that we are required to submit to the Florida-Bahamas Synod prior to receiving a list of potential candidates. Feeling that we were nearly complete, a draft of the document was submitted to the GSLC Council for review. Members of the Call Committee met with the Church Council at the Council meeting on August 14th, to discuss the profile. The Council and Pastor Bob made some recommendations for the Call Committee to consider as we finalize the document. The Council voted to approve the MSP and for the Call Committee to continue to move forward. By the time the September newsletter is published, the paperwork will be submitted to the Synod.

We aren't done yet... In the time after the submission of the paperwork and as the Synod gathers candidates for us to review, we will be working on how the interview process will work. A quick outline of next major steps:

Call Committee receives a candidate list – which may have one or more names

Call Committee evaluates and determines whether to move forward or not with a candidate on the list.

Call Committee presents candidate to GSLC Council that we believe meets the needs of GSLC, and is a good fit.

Church Council performs their due diligence and upon approval, the candidate will be presented to the congregation for a vote.

Please understand our work going forward will be confidential. We <u>will not</u> be talking about who is on our candidate list, or who we have interviewed or rejected. This is for the benefit of both the candidate and GSLC. If you have questions, please ask a member of the Call Committee or the Council.




