

## HE'S ALREADY DONE IT

Hello I'm Jim Fuller. I'd like to share a few thoughts and lots of scriptures with you.

In John 15.5 Jesus said,

I am the vine, you are the branches, he who abides in Me, and I in him, he bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing.

Scientists have found that they cannot distinguish where the vine stops and the branch begins, because the fibers are so perfectly intertwined.

The only reason that the branch can bear fruit at all is because it is totally one with the vine and it has the exact same fibers, the same makeup, creating the fruit of the vine through the branch.

John 17. 20

I do not ask in behalf of these alone, but for those also who believe in me through their word, that they may all be one even as you Father are in me, I am in you, that they may be in us, that the world may believe that you did send me.

In John 14, 15, and 16, Jesus tells His disciples 4 times, to ask whatever they wished and it would be done.

He wasn't directing us to self-focused, independent prayer to satisfy our flesh.

God put us in Christ so that we could ask whatever we wish and He would do it.

Look at John 15.7.

If you abide in me and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish and it shall be done for you. BY THIS is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit, and so prove to be my disciples.

What is the "by this" that glorifies the father?

It's the disciples abiding in Christ, praying what the Father puts in their hearts to pray because of their oneness with Him, and seeing the continuous answers to prayer.

When we surrender our wills to His purposes, we find that He shapes our heart, our minds, and our thinking until we become recalibrated to what His dream is for the planet

Throughout my 58 years as a Christian, people have been continually encouraged to pray about everything. Most of the time, not seeing any answers to those prayers, and comforting themselves with the idea that, at least I prayed and did what was required.

I can't imagine God saying, I want you to pray without ceasing. Nothing will happen, but it'll be a good discipline for you until I return.

In reality Jesus said,

You did not choose me, but I chose you and I appointed you, that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in my name, He may give it to you. John 15.16

God asks us to pray so that He can produce His will in the Earth, because He made us one with Him for that very purpose.

He said to pray that His Kingdom come on Earth as it is in heaven. Why?

Because He already prepared His Kingdom for us before the foundation of the world. It's been His plan from the very beginning. Matthew 25.34

The Bible from Genesis chapter 1 to the end of the book illustrates that God's primary design for us is to be co-laborers with Him.

The Lord invites us into the inner chambers of the King of all Kings, of the Lord of all Lords, of The Great I Am to fellowship with Him so that out of the continual impartation of His Spirit, His will would be created. Events and circumstances in our world would be affected because of our oneness with Him in His kingdom.

God doesn't ask us to pray hoping that He will answer our prayers. He asks us to pray because He has already created the answer and wants us to speak it into existence in our realm.

God set it up that way to make answered prayer fool proof for His sons.

2 Corinthians 1.20 says,

For as many as the promises of God are, in Him they are yes; therefore, through Him also is our amen to the glory of God through us. Now He who establishes us with you in Christ and anointed us is God, who also sealed us and gave us the Spirit in our hearts as a pledge.

God makes the promises, showing us what His will is. Then He works in our hearts to offer our amen, our agreement with His desire. He then makes it happen by His Holy Spirit's power and authority through us.

Let's look at a couple of the original words in this scripture.

The Greek word "seal" means to affix with a signet ring or other instrument to stamp, i.e. to *attest ownership, authorizing and validating* what is sealed.

It signifies *ownership* and the full *security* carried by full authority of the owner. "Sealing" in the ancient world served as a "legal signature" which guaranteed the promise of what was sealed.

The word for "pledge" was *arrhabōn* – meaning, an installment; a *deposit* or a "down-payment" which *guarantees* the balance (the *full* purchase-price).

It represents *full security* backed by the purchaser who supplies sufficient proof that he will *fulfill* the entire pledge that he has promised.

God made us one with Christ, anointed us, put His seal of authenticity on us as His sons, and gave us His Holy Spirit to guarantee the fulfillment of His promise.

The Father asks us to pray into existence things that He's already prepared, and He gives us the Holy Spirit within us to make happen what we could never make happen by our natural efforts.

God's ways are just like Him. They are spiritual, perfect, and eternal.

Mark 11.22 says,

Have faith in God. Truly I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, be taken up and cast into the sea, and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that what he says is going to happen, it shall be granted to him. Therefore, I say to you, all things for which you pray, believe that you have received them and they shall be granted to you.

This scripture puzzled me for quite a long time. My mind couldn't figure out how I could pray for something that I already had, expecting to receive it.

The Holy Spirit explained to me that everything we receive as Christians comes by inheritance. When we pray we're drawing on the inheritance that God has already made available to us as His children. Impossible things can become ours, because He's already paid in full for us to have them.

Now for a few final scriptures.

In John 17.22 Jesus told the Father,

I have given them the glory You gave Me, so that they may be one as We are one— I in them and You in Me—that they may be perfectly united, so that the world may know that You sent Me and have loved them just as You have loved Me.

In 1 Peter 4.11 it says, if anyone speaks, let him speak the utterance of God, so that God may be glorified.

Jesus said in John 16.13 that when the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Truth comes, He will lead you into all the truth. The word translated here as truth means reality.

I believe that the Holy Spirit is trying to draw us into constant unbroken fellowship with the Father. To convince us to accept our supernatural oneness with God that Jesus' perfect sacrifice has created for us. Then have us speak God's Word with Him to establish the reality of His Kingdom in our world.

When we whole heartedly trust His supernatural work to make us members of His family, we become joint heirs with Christ, and can radiate His glory, accurately represent His nature, and speak His word with power, just as Jesus did. Hebrew 1.3,  
2 Peter 1.3+4

By this our father is glorified and we prove to be His sons and daughters.
