DON'T FORGET

I'd like to share a few thoughts and some scriptures about God's Word and how we relate to it.

Psalm 103 reads;

Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget none of His benefits;

Who pardons ALL your iniquities,

Who heals ALL your diseases;

Who redeems your life from the pit,

Who crowns you with lovingkindness and compassion;

Who satisfies your years with good things, so that your youth is renewed like the eagle.

It's easy to accept these as encouraging Bible verses and not as statements of reality from God to our lives. We often say amen very glibly without recognizing what amen actually means. It means let it be so in my life.

When the angel Gabriel came to Mary and told her that she was going to give birth to the Messiah, she said, "be it unto me according to your word."

Jesus taught His disciples to pray, "your kingdom come on Earth as it is in heaven." My paraphrase would be, let it be in my house, the way it is in your house.

Satan wants to cloud our rememberance of the reality of God's authority and power.

Our theology and our expectations have been affected more by what hasn't happened, instead of what God has done.

When we pray for someone, if we entertain and accept the thought that this prayer that I'm praying may not work we've actually, forgotten who God is and what He has promised.

Remembering who God is, what He has promised and who He has made us, renews our minds to God's reality and gives us a positive expectation of God's ability to supernaturally over rule our current situations and circumstances.

When we pray, "in Jesus name," we are actually representing everything that He is and everything He can do. In reality, it's as if He's doing it Himself.

Jesus reminded us that, with God nothing is impossible.

Romans chapter 4 records Abraham's response to God's covenant promise that he and his wife Sarah would have a son. Abraham waited 25 years for the fulfillment of God's promise, and it states that Abraham grew strong in faith being fully convinced that God was able to keep His word.

God has not only given us a covenant promise but he also added a personal oath on top of it.

Hebrews 6.17 reads; In the same way God, desiring even more to show to the heirs of the promise the unchangeableness of His purpose, interposed with an oath, so that by two unchangeable things in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have taken refuge in Him would have strong encouragement to take hold of the hope set before us.

God wanted to make sure that we actually take hold of His promise and it's fulfillment in our lives.

So now, because of who He is and what He has done, we can never look at anyone and think that they are so far gone that they cannot be saved or that they cannot be healed.

He didn't re-create us in Christ to live by our own senses and definitely not by this world's reality.

He's created us to live in this world, completely immersed in His reality and fully convinced that His word will come to pass.
