

The VENERATION OF THE CROSS - Sunday, September 14

On the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross (or Triumph of the Cross) we honor the Holy Cross by which Christ redeemed the world. The public veneration of the Cross of Christ originated in the fourth century, according to early accounts. The miraculous discovery of the cross on September 14, 326, by Saint Helen, mother of Constantine, while she was on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem, is the origin of the tradition of celebrating the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross on this date. Constantine later built the Church of the Holy Sepulchre on the site of her discovery of the cross. On this same pilgrimage she ordered two other churches built: one in Bethlehem near the Grotto of the Nativity, the other on the Mount of the Ascension, near Jerusalem.

Catholics exalt the Cross of Christ as the instrument of our salvation. Adoration of the Cross is, thus, adoration of Jesus Christ, the God Man, who suffered and died on this Roman instrument of torture for our redemption from sin and death.


The cross represents the One Sacrifice by which Jesus, obedient even unto death, accomplished our salvation. The cross is a symbolic summary of the Passion, Crucifixion and Resurrection of Christ - all in one image.

The Cross - because of what it represents - is the most potent and universal symbol of the Christian faith. It has inspired both liturgical and private devotions: for example, the Sign of the Cross, which is an invocation of the Holy Trinity; the "little" Sign of the Cross on head, lips, and heart at the reading of the Gospel; praying the Stations (or Way) of the Cross; and the Veneration of the Cross by the faithful on Good Friday by kissing the feet of the image of Our Savior crucified.

Placing a crucifix in churches and homes, in classrooms of Catholic schools and in other Catholic institutions, or wearing this image on our persons, is a constant reminder - and witness - of Christ's ultimate triumph, His victory over sin and death through His suffering and dying on the Cross.

We remember Our Lord's words, "He who does not take up his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. He who finds his life will lose it, and he who loses his life for my sake shall find it" (Mt 10:38,39).

Meditating on these words we unite ourselves - our souls and bodies - with His obedience and His sacrifice; and we rejoice in this inestimable gift through which we have the hope of salvation and the glory of everlasting life.

SVdP Helping Families Survive & Thrive

Inspired by Gospel values, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul is a Catholic lay organization, leading women and men to join together to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to those who are needy and suffering in the tradition of its founder, Blessed Frédéric Ozanam, and patron, St. Vincent de Paul. The Society collaborates with other people of good will in relieving need and addressing its causes, making no distinction in those served because, in them, Vincentians see the face of Christ.

The Shelby County, Indiana St. Vincent De Paul Society, a conference comprising St Vincent and St Joseph parishes, offers a variety of services to support Shelby County families. Their services include advice, referrals to other community service organizations, utility assistance, food, clothing, and whatever else they can do to help those in need. The Society works with families to identify their needs and provide personalized support. SVdP serves residents regardless of religious affiliations, race, or

Board President Steve Goebel, who is also a member of our Knights of Columbus Sacred Heart #822 Council and serves as the Council's Advocate, is particularly appreciative of the volunteers who serve the organization. "We have excellent volunteers," Steve says proudly. "Whether it's working in the store, sorting at the warehouse, or working directly with families, our volunteers provide the support that changes the lives of our neighbors in need."

Volunteer Jean Adams echoes that sentiment. "Our clients are the best people," she says. "And serving them is such a blessing."

The Society depends on donations of goods for the Thrift Store (which are also given to families in need via store vouchers) as well as monetary donations. Monetary donations can be made via giving at the parishes or by mailing a check to 4218 E Michigan Rd. The Thrift Store is open every Saturday from 10a-2p at 424 E Jackson St. All proceeds from sales at the store are used to help the Society's clients. If you haven't been to the store, you should! The prices are crazy low and the merchandise is good quality. And by buying a shirt, tea cup, or sofa, you're making a difference in the lives of your neighbors.



We welcome these items since they are basic goods people need to run a household:

- Good clean clothing and textiles are a primary need: shoes, purses, bed linens, towels, blankets, curtains
- Toilet Articles: laundry detergent, shampoo, soap, facial tissues, toilet paper, paper towels, deodorant, toothpaste, etc.
- Housewares: Small appliances like toasters, irons, can openers, coffee makers, fans, area rugs, vacuum cleaners
- **Dishes**: cooking/eating utensils, glassware
- **Bedroom**: dressers/chests of drawers, night stands
- Dining Room: tables, chairs
- Living Room: couches, sofas, loveseats, upholstered chairs, sectional sofas if no more than 2 pieces, recliners, coffee/end tables. No sleeper sofas

Donations of goods are accepted the first Saturday of every month at 628 Hodell St. Please do not bring donations to the store.




MICHELLE THURSTON "I LOVE THEM ALL"


Michelle is part of the team of awesome staff who keep us hydrated, entertained, and truly love what they do!




