
POPE LEO XIV RECEIVES K OF C LEADERS IN AUDIENCE

Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly and Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori met with Pope Leo in a private audience at the Vatican on July 4. The visit was an opportunity to inform the Holy Father about the Order's works of charity and faith formation, and to assure him of the Knights' prayers for his Petrine ministry.

MY THREE FAVORITE POPES


The recipient of this year's Knights of Columbus Essay Contest prize is **Amy Onofre**, a junior **at Shelbyville High School**. She will receive dinner for herself and her family along with representatives from the Knights later this month in the Pope Room at Buca di Beppo. Her essay follows.

Behind the closed doors of the Sistine Chapel the Conclave commences, which is a series of secret ballots between the Cardinals of the Catholic Church, then white smoke appears from the chimney of the Sistine Chapel. *Habemus Papam!* (A Latin phrase that means *We have a Pope!*) is announced to the whole world. There are 267 Popes that have led the Catholic Church. Of those 267 Popes my top three favorite Popes are Pope Francis, Pope Paul III and Pope Benedict XV.



Next, one of my other favorite Popes is Pope Paul III because he stood up for what was right. For example Pope Paul III stood up for the rights of Indigenous people. Pope Paul III states that he opposes the enslavement of Indigenous people and says that Indigenous people should not have their rights of liberty and possession be taken away from them even though they are outside the faith of Jesus Christ. 

IN RE: ABORTION

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "Since the first century the Church has affirmed the moral evil of every procured abortion.

This teaching has not changed and remains unchangeable. Direct abortion ... is gravely contrary to the moral law" (No. 2271).

To be sure, knowledge of human embryology was very limited until recent times. Many Christian thinkers accepted the biological theories of their time, based on the writings of Aristotle and other philosophers. Aristotle assumed a process was needed over time to turn the matter from a woman's womb into a being that could receive a specifically human form or soul.

In 1827, with the discovery of the human ovum, the mistaken biology of Aristotle was discredited. Scientists increasingly understood that the union of sperm and egg at conception produces a new living being that is distinct from both mother and father. Modern genetics demonstrated that this individual is, at the outset, distinctively human, with the inherent and active potential to mature into a human fetus, infant, child and adult.

Thus modern science has not changed the Church's constant teaching against abortion, but has underscored how important and reasonable it is, by confirming that the life of each individual of the human species begins with the earliest embryo.

IN RE: CAPITAL PUNISHMENT

The new evangelization calls for followers of Christ who are unconditionally pro-life: who will proclaim, celebrate and serve the Gospel of life in every situation. A sign of hope is the increasing recognition that the dignity of human life must never be taken away, even in the case of someone who has done great evil. ... I renew the appeal ... to end the death penalty, which is both cruel and unnecessary. - St Pope John Paul II

When Cain killed Abel, God did not end Cain's life. Instead, he sent Cain into exile, not only sparing his life but protecting it by putting a mark on Cain, lest anyone should kill him at sight (Gn 4:15).

Each of us is called to respect the life and dignity of every human being. Even when people deny the dignity of others, we must still recognize that their dignity is a gift from God and is not something that is earned or lost through their behavior. Respect for life applies to all, even the perpetrators of terrible acts.

[Punishment] ought not go to the extreme of executing the offender except in cases of absolute necessity: in other words, when it would not be possible otherwise to defend society. Today however, as a result of steady improvements in the organization of the penal system, such cases are very rare, if not practically non-existent. St Pope John Paul II, The Gospel of Life (Evangelium Vitae), 1995.

The most commonly recognized saint of the pro-life movement is **St. Gianna Beretta Molla**. An Italian Catholic pediatrician, she died a week after giving birth to her fourth child, choosing to preserve the life of her child even at the risk of her own.

Our Lady of Guadalupe is seen as a special patron due her appearance as the only pregnant Virgin.

St Dismas, known as the "good thief" who, while being crucified alongside Jesus, repented and asked for forgiveness, is an example of the power of God's salvation to the very end of one's days. **St. Nicholas of Myra** risked his life to stop an execution, freed the condemned, and later absolved him of his sins.



There are countless other Saints who have stood for the unquestionable right to life of **all** persons - let us emulate them!




SATURDAY MORNING CARDS


