## **AS WE GATHER**

It seems that no December goes by without hearing the song "Mary, Did You Know?" With that seasonal serenade, there is rightful theological reflection that could be had, especially considering what we heard last week with the announcing of the virgin birth from the angel Gabriel. There is no song asking, "Jesus, Did You Know?" Today we ask that question and gain theological insight and answers. We do so by going beyond the Bethlehem birth and learning from Jesus as a twelve-year-old boy in the Jerusalem temple. We ask the question, "When Jesus was a boy, did He know He was God?"

## CREEDAL RESPONSE The Second Article

Pastor:	The season of Advent is a time of expectant waiting and preparation for both the nativity of Christ at Christmas and the return of Christ at His second coming. It is a time of reflection on redemption. Luther's Small Catechism, useful for individual and household learning through questions and answers based on God's unchanging Word, reminds us of Jesus' incarnation into this world, the totality of Christ's complete work, and the redemption He achieved for us. We confess together:
People:	And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.
Pastor: <b>People:</b>	What does this mean? I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me

from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true.

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#### SALUTATION

Pastor:	The Lord be with you.
People:	And also with you.

#### PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

Pastor: Let us pray for the whole people of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs.

Heavenly Father, in this season of Advent, we prepare to celebrate again the coming of Your Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, and await His promised return. As questions enter our minds, such as "Did Jesus know He was God?," we thank You for Your Word of truth, which gives the answers we need to know as we live in this world to which Christ came. By Your Spirit's work through Your Word, enliven our hearts and minds, nourish our faith, and be with us as we wait and watch this season and each day. Let us, like Jesus, be about the things of You, our Father, as we gather in Your house to receive the gifts You freely give through Your Spirit, where heaven has met earth through Your Son. We pray to You, Lord:

#### People: hear our prayer.

Pastor: Heavenly Father, as Your Son took on our human flesh, He remained divine and knew all things. As all things are known to You, only You know all our hurts and struggles, our trials and temptations. Only You can bring comfort and peace to troubled hearts, minds, bodies, and souls in this season and always. Give Your comfort to those who seek our prayers, [*including*...]. Grant healing according to Your will, along with peaceful minds and hopeful hearts. We pray to You, Lord.

#### People: hear our prayer.

Additional petitions may follow.

Pastor: Into Your hands, O Lord, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in Your mercy, through Jesus Christ, our Lord. People: Amen.

## ADVENT COLLECT

Pastor: Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and put on the armor of light, now in the time of this mortal life in which Your Son, Jesus Christ, came to visit us in great humility; that on the Last Day, when He shall come again in glorious majesty to judge both the living and the dead, we may rise to life immortal; through Him who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

#### People: Amen.

#### LORD'S PRAYER Matthew 6:9–13

People: Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven; give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.
