DOG LICENSE: If you own a dog in the Village of Iola it needs to be registered in Waupaca County. License can be obtained at the Village Clerk's Office in Iola. For spayed & neutered dogs the cost is \$3.00; Dogs that are not spayed or neutered the cost is \$8.00. You will need a copy of your dog's vet records showing that their rabies vaccinations are up to date when you purchase your tags.

WALKING DOGS: If you are walking your dogs on village streets and sidewalks, please remember to pick up any mess your dog leaves.

DOG PARK: The village is waiting on survey information regarding some village properties. Once we have received that information, we will be contacting everyone that has expressed interest in being on the committee to set up a meeting.

COMMUNITY GARDEN: The Community Garden needs someone to run the Children's Garden program this spring and summer. If you would be interested in volunteering to do this send an email to iolawi@tds.net and put in the subject line Children's Garden.

LIBRARY HOURS will be Monday thru Friday 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. No Saturday's until further notice. All hours depend on the COVID-19 Pandemic as numbers are changing daily.

For trash garbage tags are available at the Recycling Center, Depot Street Station, Iola Sentry Foods, or the Clerk's Office. The cost is 5 tags for \$15.00. These trash bags can be dropped at the recycling center during normal recycling hours.

FOOD PANTRY: If you need help during these trying times, the Iola Food Pantry is available for helping you out. You can contact Sharon Peterson at 715.445.3394 for help or if you wish to donate to the food pantry you contact her.

LAWNS: The Village of Iola has an ordinance regarding length of lawns exceeds eight inches in length, it is declared a public nuisance §94-3(B), except for properties located in a designated floodplain area and/or wetland area or where the lawn, grass or weed is part of a natural lawn approved pursuant to §94-2. This serves as a public notice that any lawns above eight inches in the Village of Iola that do not fit any of the above exceptions, the Village of Iola will contact the owner once. If the lawn(s) are not mowed within 24 hours, the lawn(s) will be mowed by the Village at the property owner(s) expense. If you wish to receive a copy of the complete ordinance, email: iolawi@tds.net or stop in at the village clerks' office.

DEBRIS PILES: on Town Line Road and Grove Street. Please remember when dumping your debris at those locations that you dump on the appropriate pile for what you are bringing into those areas. If you do not see a pile for what you are bringing that means that it should not be dropped off there or if you have a question about what you want to haul to the piles, please call. Non-residents of the Village of Iola should **NOT** be dumping on those piles unless authorized by the village. If you see violators, please contact the police department or village hall with the license plate or name of the person that is not authorized to be dumping. These sites are funded by village tax money and are set up as a courtesy to village taxpayers. If you have questions concerning these piles, feel free to call the clerk's office at 715.445.2913.

RECYCLING CENTER HOURS: Thursday's 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. and Saturday's 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Recyclables are free to drop off at the Recycling Center. Recyclables need to be sorted.

GARBARGE DISPOSAL: The Village of Iola does not offer garbage pick up as part of the tax roll it is your responsibility. If you need a place to dispose of your garage here are a few options for you: You Haul: Garbage Tags five tags for \$15.00 Garbage can be dropped off at the recycle facility in Iola, tags can be purchased at the Cenex Stations, Iola Sentry Foods, Village Clerks office or Recycling Center. or Waupaca County PTF (715) 258-6249.
