General Information

The Charlottesville Scholarship Program (CSP) and Grace Tinsley Memorial Scholarship Program offer eligible local residents an opportunity to apply for Charlottesville Promise and Grace Tinsley Scholarships each year by March 1st. Scholarships may be used for tuition, fees, and other educational expenses. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered. Personal statements and answers to essay questions should be the applicant's own work.

Charlottesville Promise Scholarships are renewable awards that can fund up to \$13,000 of the cost of a 2- or 4- year undergraduate degree program, master's degree program, or for a vocational training/professional certification program at an accredited technical school. First-year awards are typically \$2,500. CSP typically awards 9 new scholarships each year to seniors attending Charlottesville High School and residing in the City, 1 potential new scholarship each year to a graduating high school senior residing in the City and attending one of the City's alternative or non-traditional learning centers listed here, and 1 potential additional new scholarship each year to an eligible adult student currently attending or planning to enroll in a post-secondary undergraduate program, master's degree program, or vocational training/professional certification program at an accredited technical school.

PLEASE NOTE: A new Preston Coiner Scholarship will NOT be awarded in 2025. One Preston Coiner award is available in any given year. As the current Preston Coiner Scholar is renewing, a new scholarship will not be awarded in 2025. We expect to be able to award a new renewable Preston Coiner Scholarship in 2028.

PLEASE NOTE: A new Scarpa Arts & Design Scholarship will NOT be awarded in 2025. One new renewable Scarpa Arts & Design Scholarship is offered every other year. This scholarship will be available again in 2026.

Grace Tinsley Scholarships are awarded for a student's first and second years of college. In 2024, first-year awards were \$2,500 and second-year awards were \$1,500. GT typically awards 4 new scholarships each year.

- Low- to Middle-Income City of Charlottesville <u>municipal employees</u>, no matter where they live
- Low- to Middle-Income Charlottesville City <u>School System employees</u>, no matter where they live

Income Eligibility Requirements

The Charlottesville Scholarship Program and the Grace Tinsley Memorial Scholarship Program provide vocational/professional certification, undergraduate, and Master's degree scholarships (Charlottesville Promise only) and undergraduate scholarships (Preston Coiner, Scarpa, and Grace Tinsley only) to low- and moderate-income people in the Charlottesville community who wish to pursue post-secondary education, but who lack the financial resources to do so. To qualify for these need-based scholarships, the applicant's household income must be lower than the maximum income for the applicant's family size, as shown on the guidelines below.
