Black-Eyed Susans are one of the most popular wildflowers in North America. This flower, that belongs to the sunflower family, gets its name from the dark brown-purple center around the daisy-like head. This plant can grow to over three feet tall with large leaves. These beautiful yellow flowers attract butterflies, bees, and other insects because of their nectar. They tend to show off all summer long and into early fall, as they usually bloom from June until September.

These hearty flowers love full sun, even though they will grow in partial sun. In most of the U.S., the planting period is from March to May. These yellow lovelies are a great for cut flower for bouquets.
