From the Grand Knight

Brother,



On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII made what was, and remains, only the second ex cathedra (that is, "from the chair" and therefore infallible) statement of the Pontiff and declared the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory."

Historically, this day has been celebrated under various names, including Commemoration, Dormition, Passing, and, of course, Assumption, from at least the fifth or sixth century. Today it is celebrated as a solemnity and a Holy Day of Obligation. Scripture does not give a direct account of Mary's assumption into heaven. Nevertheless, the Apocalypse of John (Revelation 12:1-17) speaks of a woman who is caught up in the battle between good and evil, often referred to as *The Woman and the Dragon*:

¹ A great sign appeared in heaven: a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet and a crown of

twelve stars on her head. ² She was pregnant and cried out in pain as she was about to give birth. ³ Then another sign appeared in heaven: an enormous red dragon with seven heads and ten horns and seven crowns on its heads. ⁴ Its tail swept a third of the stars out of the sky and flung them to the earth. The dragon stood in front of the woman who was about to give birth, so that it might devour her child the moment he was born. ⁵ She gave birth to a son, a male child, who "will rule all the nations with an iron scepter." And her child was snatched up to God and to his throne. ⁶ The woman fled into the wilderness to a place prepared for her by God, where she might be taken care of for 1,260 days. ⁷ Then war broke out in heaven. Michael and his angels fought against the dragon, and the dragon and his angels fought back. ⁸ But he was not strong enough, and they lost their place in heaven. ... ¹³ When the dragon saw that he had been hurled to the earth, he pursued the woman who had given birth to the male child. ¹⁴ The woman was given the two wings of a great eagle, so that she might fly to the place prepared for her in the wilderness, where she would be taken care of for a time, times and half a time, out of the serpent's reach. ¹⁵ Then from his mouth the serpent spewed water like a river, to overtake the woman and sweep her away with the torrent. ¹⁶ But the earth helped the woman by opening its mouth and swallowing the river that the dragon had spewed out of his mouth. ¹⁷ Then the dragon was enraged at the woman and went off to wage war against the rest of her offspring—those who keep God's commands and hold fast their testimony about Jesus.

In the light of the Assumption of Mary, it is easy to pray her Magnificat or "Mary's Song" (Luke 1:46-55) with new meaning!

⁴⁶ And Mary said: "My soul glorifies the Lord ⁴⁷ and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, ⁴⁸ for He has been mindful of the humble state of His servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed, ⁴⁹ for the Mighty One has done great things for me - holy is His name. ⁵⁰ His mercy extends to those who fear Him, from generation to generation. ⁵¹ He has performed mighty deeds with His arm; He has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts. ⁵² He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble. ⁵³ He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty. ⁵⁴ He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful ⁵⁵ to Abraham and his descendants forever, just as He promised our ancestors."

Dearest Mother, assumed into Heaven, you are the Ever-Virgin Mary, the Mother of God. In Heaven, you are honored by your Son and your prayers are most effective. I believe this with all my heart and entrust myself, my family, our Church, and the entire world to your motherly care and intercession. Blessed Mary, Ark of the Covenant, Comfort of the Afflicted, Infanta Divina, Gate of the Dawn, Mother of Mercy, Mother of Sorrows, Mother for the Journey, Mother of the Church, Rosa Mistica, Queen of Charity, Queen of Providence, Queen of Ransom, Queen of Solitude, Star of the Sea, Queen of All Saints, Queen of Angels, Queen of Apostles, Queen of Confessors, Queen of Martyrs, Queen of Patriarchs, Queen of Prophets, Queen of Heaven, Queen of Virgins, Regina Mundi, Refuge of Sinners, Salus Populi Romani, Untier of Knots, pray for me, and for us all, now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.



Jesus told St. Faustina, "Pure love gives the soul strength at the very moment of dying. When I was dying on the cross, I was not thinking about Myself, but about poor sinners, and I prayed for them to My Father. I want your last moments to be completely similar to Mine on the cross. There is but one price at which souls are bought, and that is suffering united to My suffering on the cross. Pure love understands these words ..."

Such were the last moments of the six Mexican Martyrs, canonized by Pope St. John Paul II on May 21, 2000. All were priests and members of the Knights of Columbus. They were killed during the persecution of the faithful during the Mexican Cristero War in the 1920s. They are St. Miguel de la Mora de la Mora, St. José María Robles Hurtado, St. Mateo Correa Magallanes, St. Luis Batis Sáinz, St. Rodrigo Aguilar Alemán, and St. Pedro de Jesús Maldonado Lucero.

We ask their intercession that the contents of this newsletter might bring its readers information and insight, and inspire in them a desire to serve the community.

Blessed Father Michael McGivney, Founder of the Knights of Columbus



The founder of the Knights of Columbus, Father Michael J. McGivney was a central figure in the growth of Catholicism in America, and he remains a model today. His example of charity, evangelization and empowerment of the laity continues to bear fruit and guide Knights of Columbus around the world.

In his Apostolic Letter that was read at the Mass for Beatification on Oct. 31, 2020, Pope Francis stated that Blessed Michael McGivney's "zeal for the proclamation of the Gospel and generous concern for the needs of his brothers and sisters made him an outstanding witness of Christian solidarity and fraternal assistance." The Holy Father set his annual feast day for Aug. 13, the day between Father McGivney's birthday (in 1852) and the day he entered eternal life (in 1890).

The beatification ceremony in the Cathedral of Saint
Joseph in Hartford, Conn., was a high point in a long process that began with the opening of the Cause for Canonization
in December 1997. Shortly after Father McGivney was named a Venerable Servant of God in March 2008, Pope
Benedict XVI cited him as a key figure in "the impressive growth" of the Church in the United States, stating, "We need
but think of the remarkable accomplishment of that exemplary American priest, the Venerable Michael McGivney, whose
vision and zeal led to the establishment of the Knights of Columbus." Through the spiritual genius of Father McGivney,
the Knights of Columbus has become a way for Catholic men to transform friends into brothers — brothers who care for
one another.

Just as those in need sought Father McGivney's help in life, understanding that he was a "Good Samaritan" figure, more than 2 million members of the Knights of Columbus and their families, and many others around the world, continue to seek out Father McGivney as a heavenly helper in times of need today. On May 26, 2020, Pope Francis approved a decree for a miracle attributed to his intercession, opening the way for Father McGivney to be beatified. A second approved miracle is needed for him to be canonized as a saint of the Catholic Church.

Those who knew him best in life saw in him both a "genial" countenance and a man with an "indomitable will" to achieve the good. In sum, his founding of the Knights of Columbus "attests to the love in which he held his brother man."

The Miracle:

While expecting their 13th child, Daniel and Michelle Schachle of Tennessee were told that their unborn son had Trisomy-21 (Down syndrome). A few weeks later, an ultrasound diagnosed fetal hydrops, in which multiple organs were filled with fluid. Doctors said that there was no hope of survival and abortion was the best option. As faithful Catholics, the Schachles refused abortion and began praying to Father McGivney for a miracle. An insurance agent with the Knights of Columbus, Daniel earned a trip to the Marian Shrine in Fatima, Portugal, and brought his wife for a prayerful pilgrimage. At Mass in Fatima, Michelle felt something change within her when she heard the words of Gospel about the Roman official whose son was healed by Jesus: "Go; your son lives." A few days after returning to Tennessee, an ultrasound indicated that the unborn child was healed of fetal hydrops. Studied for years at the Vatican, the healing was declared miraculous by medical and theological experts. Today, Michael McGivney Schachle is an active 5-year-old, with Down syndrome, who is surrounded by a loving family.






